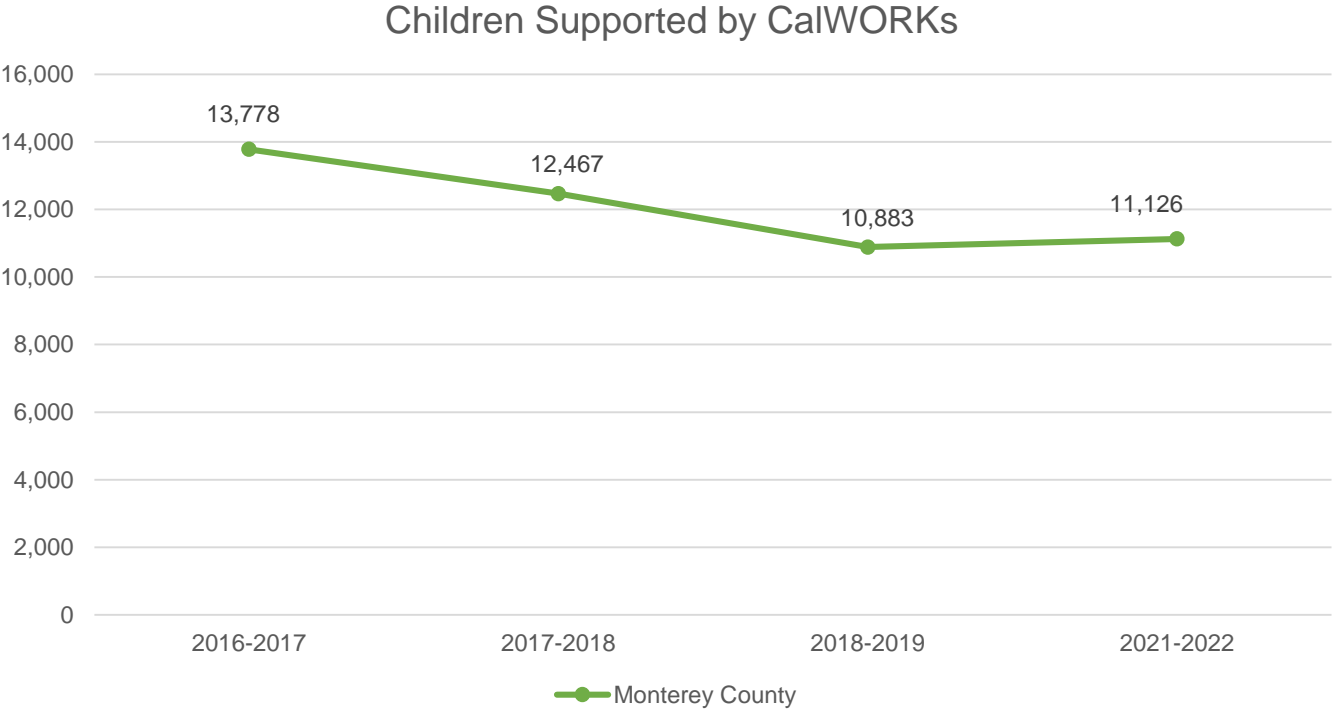

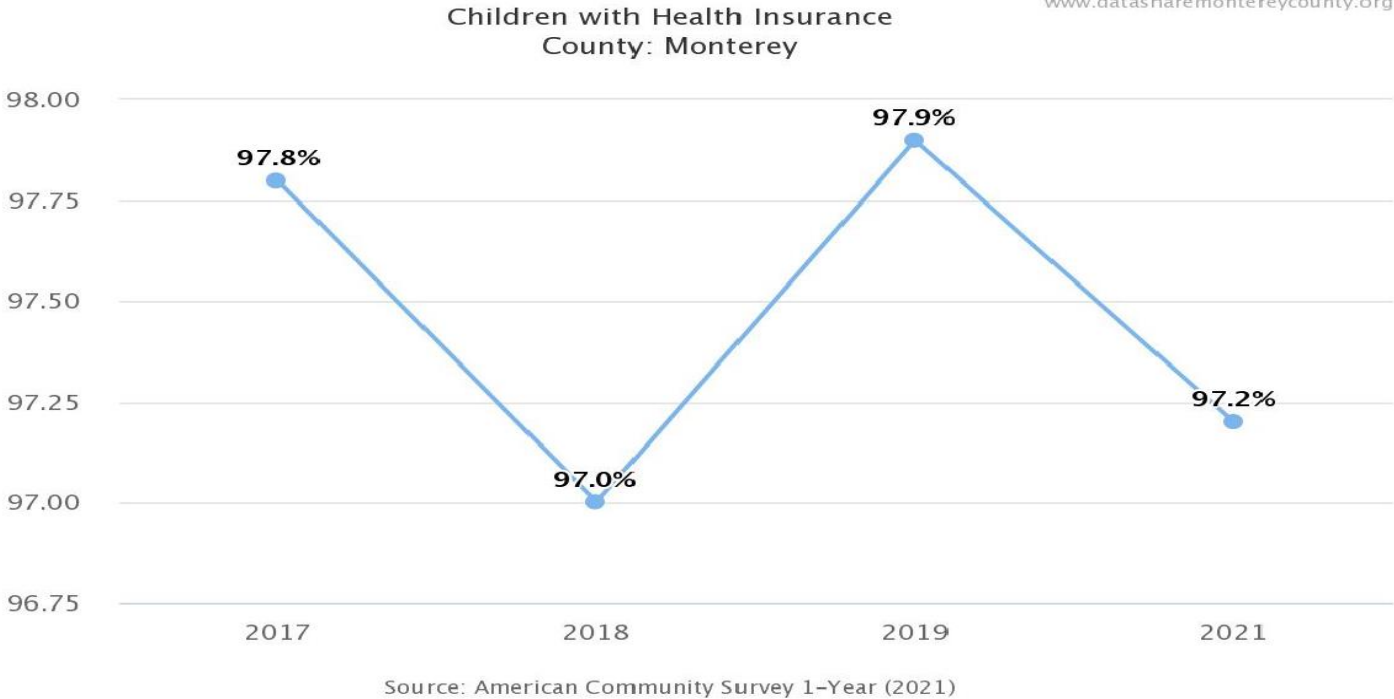

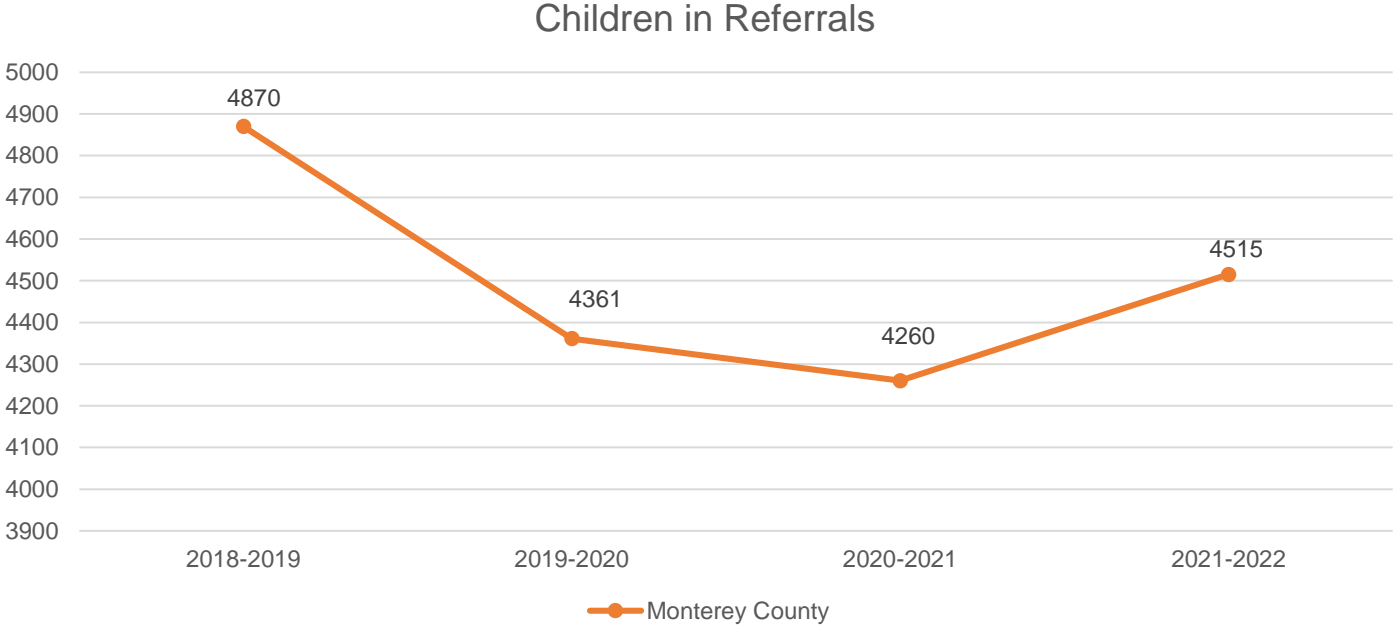

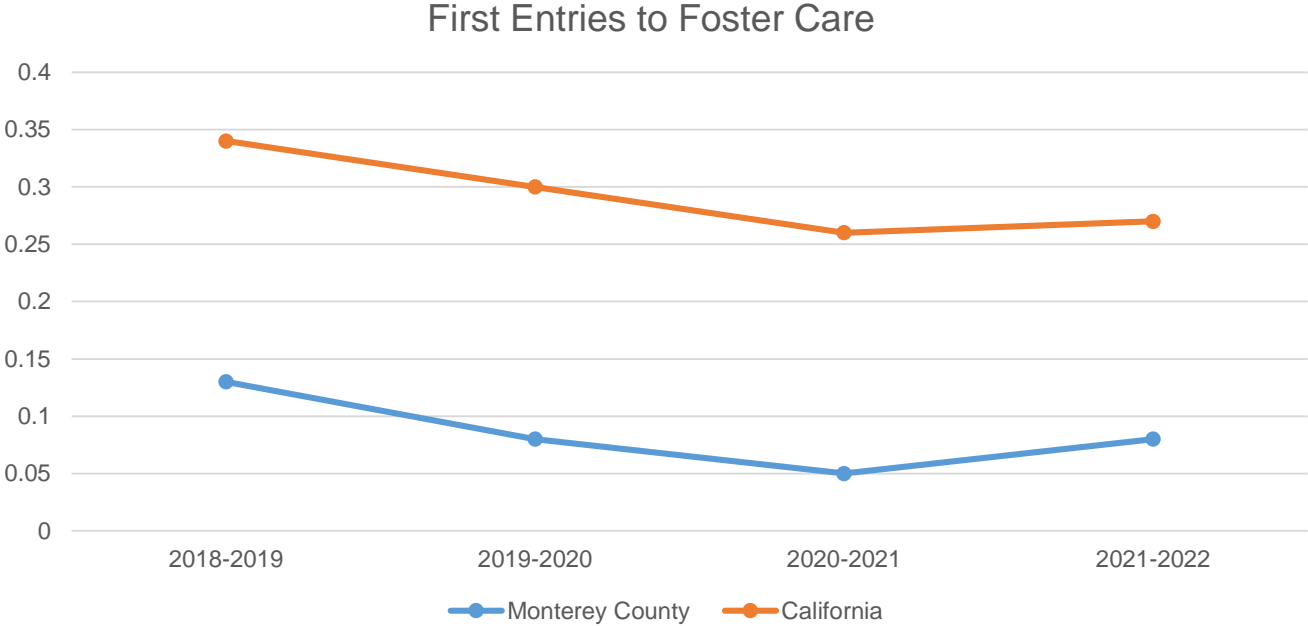

