**AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF MONTEREY, STATE OF CALIFORNIA,
AMENDING SECTION 12.12.010 OF THE MONTEREY COUNTY CODE RELATING
TO SPEED LIMITS ON COUNTY HIGHWAYS**

County Counsel Summary

This ordinance amends section 12.12.010 of the Monterey County Code to revise the speed limits and segment limits of two sections of Carmel Valley Road in the Carmel Valley area of the unincorporated area of the County of Monterey.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Monterey ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE AND FINDINGS. Pursuant to Article XI, section 7 of the California Constitution, the County of Monterey may adopt and enforce ordinances and regulations not in conflict with general laws to protect and promote the public health, safety, and welfare of its citizens. Pursuant to California Vehicle Code sections 22349 and 22358 (a) and the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, the County of Monterey may by ordinance determine and declare upon the basis of an engineering and traffic survey a speed limit of less than 55 miles per hour on Carmel Valley Road if the speed limit is appropriate to facilitate the orderly movement of traffic and is reasonable and safe.

SECTION 2. Section 12.12.010 of the Monterey County Code is amended to delete the following paragraphs:

Carmel Valley Road, from a point 3,000 feet west of the centerline of Laureles Grade, easterly to a point 400 feet west of the centerline of Boronda Road, fifty miles per hour.

Carmel Valley Road, from a point 400 feet west of its intersection with Boronda Road generally east to a point 300 feet west of its intersection with Pilot Road, thirty-five miles per hour.

SECTION 3. Section 12.12.010 of the Monterey County Code is amended to add the following paragraphs:

Carmel Valley Road, from a point 3,000 feet west of its intersection with Laureles Grade generally east to a point 700 feet west of its intersection with Phelps Way, forty-five miles per hour.

Carmel Valley Road, from a point 700 feet west of its intersection with Phelps Way generally easterly to a point 300 feet west of its intersection with Pilot Road, forty miles per hour.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall become effective on the thirty-first day following its adoption.
