
### Urban County & Process

#### **Urban County**

- Urban County consortium includes the cities of Del Rey Oaks, Gonzales, Greenfield, and Sand City
- Consortium was required to meet minimum overall population and low- and moderate-income population requirements

#### Process for Selecting Projects for Funding

- Notice of Funding Availability
- Consortium members review & score public service applications
- Board of Supervisors Urban County Committee recommends funding for public services and public facilities to the full Board of Supervisors



## Available Funding & Limits on Uses

- New grant allocation of funding for 2024-25 is \$1,194,203, which is an increase of .2% over 2023-24 funding of \$1,191,644.
- Funds recaptured from prior year grants in the amount of \$144,858.

The Urban County may use up to 15% of the annual CDBG aware for public services.

The Urban County may use up to 20% of the annual CDBG award for general administration & fair housing.


# Public Facility Recommendatio n

# Public Facility Recommendation

#### City of Greenfield

- Walnut Avenue Street Widening & Pedestrian Improvements
- Up to \$1.4M in CDBG over 3-years if funding is not reduced
- \$427,191 CDBG in FY 2024-25
- Will receive 91% of the 2020-2024
   Consolidated Plan amount.



#### Public Facility Recommendations


- Veteran's Transition Center
  - Solar Empowerment Project
    - Enhance energy efficiency in 15 housing units dedicated to Veterans facing homelessness or housing insecurity
  - Requested \$500,000
  - Recommendation of \$286,450

- Additional Aromas Sidewalks
  - Aromas Elementary Sidewalks
  - Requested \$250,000
  - Recommendation of \$167,450

# Public Facility Project from 202324 Annual Action Plan

- San Lucas Solar Streetlights
  - \$100,000 was assigned from the 2023-24 grant funds
  - \$100,000 was assigned from recaptured funds not utilized
- The Community didn't have streetlights before