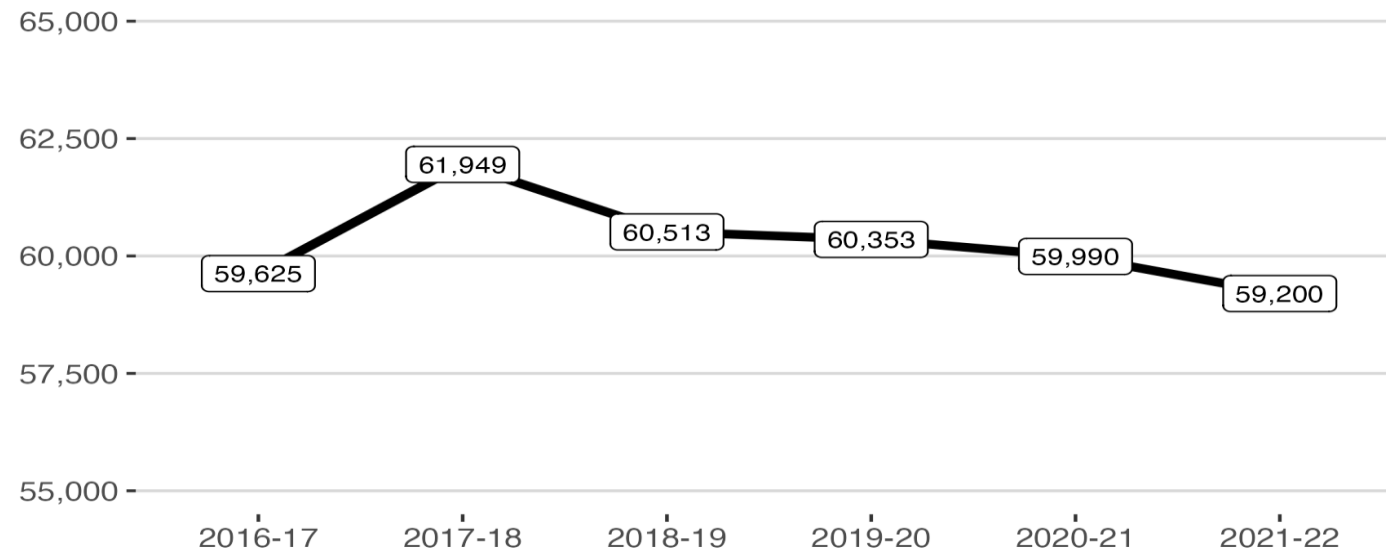

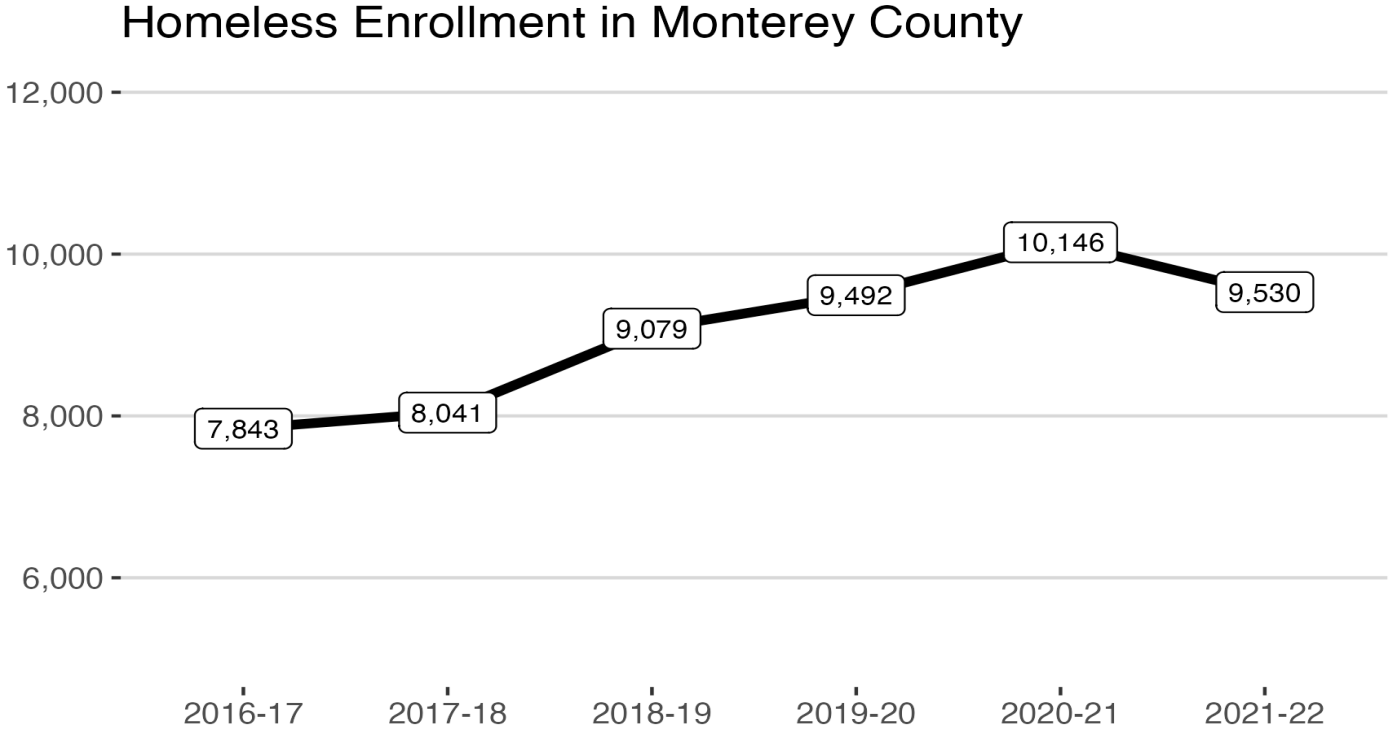
# Socio-Economically Disadvantaged Students

