Finding F-2: With the addition of a long rifle and heavy weapons range, Impossible City would provide an ideal solution to the lack of adequate facilities within Monterey County to train SWAT and bomb disposal officers of the Monterey County Sheriff's Department, and Salinas Police Departments SWAT officers.

Response F-2: *The County agrees with this finding.*

RESPONSE TO: Recommendations R-1

Recommendation R-1: The County of Monterey and the City of Salinas should enter into negotiations with Monterey Peninsula College for joint use of Impossible City. These negotiations should include the Monterey County Board of Supervisors, the Salinas City Council, Salinas City Manager, and representatives of the Monterey County Sheriff's Department and the Salinas Police Department.

Response R-1: *The recommendation has not yet been implemented, but will be implemented in the future. The County Administrative Office will work with the Sheriff's Office and the City of Salinas with the timing dictated by the needs of the Sheriff's Office and the Salinas Police Department.*
