Program Inception & Goals

The Federal ERAP was designed as economic stimulus to address the impact of the pandemic on renters & landlords.

Monterey County received multiple rounds of federal and state funding for emergency rental assistance. The County opted for local control & invested additional funds to support individuals not eligible for federal resources.

DSS engaged in a collaboration with United Way Monterey County to organize local partners and administer assistance & services.

DSS has established infrastructure and community relationships to respond to emergencies and distribute resources.












Rent Assistance by Race/Ethnicity*
