Approve and authorize the Director of Health, the Assistant Director of Health, or the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency Director to execute Renewal and Amendment No. 2 to extend the Paramedic Service Provider Agreement with Carmel Highlands Fire Protection District on the same terms and conditions retroactive from January 31, 2022 through July 31, 2022.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors:

Approve and authorize the Director of Health, the Assistant Director of Health, or the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency Director to execute Renewal and Amendment No. 2 to extend the Paramedic Service Provider Agreement with Carmel Highlands Fire Protection District on the same terms and conditions retroactive from January 31, 2022 through July 31, 2022.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

The Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency is designated under California law by Monterey County as the local Emergency Medical Services Agency responsible for planning, implementing, and evaluating the local EMS system throughout Monterey County. Under California law, no person or organization may provide “advanced life support,” also known as “paramedic services,” unless that person or organization is an authorized part of the emergency medical service system of the local EMS agency.

Accordingly, under California law, a paramedic service provider must have a written agreement with the local EMS agency to participate in the EMS system and to comply with all applicable state regulations and local policies and procedures, including participation in the local EMS agency’s Continuous Quality Improvement (“CQI”) program.

The Monterey County Board of Supervisors approved and authorized the execution of the Paramedic Service Provider Agreement on June 26, 2018. On January 28, 2020, the Board approved and authorized the EMS Agency Director to execute Amendment No. 1 to extend the Paramedic Service Provider Agreement to January 31, 2022. The Agreement expired on January 31, 2022. Carmel Highlands Fire Protection District has proposed changes to the Paramedic Service Provider Agreement. The short extension of the agreement is needed to allow the EMS Agency time to review the proposed changes and to execute a new amendment.

This work supports the Monterey County Health Department 2018-2022 Strategic Plan Initiatives: 2. Enhance public health and safety through prevention; and 4. Engage MCHD workforce and improve operational functions to meet current and developing population health needs. It also supports one of the ten essential public health services, specifically: 7. Link people to needed personal health services and assure the provision of health care when otherwise unavailable.

The Office of the County Counsel has reviewed proposed Amendment No. 2 to the Paramedic Service Provider Agreement as to form.