in Monterey County



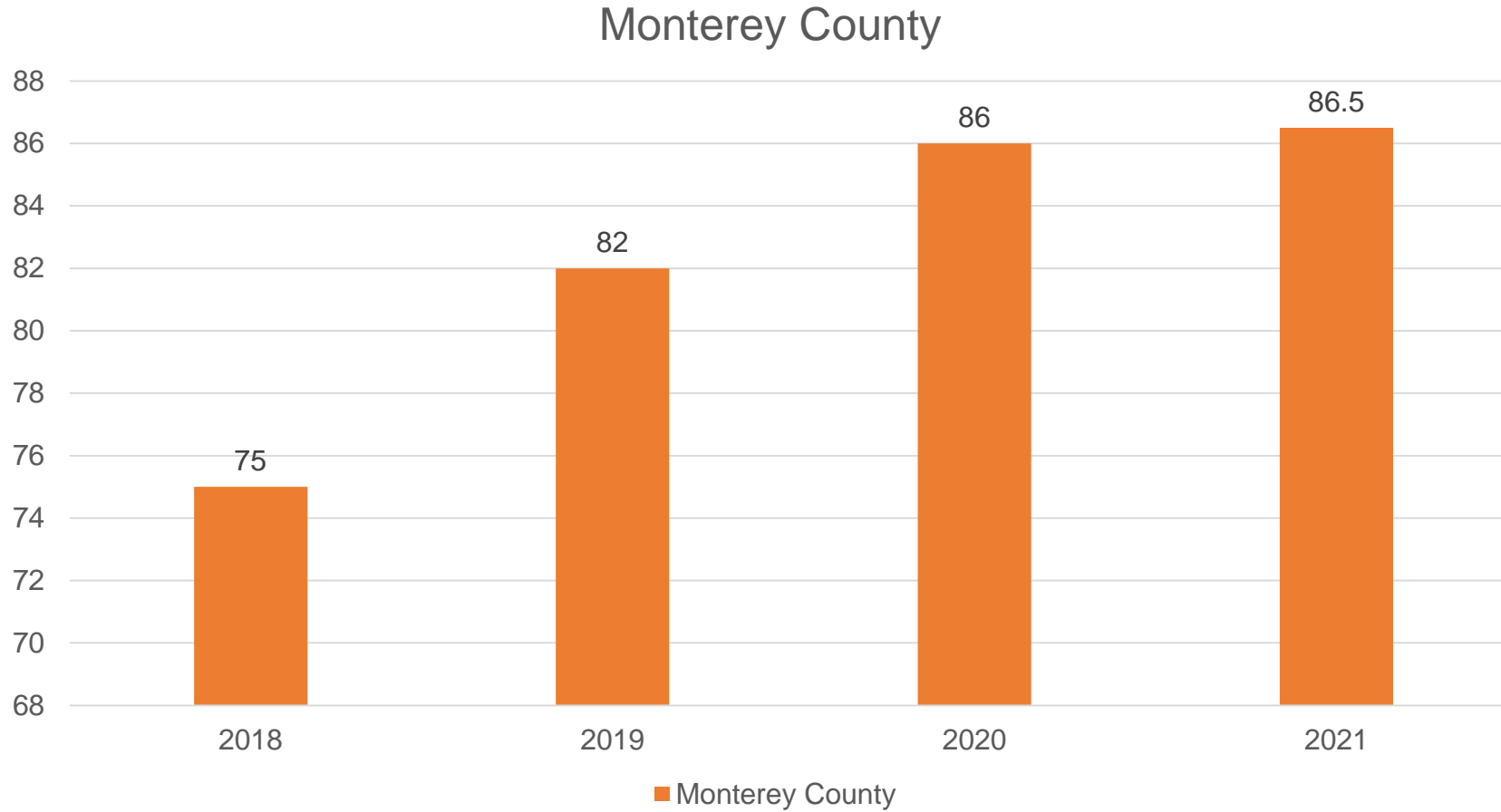

# Student Homelessness Enrollment

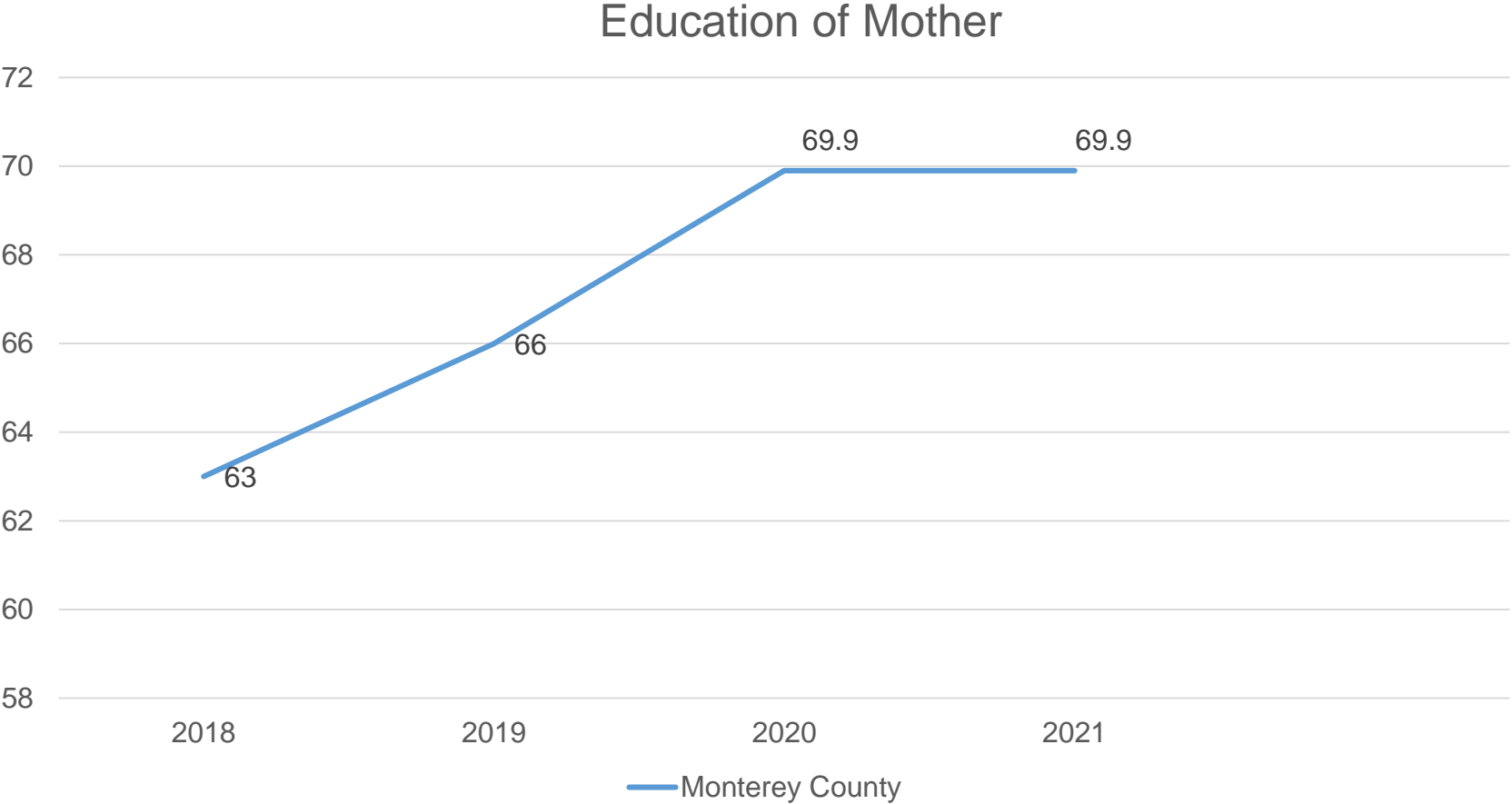

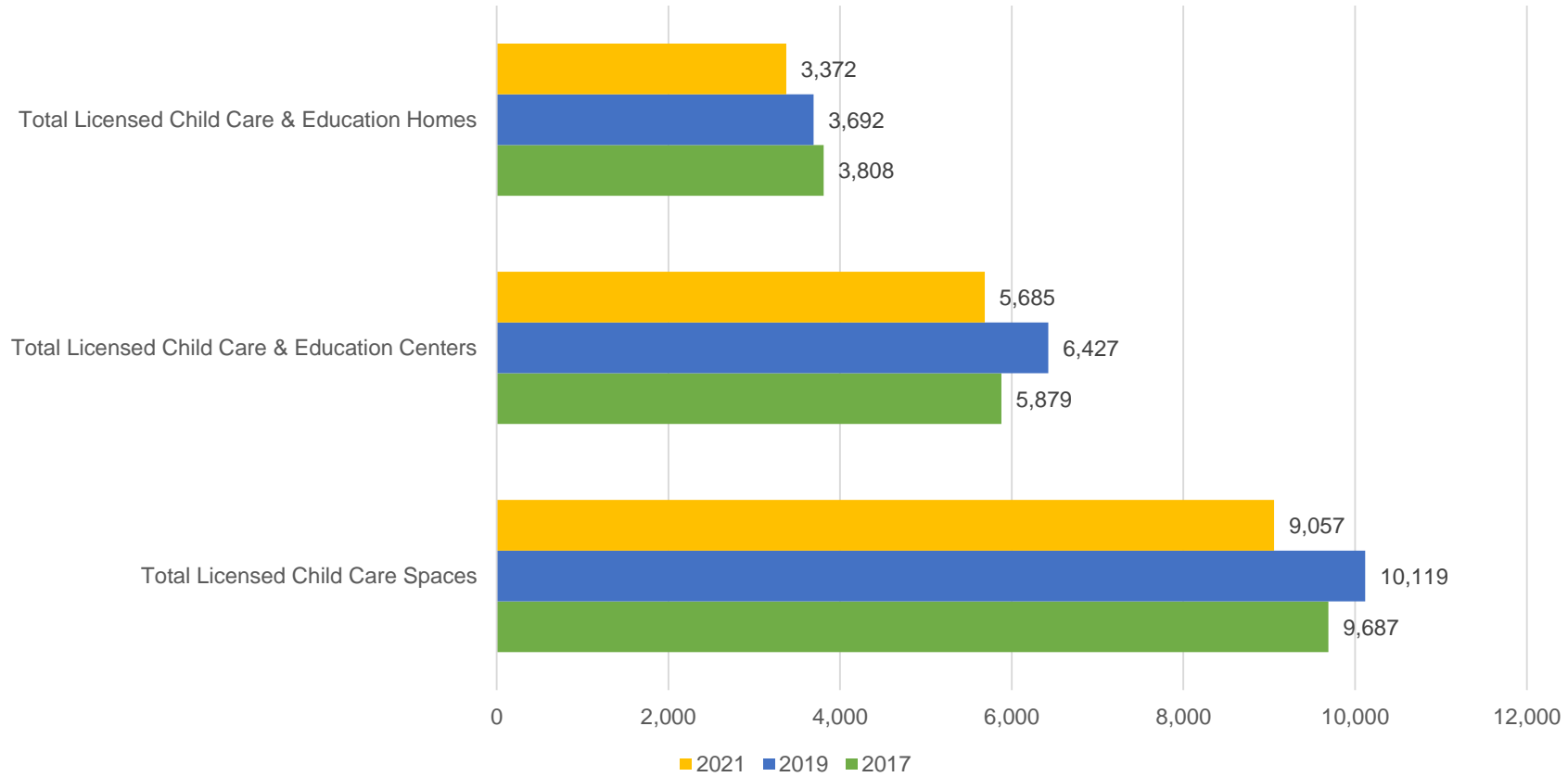

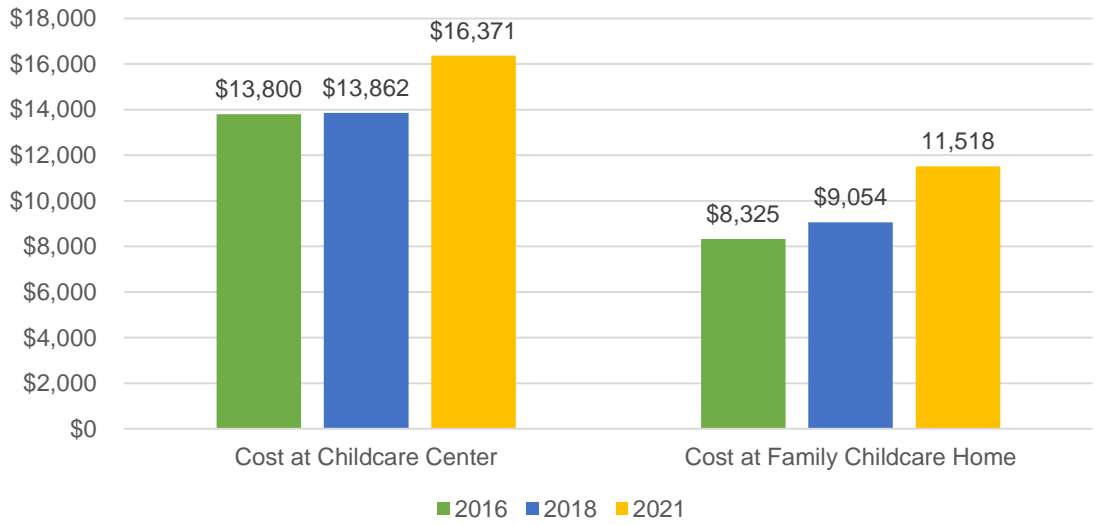

