BevMo is a large bottle store --it appears they have leased 3 storefronts right next to SaveMart. if you assign Maria Lopez to this project please make sure she does a site visit and does some research before she writes a staff report. This census tract call for 5 licenses and 5 are already in operation. (Incidentally a new restaurant is about to open in the Barnyard and that will make 7.)

In her staff report for 7 Carmel Center Place, she notes that the census tract allows calls for only one offsale license, but 3 are now in operation. 7 Carmel Center place would have made 4.. Maria assumed that because the mouth of the Valley is a region center, that more licenses should be issued for public convenience or necessity-- people in Carmel, Big Sur, Carmel Valley. Had Maria checked with the ABC she would have found in Carmel Proper 3 classy markets selling beer and wine, one complete bottle shop, 10 wine trasting rooms and numberous restaurants with off and on sale licenses. On the South Coast,5 beer and wine licenses and at least 8 restaurants with off and on sale licenses. Mid Valley has Safeway open 24 hours a day, plus beer and wine at the Shell station plus 3 restaurants with off and on sale plus another upscale 8 clubs and restaurants. The Village has 18 wine tasting rooms, a full bottle shop, 2 markets selling beer and wine, 2 minimarkets selling beer and wine. "public convenience or necessity?"

As for the mouth, when Maria wrote her report for 7 Carmel Center place, here's where you could buy beer and wine at the mouth of the VAlley: Safeway (open 24 hours a day), Chevron station (open 24 hours a day), plus Sea Harvest, Taste Morgan, Save Mart, Cornucopia market, and CVS Pharmacy. Since then off and on sale licenses, that means you can pick up

a six pack with you slice of pizza, taco or hot dog.

In talking with the people at Sun Street Center, the have convinced me that the more outlets selling alcohol the more problems --crime, dui stops, etc. In fact Sun Street opened a third center for dui classes on Carmel Valley Road due to the amount of drunk drivers here. And Carmel High is first in the state in Binge Drinking.

I think is is high time to move any more licenses from the ABC in Carmel Valley off the consent agenda and that future staff reports should mention the problems at Carmel High as a reason for not approving any more licenses from the ABC. I will be sending you the supporting charts for Carmel High in another e-mail.

Additionally, would it be helpful for the younger staff to have Christine present a power point that explains Carmel Valley-- it would cover things like alcohol licenses, signage, rural character. Christine suggested that this happen sometime in January. Margaret Robbins






(Wheel Binge (Episodic Fleawy) Drinking, Past 30 Days





Current Binge (Episodic Heavy Drinking, Past 30 Days


(Five or more drinks in a row, within a couple of hours)

- 1. There are already more off-sale licenced outlets than allowed per population in this Census Tract.
- 2. The one local middle school, one local high school, and one continuation high school are each within 1 mile or less than this location. Carmel High School has the HIGHEST incedence of binge drinking in the County and the State. We don't need more alcohol outlets here.
- 3. A discount, box store will unfairly compete with the other stores that sell alcohol in the area, which include a CV**£**. SaveMari and a huge SAfeway... all within 1/4 mile of this location. (Plus at least 2 mini markets that sell alcohol.)
- 4. Monterey County had 2 DUI schools for those arrested white driving intoxicated. One in Salinas and one in South County. Carmel/Carmel Valley have so many DUI's, that a THIRD location has opened up in the Valley.





The Carmel Valley Association is in its 63rd year of representing residents up and down the Carmel Valley. We have hundreds of members and operate exclusively as an all-volunteer group, funded by membership fees and donations only.

The application of BevMo must be denied.

