About M.C. Ordinance 5249



The purpose of the Rooster Ordinance is to balance the legitimate interests of agricultural businesses and agricultural educational organizations with the prevention of rooster keeping that is unsanitary, environmentally damaging, inhumane, and conducive to illegal cockfighting.

As of July 14, 2015, no Rooster Keeping Operation can legally operate in the unincorporated areas of Monterey County without either a permit exemption or a permit.

- Requires permitting for Rooster Keeping Operations where 5 or more roosters are kept on any single property within the unincorporated areas of Monterey County.
- 4 limited exemptions may apply
- The Animal Control Officer is the main point of contact and enforcement for this permitting ordinance.



Exemptions

- Poultry Operation A poultry operation is primarily a business that raises poultry for meat or eggs.*
- Poultry Hobbyist A poultry hobbyist is typically a member of an organization that promotes breeding of poultry for exhibition or sale or supports breeding as a hobby.
- Educational Purpose The rooster keeping operation is conducted by minors and sponsored by public or private schools registered with the California Department of Education. **
- FFA / 4-H The rooster keeping operation is conducted by minors and is part of a National Future Farmers of America (FFA) project or a University of California 4-H Youth Development Program (4-H) project.**

PERMITS FOR ROOS TER KEEPING OPERATIONS ARE ISSUED WITH:

1.Completed & approved application 2.Payment of permit application fee 3.Successful property inspection

About the application process

- Each rooster owner per parcel must have a permit.
- Parcel must be properly zoned for rooster/poultry keeping
- All building setbacks/zoning requirements must comply
- Existing violations will delay or result in permit denial, to include noise violations.
- Permits issued are for one year and must be renewed annually.
- It can take approximately 60 days to get a permit

Prior to 2021

- 2016/2017 20 permits initially issued
 - None renewed due to constraints within Animal Services
- 2019/2020 ACO and OAII vacancies filled, and training began
 - Website updated in Spanish and English
 - Forms updated
 - Internal processes reviewed and streamlined



2021 Enforcement

- OAII, ACOS and Supervisor were key staff involved
 - 2 ACOS required for each inspection
 - Enforcement was in addition to other calls for service
- Rooster Keeping Task Force created
 - Goal: Facilitate the gathering of information on a regular basis to:
 - Assist in the enforcement of Chapter 8.50 as it relates to safety, violations, exemptions
 - Allow for increased communication between various departments, both in and out of the County system.
 - Improve the quality of life of animals in our community, starting with roosters.
 - Involved Agencies/Departments: Sheriff, Environmental Health, Housing and Community Development, Ag Commissioner, County Council, District Attorney, SPCA for Monterey County and District 2 Supervisor Office.

2021 Enforcement

- 66 initial rooster keeping application packets mailed out
 - By December 2021, over 168 addresses had been mailed rooster keeping packets due to complaints or requests
 - Issued 11 rooster keeping permits (10 in North County and 1 in South County).
 - Cleared over 60 addresses by verifying under 5 roosters.
 - Issued 18 Cease and Desist Letters requiring compliance.
 - □ Issued 15 citations for non-compliance.
 - Continue to work over 65 cases in various application status.
 - Received over 65 permit applications fees.







Where are efforts happening?

73% of cases and applications were from 3 Zip codes:

93907 (Prunedale, Oak Hills)

93906 (Bolsa Knolls, Boronda)

95076 (Royal Oaks)

The remaining 27% of cases and applications:

- 14% North of Chualar (95012, 93908, 95004, 95039)
- 13% Chualar and South) (93925, 93960, 93954, 93426)