Licensed Child Care & Education Spaces in Monterey County

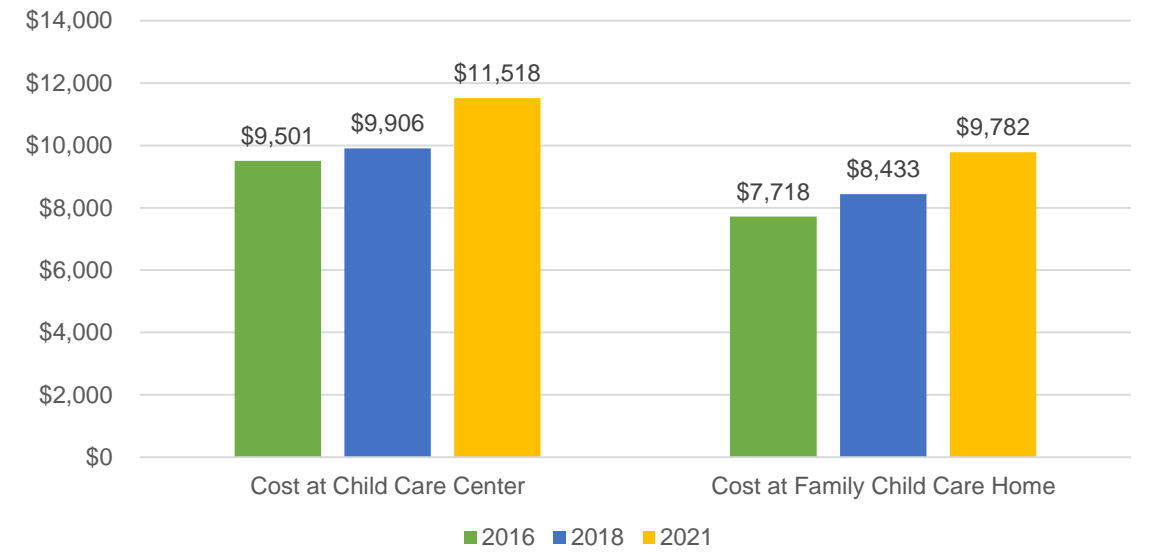


# Licensed Child Care and Education Cost

## Infant Child Care Cost in Monterey County

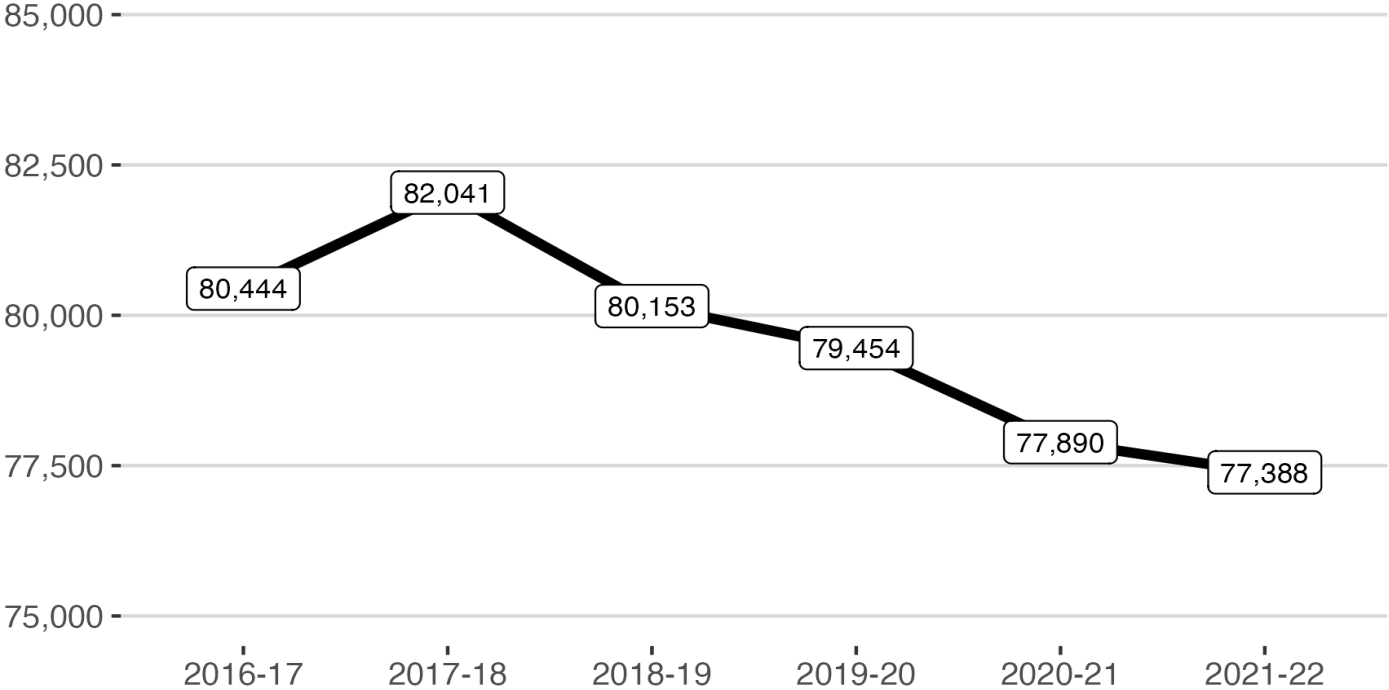