- 1. BevMo is not needed in our area for lack of liquor or convenience. Carmel and Carmel Valley have more than enough alcohol outlets where we can purchase anything we need or want to drink. There are 19 wine tasting rooms and 5 stores with off-sale liquor licenses in the Carmel Valley Village, Safeway plus several other wine tasting rooms west of the Village, as well as 18 venues for purchasing alcohol near the mouth of the Valley. Even those who don't drink are well aware of where alcohol is sold! (See Example 174)
- 2. The Business and Professions Code (CA) Section 23815 states: "It is hereby determined that the **public welfare and morals require** that there be a **limitation** on the number of premises licensed for the sale of distilled spirits." Section 23817.4 states: "The Legislature finds and declares that the **public welfare and morals require** that there be a **limitation** to the number of premises licensed for the off sale of beer and wine."

Statistics show that teen binge drinking at Carmel High is the highest in the State, the welfare of our community, as well as our teens, is at stake. *Healthy Kids Survey attached. See for state results and comparisons: http://chks.wested.org/

Traffic DUI's have increased to the point that the 3rd DUI school opened in the County was placed in Carmel, since so many DUI's occur in this vicinity. The welfare of our community is at stake.

3. BevMo stores vary in their appearance. If they should receive permission from you to move forward, we would ask that, as required by the Carmel Valley Master Plan, design review before LUAC be mandated. (CV1.1) *See attached pictures of the BevMo at Crow Canyon and CV-1.1.



My name is Lorri Lockwood. I have lived in Big Sur for 35 years on a parcel adjacent to Hwy 1. Part of my daily routine is picking up cans and bottles littering my gate area which is adjacent Molera State Park and near a school bus stop. I simplify this chore by leaving my recycle can permanently at the gate for daily use.

A new source of wine and beer litter is not needed. Hwy 1 is a dangerous road to be driven carefully by sober drivers.

Approving a new source of alcohol adjacent such a road is irresponsible. Approving such a store near a high school and a middle school is equally irresponsible. I have lived here long enough to know students already run down to grocery stores for beer on their lunch hour and get help from homeless, hitch-hikers to purchase beer for them if they choose not to simply steal it.

The applicants claim Big Sur is in need of this store. Talked with friends and neighbors and learned they, like myself buy mostly at Costco and Trader Joes and prefer one stop shopping there or the grocery chains at mouth of the Valley. Locally, we can purchase beer and wine at the River Inn Store, Ripplewood (where locals get a 10% discount), the Lodge Store at Pfeiffer State Park and the Big Sur Deli next to the post office.

Neighbors with second homes here usually bring food and drink with them or if they fly in, stop at Whole Foods, Costco, Traders before they come down the Coast. Campers often do the same and supplement locally. Members of Pebble Beach golf and tennis clubs get a 15% discount, I am told, from the Lodge store.





I strongly urge you to deny this application since I believe there are too many places selling alcohol in Carmel and Carmel Valley. According to ABC San Jose Senior Legal Analyst, Ms. Bordenkircher, tract 116.02 (see Exhibit A) had 8 on-sale licenses allowed and 18 have been issued. Mrs. Robbins has been trying unsecessfully to talk with Joff Anadon who is handling the file in Salinas.

We did go to the ABC website and looked at tract 116.02. (See Exhibit B). That shows a total of 23 licenses with one license being surrendered (Hola Mexican Restaurant). However, Carmel Bar and Grill has been selling and serving alcohol out of that location since before New Year's. Also, item #4 on the list is really semi private and not advertised to the public.

The Salinas licensing supervisor told us, the ABC can't turn down applications. They must look at everyone who wants a license. They do background checks and rely on the Sheriff's department to show a public crime rate that would justify a denial by the Sheriff.

It's up to the Board of Supervisors to use commen sense and say no when the number of licenses exceeds the allowed number. Not every thing is a matter of public necessity and convenience.

Common sense: Do not issue one more license in tract 116.02 because there is a drinking problem that starts in middle school (less than a half mile from the BevMo location) and it really gets serious at Carmel High (less than a mile from BevMo) -- now number one in then entire state in binge drinking. Please deny the Bevmo request for a liquor license.

I ask that you take a very close look at the slides provided by Mr. Heath Rocha, Director of Student Services Of Carmel Unified School District.


