 these needs. It is a local and state "snapshot" documenting the status of our
 children and youth. This Annual Report is intended to help community
 members make informed decisions with regarding public policy issues,
 volunteer efforts and support for nonprofit organizations.
- The Annual Report has four goals:
 - > To serve as a benchmark to measure how children and youth are faring over time
 - To serve as a catalyst to mobilize community wide efforts to address the most critical challenges to children and youth's circumstances
 - To recognize areas in which services and initiatives have been successful in improving children and youth's quality of life in order to maintain continued support for these efforts
 - > To present multiple indicators in a simple arrangement and location








Children with Health Insurance




Children in Foster Care


Socioeconomically Disadvantaged Enrollment in Monterey County


Student Homelessness Enrollment

Homeless Enrollment in Monterey County






Education of Mother




Licensed Child Car & Education Slots Available






Licensed Child Care and Education Cost






Preschool Cost in Monterey County



Public School Enrollment


Total Enrollment in Monterey County

Students with Disabilities Enrollment






EL Enrollment and Number of Reclassified Students by Year


Math Percentage Meeting and Exceeding Rates Over Time

Graduation Rates Over Time



K-12 Suspension Rates Over Time



K-12 Expulsion Rates per 1,000 Over Time



Dropout Rates Over Time








Juvenile Misdemeanor and Felony Arrests




Substance Abuse Disorders and Non-fatal Overdoses in Youth