## Preschool Cost in Monterey County

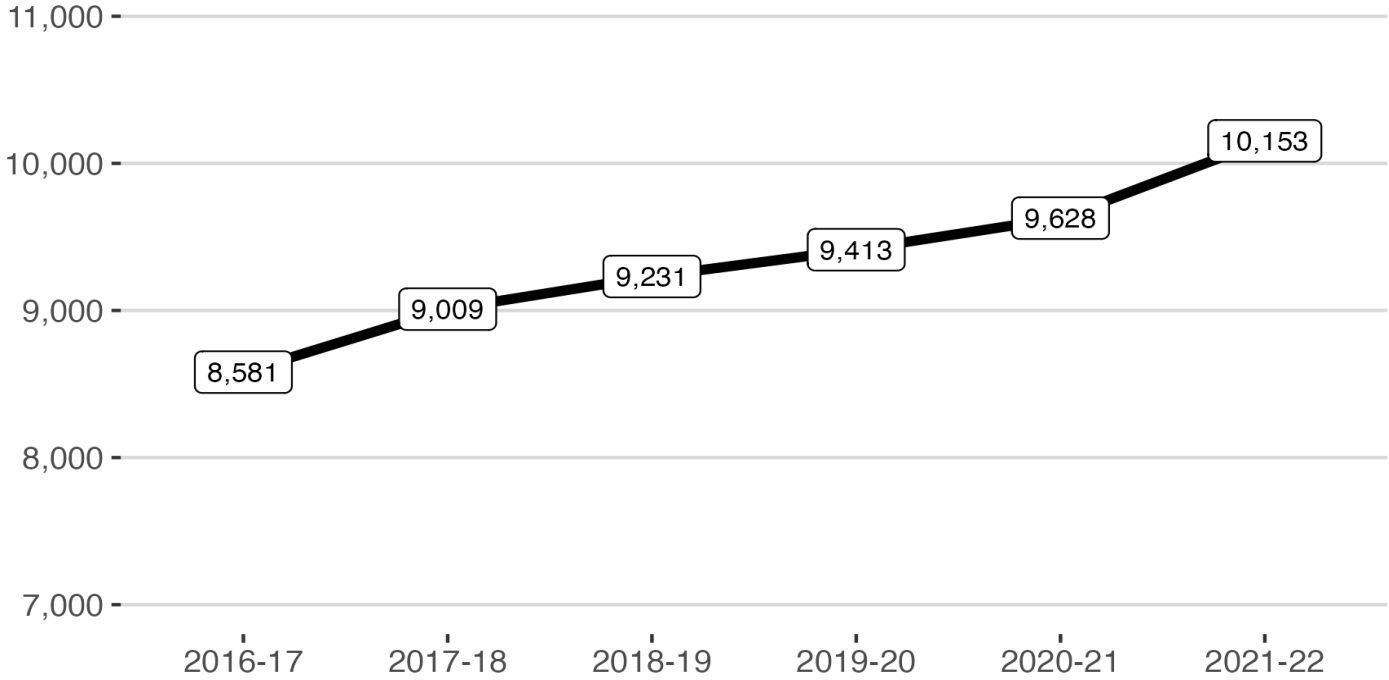
Total Enrollment in Monterey County

# Students with Disabilities Enrollment

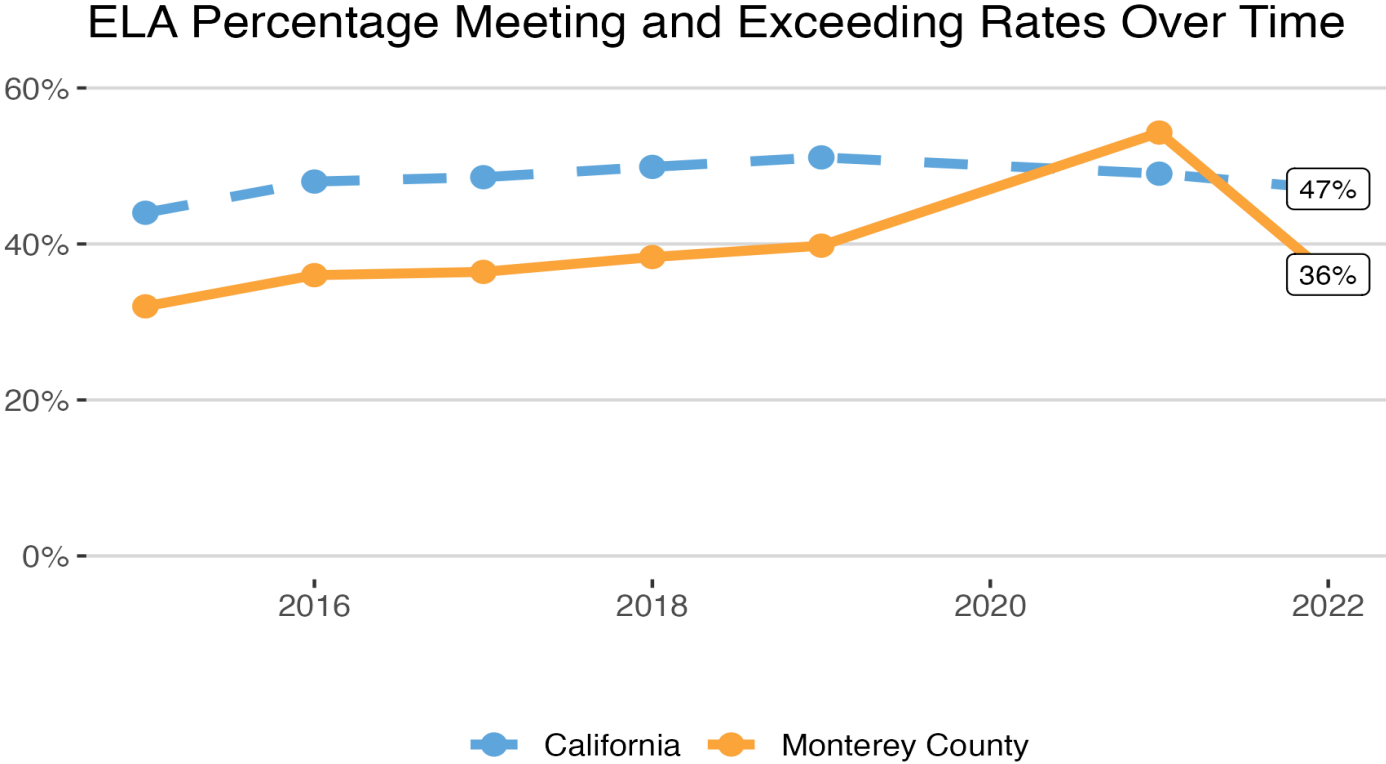
Students with Disabilities Enrollment in Monterey County

