Re: Grant Writing Pilot Project Update

Background

As part of the FY 2022-23 budget, the Board of Supervisors approved a \$50,000 grant writing and technical assistance pilot project geared toward assisting County departments in providing grant writing, technical assistance, cost benefit analysis, economic benefit analysis, or other needed services to complete infrastructure project grant applications.

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In July the County contracted with Harris & Associates, a firm that specializes in providing these services. Harris & Associates is also under contract with RCRC to provide similar services to their member counties. To maximize resources available to Monterey County, Harris & Associates will coordinate their work with RCRC. Work to identify funding sources and provide initial evaluation is also being coordinated with Nossaman LLP and Ballard Spahr LLP. The project is an expansion of the work of the Strategic Grant Services Program.

Status Report

Per the direction of the Board of Supervisors and Legislative Committee, the focus of work is on the following projects – which are also included in the table below:

- 2022 State Budget requests;
- FY 2023 Federal Budget Requests Congressionally Directed Spending requests;
- Unfunded CIP Projects FY2022-23 including "short list" projects, "other recommendations", and projects with weighted scores of over 50;
- Water Resources Agency identified priority projects; and
- Project submitted by County departments for consideration.

CAO-IGLA, Nossaman and Ballard Spahr have been meeting with all departments with projects identified above to discuss potential funding opportunities and determine if assistance is needed from Harris & Associates (e.g., grant writing, cost benefit analysis, economic benefit analysis, etc.). Notes from those meetings for each project are included in the table below.

A progress report will be provided at the November Legislative Committee meeting.
