WHEREAS, the County adopted the Monterey County Families First Coronavirus Response Act Implementation Policy in April 2020 in accordance with the federal legislation and in response to the COVID-19 public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, the paid leave provisions of the Monterey County Families First Coronavirus Response Act Implementation Policy expired on December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Monterey County is experiencing increased rates of COVID-19 diagnoses and some County employees did not exhaust FFCRA hours and/or dollar amount thresholds in 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Human Resources Department recommends extending the Monterey County Families First Coronavirus Response Act Implementation Policy provisions effective January 1, 2021 through March 31, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the intent of this extension is to provide employees who did not exhaust FFCRA hours and/or dollar amount thresholds in 2020, the ability to use remaining balances through March 31, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the County will administer the FFCRA provisions in accordance with the guidance provided by the United States Department of Labor and any applicable amended laws or rules;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors in and for the County of Monterey as follows:

- 1. The Monterey County Families First Coronavirus Response Act Implementation Policy is amended to extend the paid leave provisions from January 1, 2021 through March 31, 2021.
- 2. The Human Resources Department and the Auditor Controller Office are authorized to implement the provisions of the amended Monterey County Families First Response Act Implementation Policy.