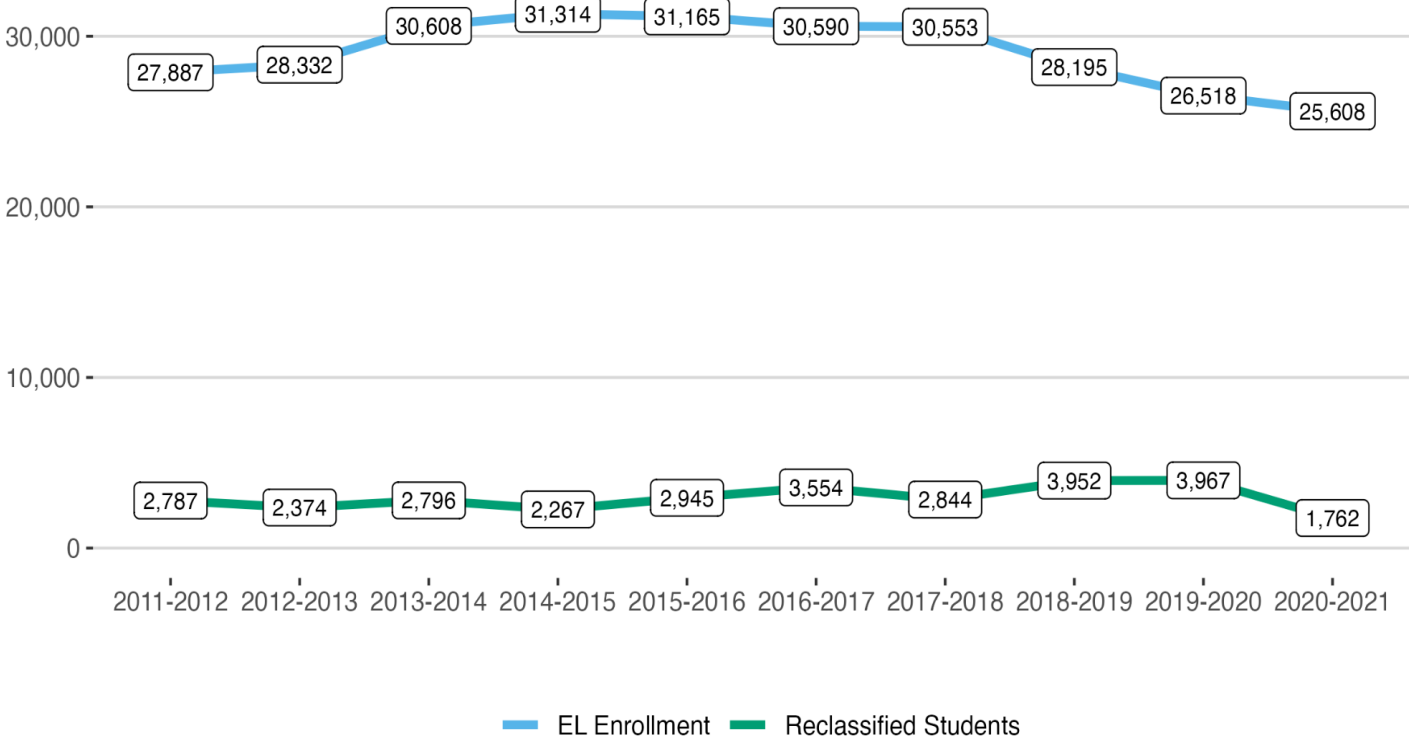

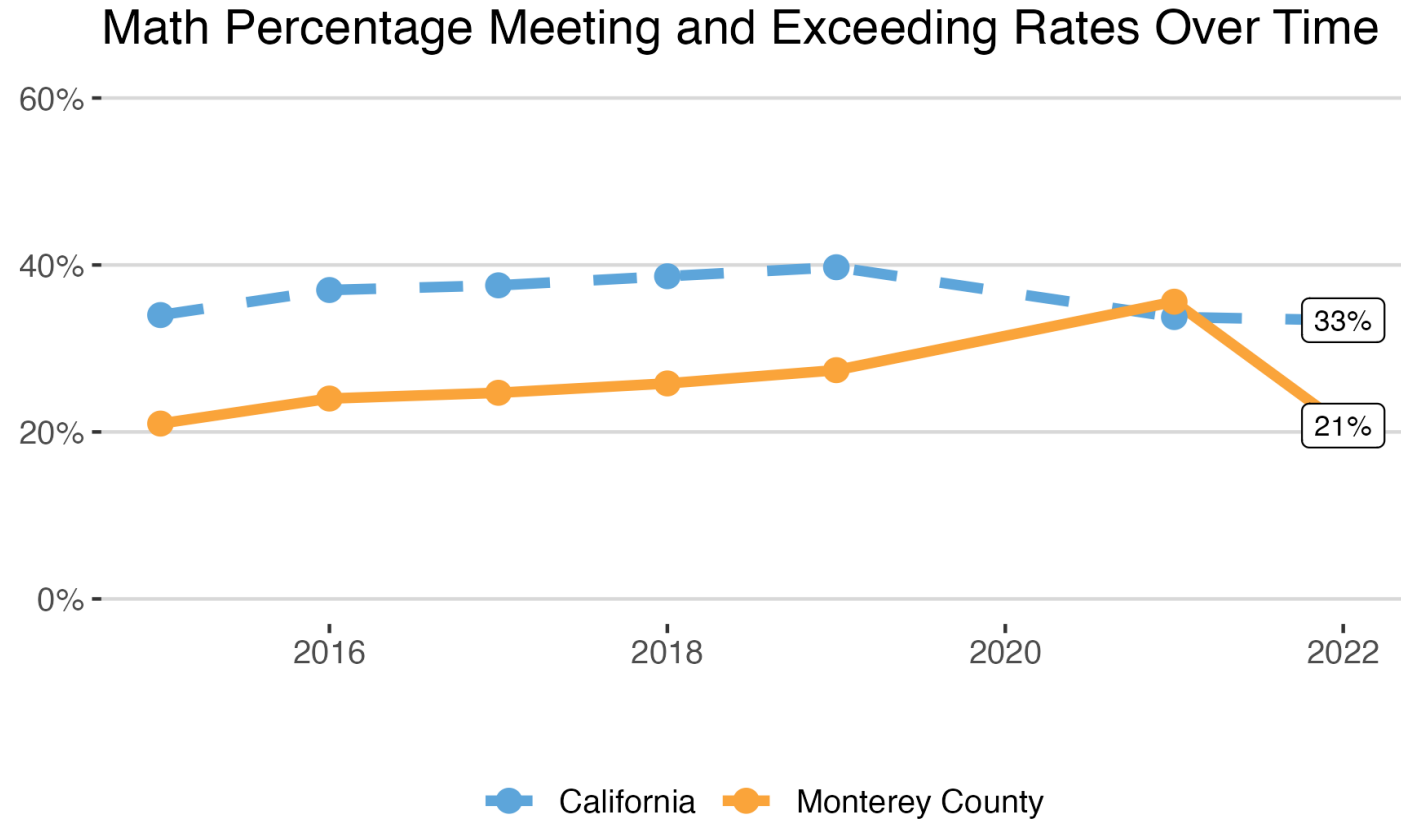
# English Language Learners

EL Enrollment and Number of Reclassified Students by Year



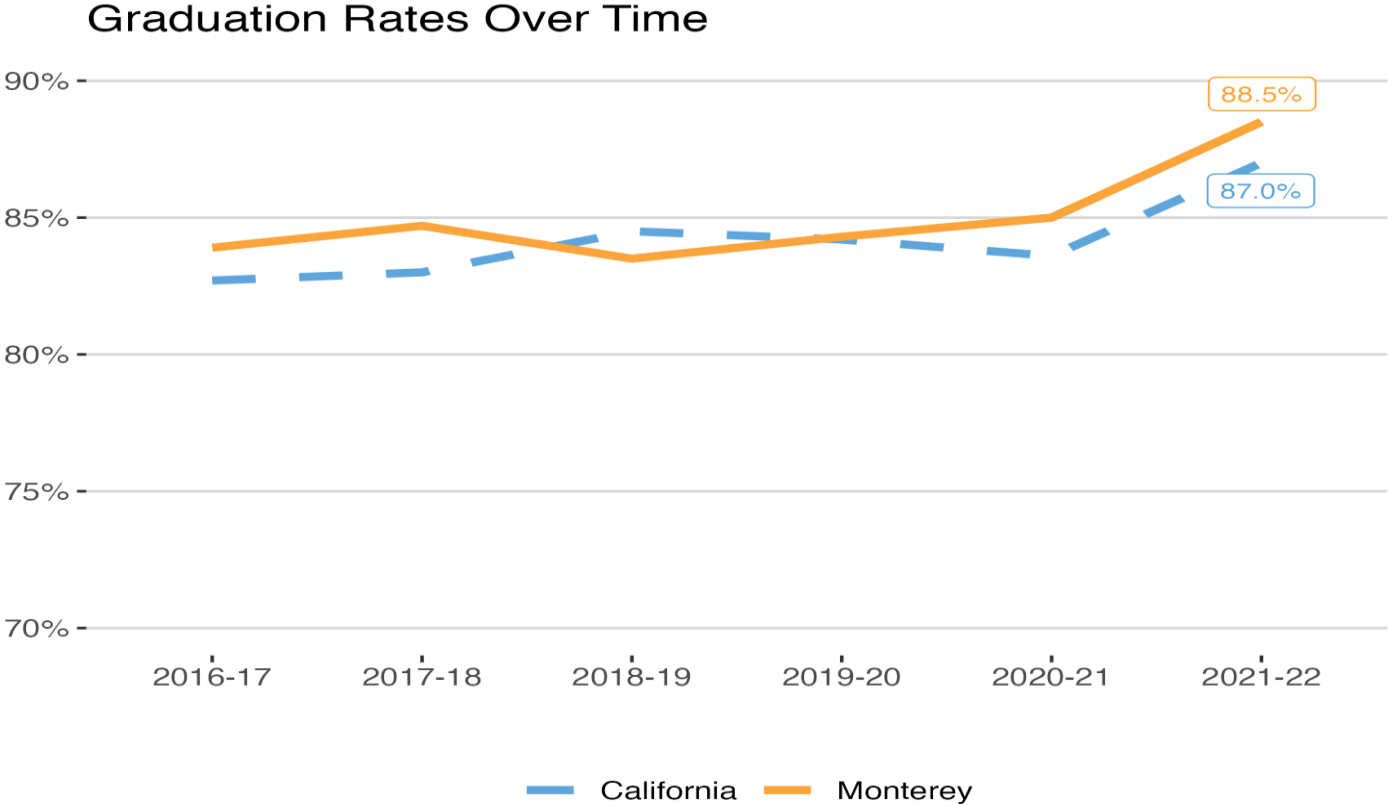

