


#### FRC GRANT TIMELINE



#### FRC Success Highlights



"We hosted our first labor rights community meetings in Greenfield. CHWs made calls and shared fliers to the community for this event. We successfully reached 32 workers through these meetings to capacitate them on their labor rights."



"After a presentation for housing rights, a woman was able to negotiate with her landlord and did not lose her housing. Ciclovia was a success for the youth program as many youth were reached and given information about our Youth for Change Program. The district will be collaborating with our Health program to provide a space for presentation."



"Aside from our focus to link people to health care/insurance. We've established a fantastic partnerships with Natividad and the Residents to bring Health presentations led by Doctors to our community. This initiative is called Cosechando Salud! (Haravesting Health)"



# Mujeres en Accion

"A CHW has been in contact with a community member that was looking for legal assistance resources. This individual believes that she has not been treated fairly and has not been compensated for all the work she has done for her employer. After a couple follow-up calls we were able to connect this individual with CRLA and the Agricultural Labor Relations Board (ALRB). Currently, this person is taking his employer to court for wage and salary claims."
