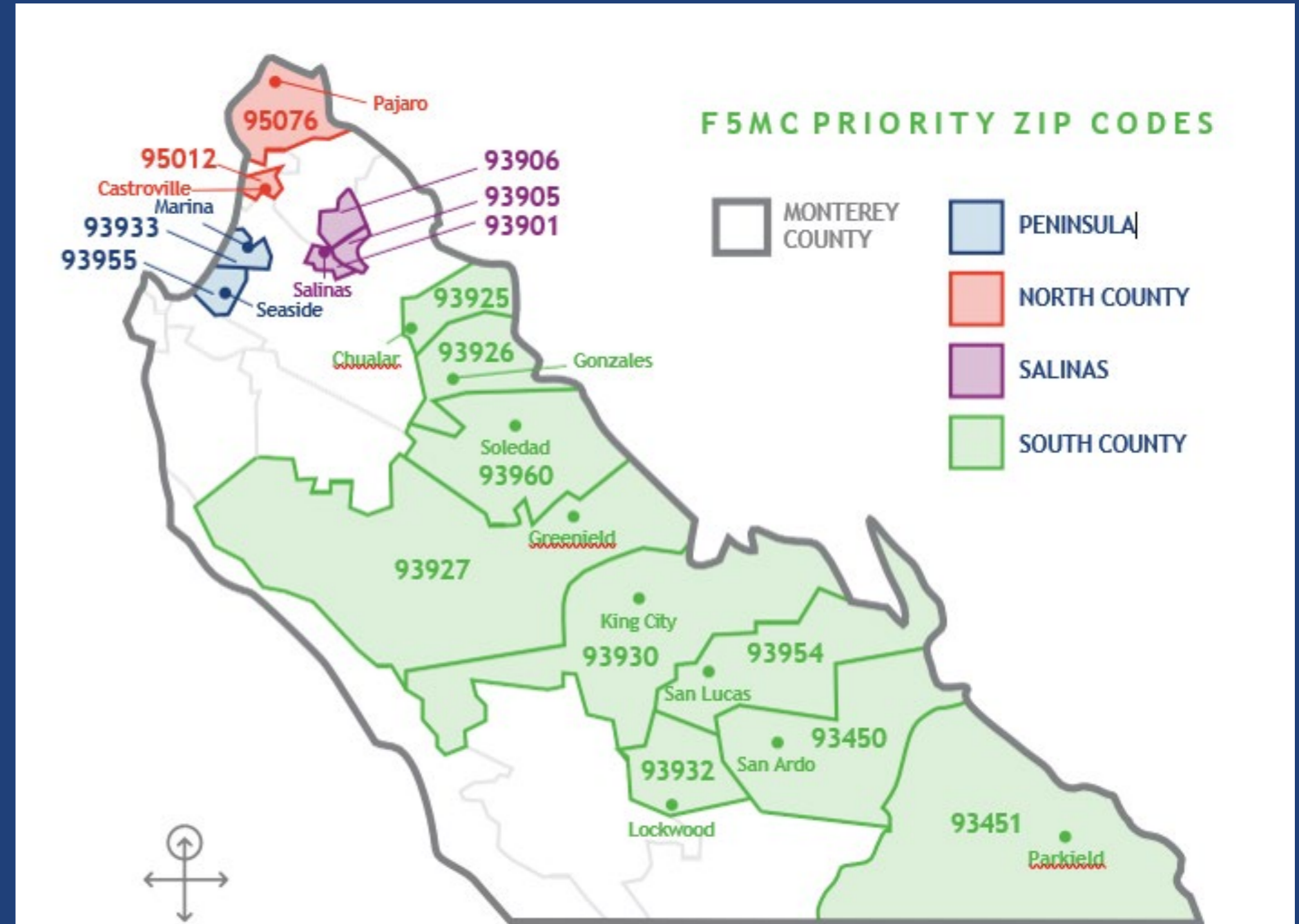
Holistic Services: Collaboratives

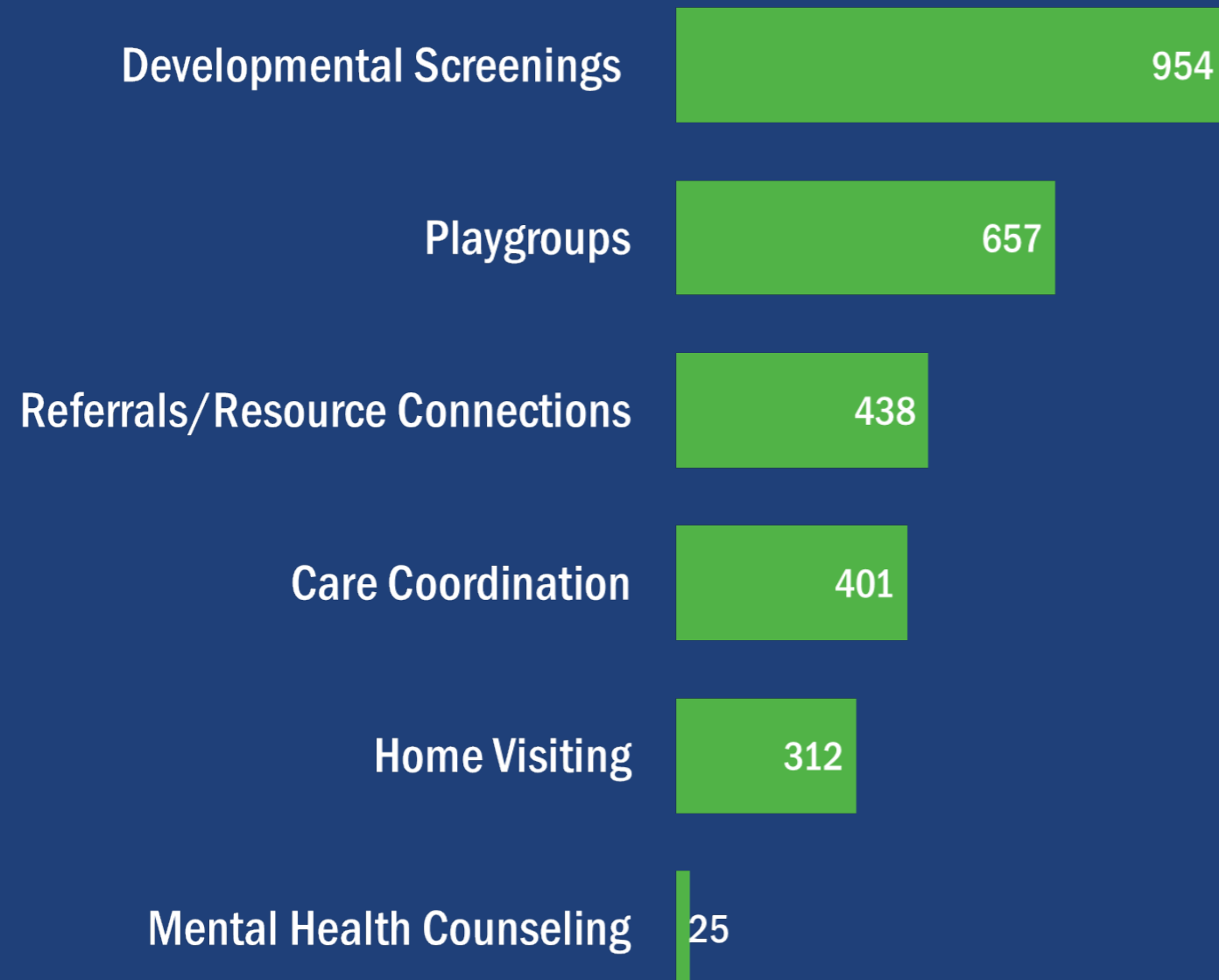

Children Served by Collaborative Services

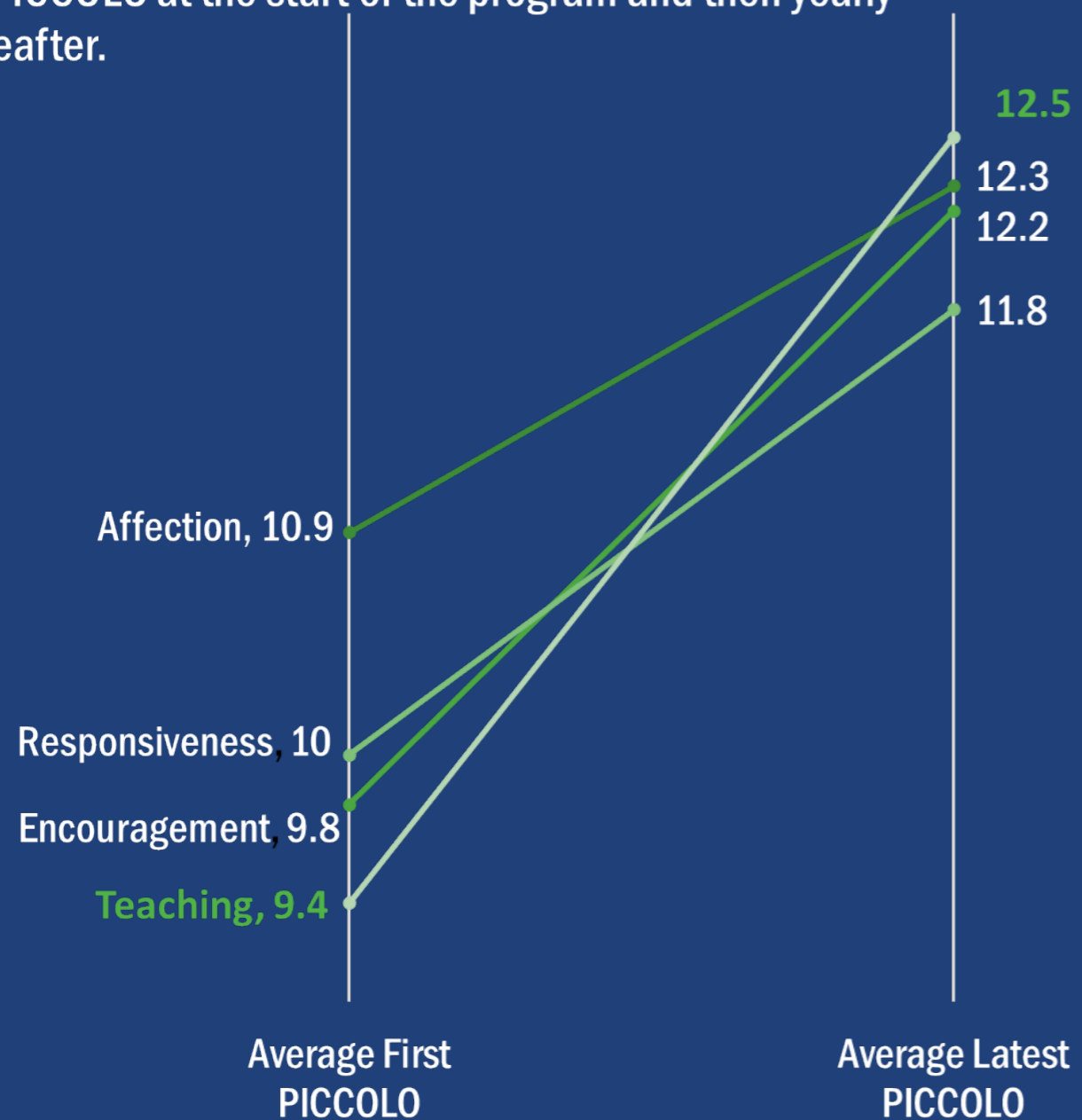