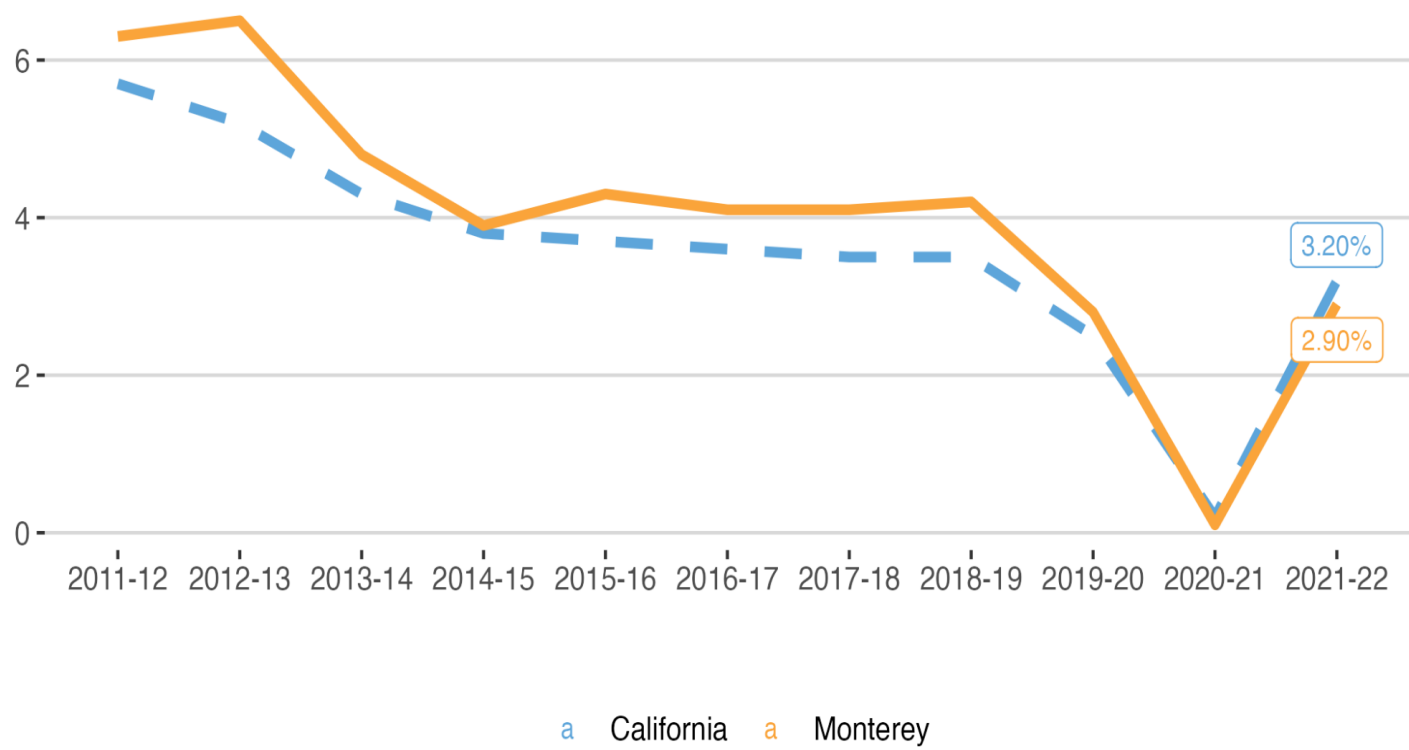
# Graduation Rates Over Time

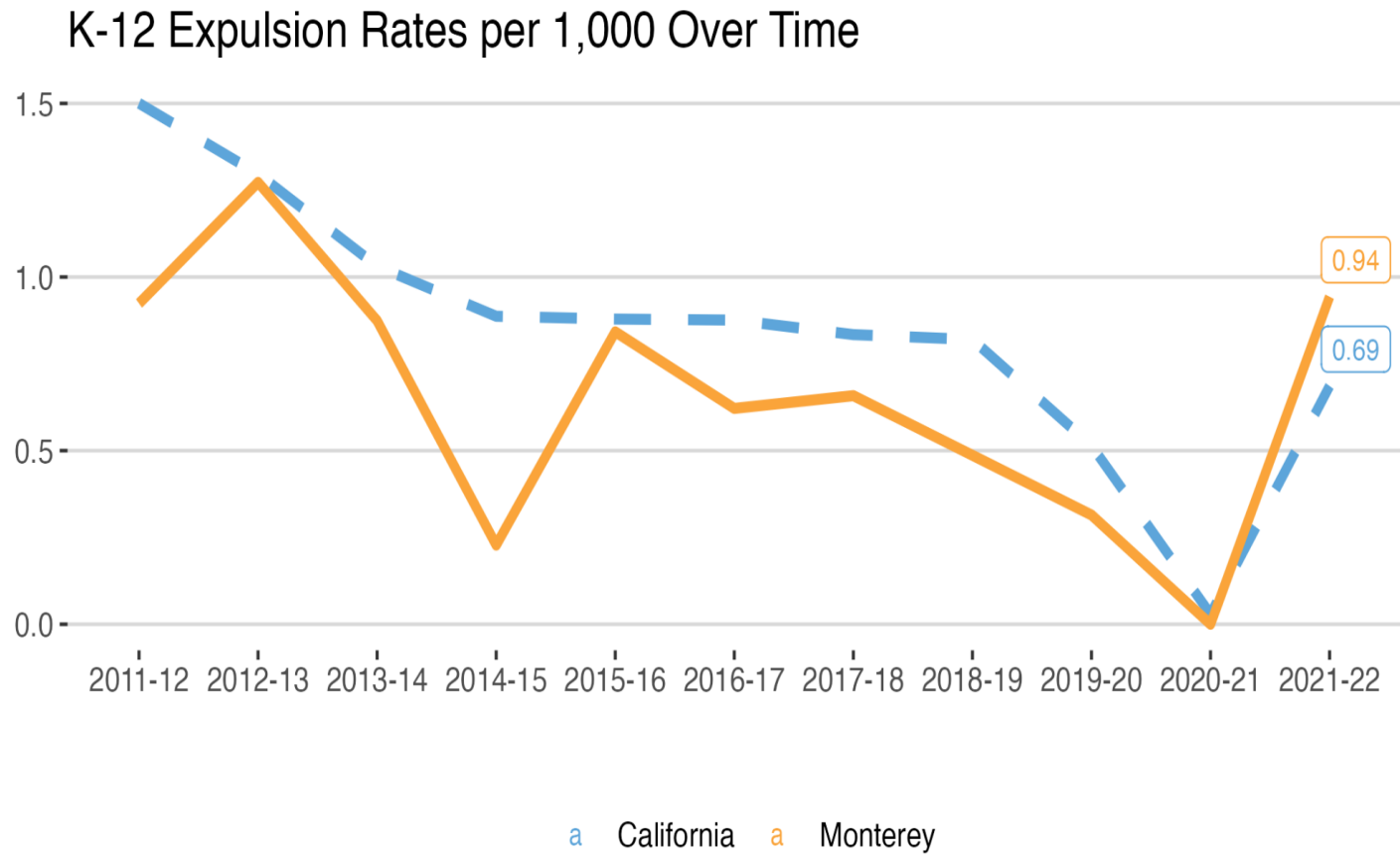
# Student Suspension Rates Over Time

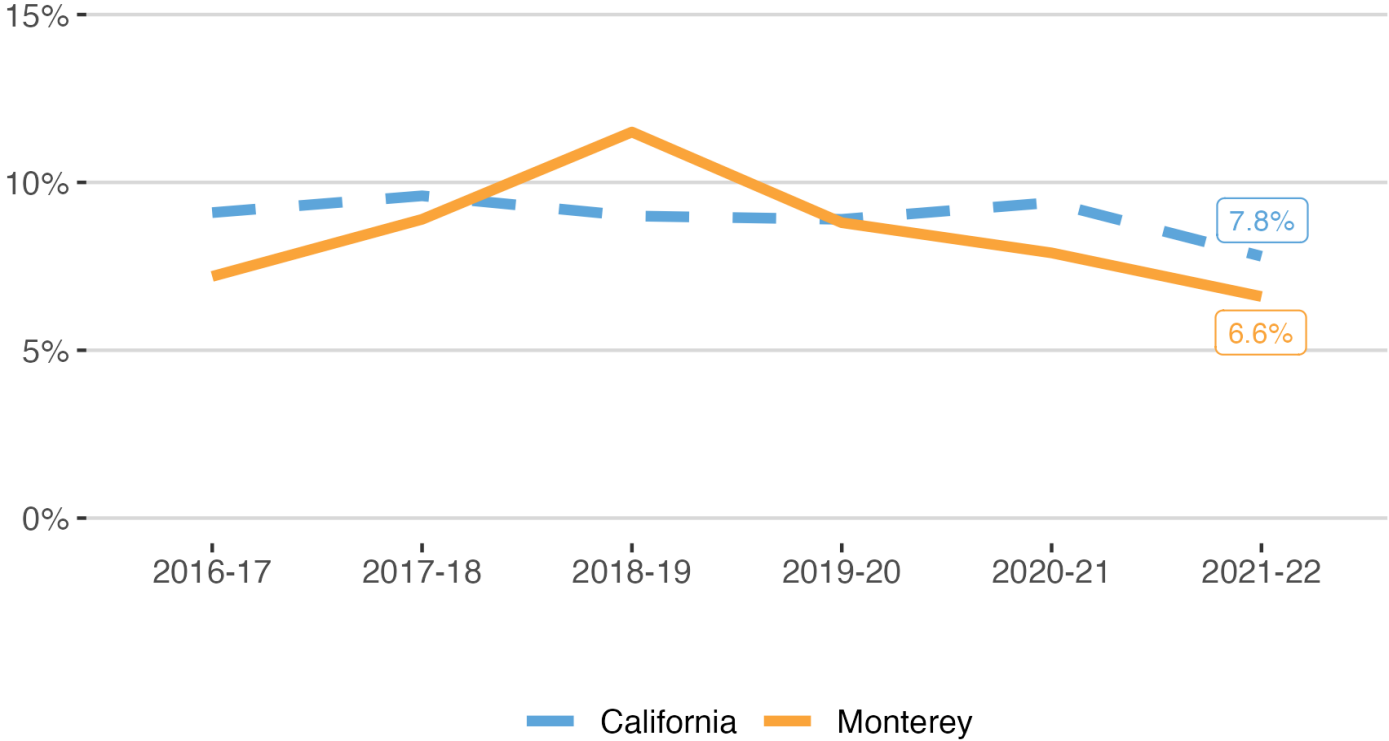
