WHEREAS, During FY24 the Military and Veterans Affairs Office filed 5,770 individual claim actions on behalf of 2,991 unique Veterans, to include 1,865 Disability Compensation and Pension claims; and

WHEREAS, The Military and Veterans Affairs Office waived \$1,906,860 in college tuition fees for 270 compensation payments; and WHEREAS, During FY24, on behalf of veterans, the Military and Veterans Affairs Office garnered \$6,308,454 in retroactive disability payments and \$13,418,099 in annualized recurring monthly