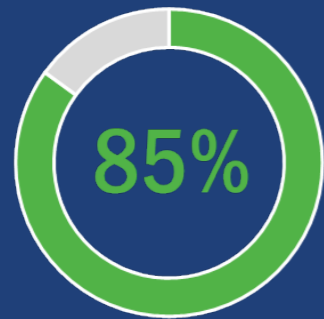

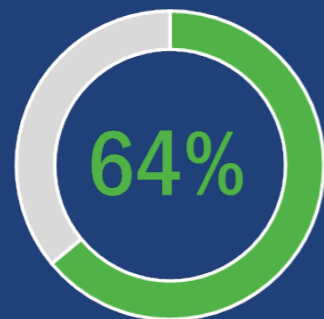


Mental Health Training

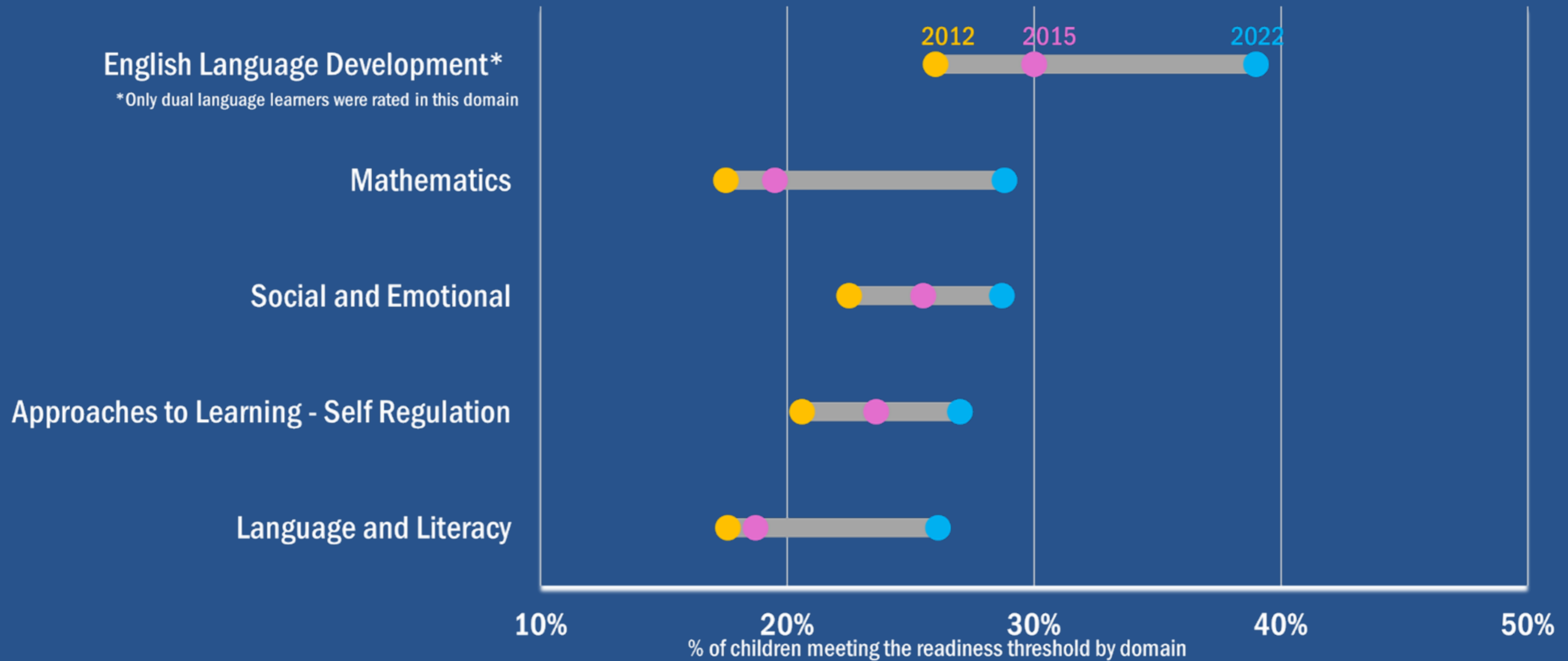

Community Readiness for Children 0-5

Children in 2022 were more likely to meet the readiness thresholds across all domains than children in 2015 and 2012. The DRDP-SR was used in 2012 and 2015; the DRDP-K was used in 2022. 2012 and 2015 scores were converted to domain scale scores for comparison to 2022. See technical appendix for the differences between the SR and K versions of the DRDP.