# Student Expulsion Rates Over Time

Dropout Rates Over Time



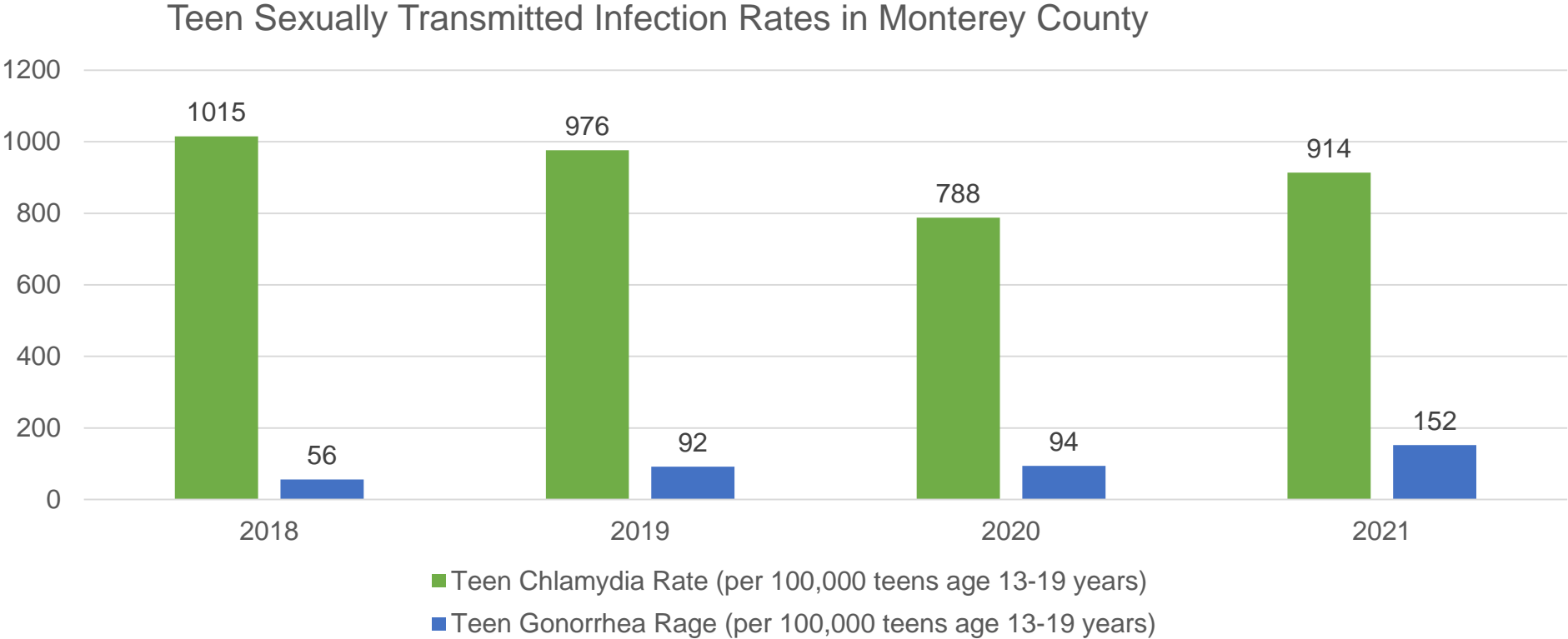

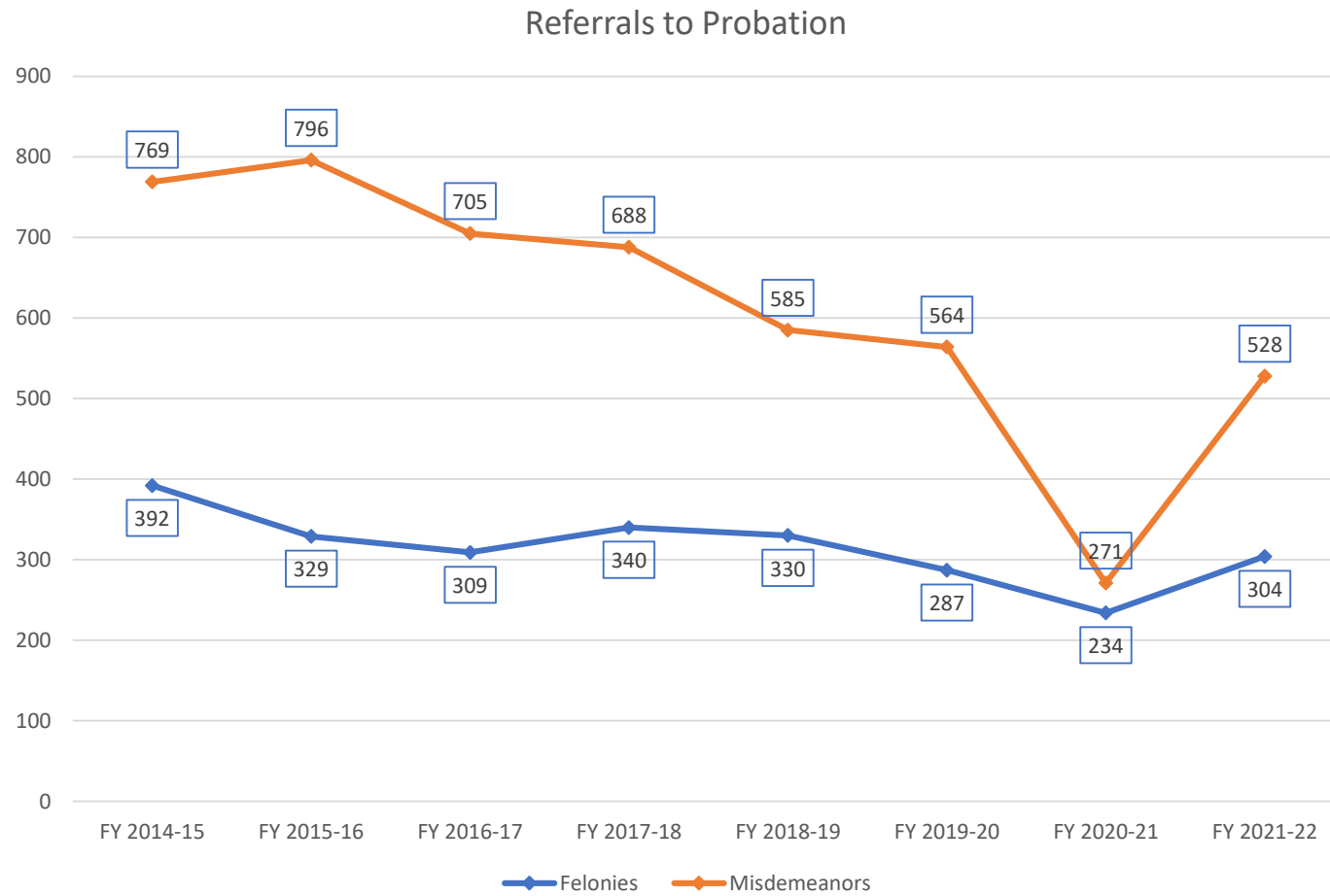

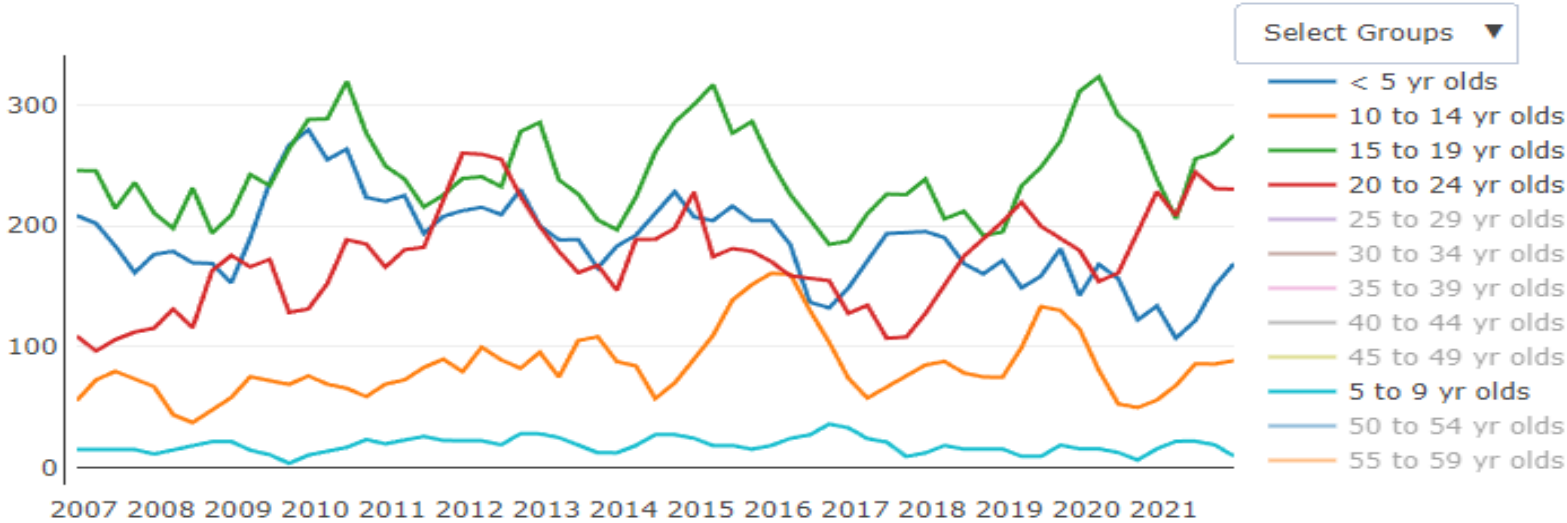

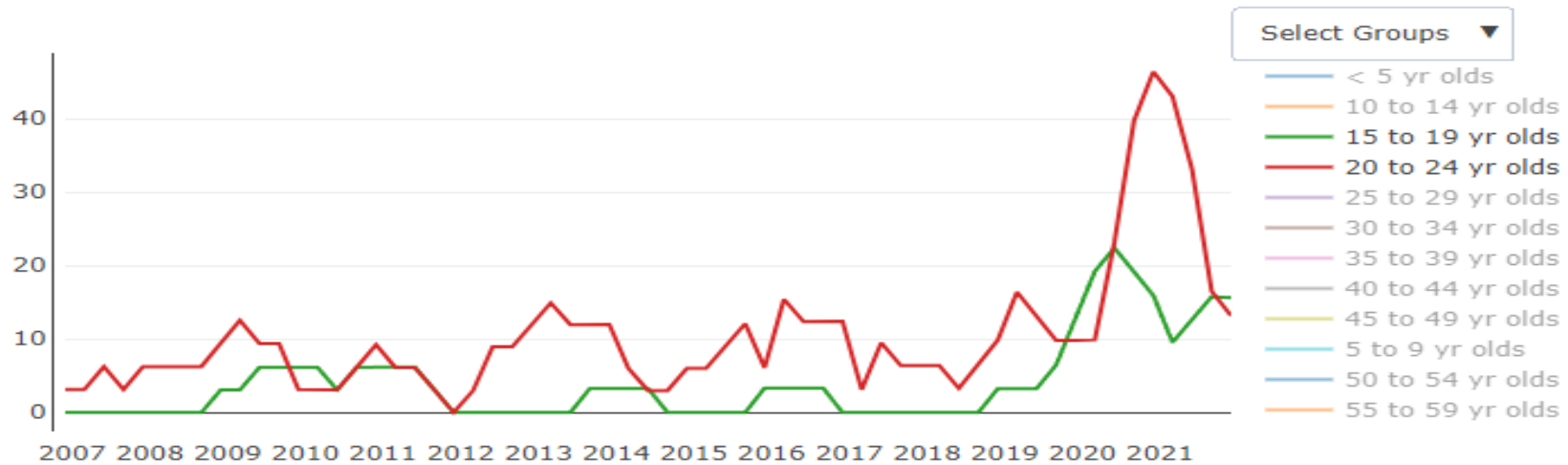
