

**Jail Upgrades in accordance with implementation plan:**

The implementation plan required the county to upgrade the number of personnel; plus make improvements to the physical plant and some of the policies in the county jail. Some of the specific areas of improvement are:

Video Surveillance System Upgrades	Cameras will improve safety and security for both staff and inmates and increase staff's ability to monitor sensitive need inmates.	Expect substantial completion on Feb 15, 2017, the term was extended primarily due to minor increase of scope requested by County and delays beyond the Contractor's control. Training of personnel, demolition of pre-existing devices and hardware and completion of punch list items remain and will continue through February.
Door Control System	Door controls will integrate surveillance cameras with door controls, intercoms, and duress alarms. Controls will increase officer safety, improve responses to critical incidents and will permit detailed auditing for verification of safety checks	Expect to finalize proposal and issue Notice to Proceed to Contractor in early February. Completion of that scope of work is expected by October 2017.

In addition to the facility upgrades, the Sheriff has also utilized a consultant to conduct a staffing analysis as defined in the implementation plan. The analysis is complete and will be presented to the budget committee in February of 2017. There are also a number of policy modifications in place. Sheriff's personnel have hosted numerous training sessions related to new policies and changes as a result of the implementation plan.
