### Why an Annual Report is Important

- The Annual Report was created to help our community understand the needs
  of our children and youth, in order to build community commitment to meet
  these needs. It is a local and state "snapshot" documenting the status of our
  children and youth. This Annual Report is intended to help community
  members make informed decisions with regarding public policy issues,
  volunteer efforts and support for nonprofit organizations.
- The Annual Report has four goals:
  - > To serve as a benchmark to measure how children and youth are faring over time
  - To serve as a catalyst to mobilize community wide efforts to address the most critical challenges to children and youth's circumstances
  - To recognize areas in which services and initiatives have been successful in improving children and youth's quality of life in order to maintain continued support for these efforts
  - > To present multiple indicators in a simple arrangement and location

#### 2 indicators removed from this report:

- > Childhood Obesity (removed as CDE is not using Fitness Gram and Healthy Zones anymore)
- Physical Fitness (removed as the state is working on a PFT replacement and has stopped healthy fitness zones)

#### 3 new indicators were added to this report:

- Digital Divide
- Suicide Rates in Youth
- Substance Abuse Disorders Non-fatal and Fatal Overdoses in Youth

New indicators were added based on COVID-19 impacts on children and youth to assure we continue to monitor these indicators as our community shifts to recover from COVID-19 impacts.








## **Children Living Below Poverty Level**




Socioeconomically Disadvantaged Enrollment in Monterey (


#### **Student Homelessness Enrollment**

#### Homeless Enrollment in Monterey County





#### **Public School Enrollment**


#### **Total Enrollment in Monterey County**


#### Students with Disabilities Enrollment in Monterey County

#### EL Enrollment and Number of Reclassified Students by Year






### **Juvenile Misdemeanor and Felony Arrests**




#### **Graduation Rates Over Time**



### **Student Suspension Rates Over Time**




### **Student Expulsion Rates Over Time**




## **Student Drop Out Rate**


#### Suicide Rates In Youth




#### **Substance Abuse Disorders and Non-fatal Overdoses in Youth**
