I've just completed 18 years of everyday use of Fort Ord for running, biking and hiking. I, my wife, my children and grandchildren, friends and dogs have enjoyed Fort Ord.. I have (on foot) travelled more than 30,000 miles (as judged by GPS and the 2-4 hours daily) since the base closure. FORA has made my past entrance at 8th and Gigling an unpleasant experience, making trail usage against the law and requiring a 1 ¾ mile hike on paving before you reach the National Monument trails. Although the no trespassing signs are still an unpleasant eyesore on the Jerry Smith trailhead on Intergarrison Road, it only requires a ½ mile hike on a trail to reach the National Monument. Public institutions that are affected and will be affected more so are the Department of Defense employees and CSUMB students and faculty.

If you open Intergarrison to speeding traffic you will make an extremely dangerous place for people to unload their bikes, their children, their horses and their dogs. There will be speeding traffic (55 mph and up) approaching a pedestrian zone where people park on both sides of Intergarrison Road. I had the extremely unpleasant experience of being at the Jerry Smith trailhead when numerous, monstrous concrete trucks came roaring through. They raised choking clouds of dust as they went past with no apparent regard for the trail users. The road was still "closed" at this time but apparently the construction company can do as it likes.

There will be disastrous results or are you going to take away this trailhead too? You will be effectively denying people on the western and northern side of the National

Monument from access. If your intent is to close off the Monument to users from the western and northern sides you are succeeding.

Opening Intergarrison Road will create a safety conflict for cars and trailers which are currently parking on the roadway and shoulders of Intergarrison Road adjacent to the Jerry Smith Access Corridor trailhead.

Over the last several years the Jerry Smith Corridor Trail Head has become an important access point to the Fort Ord National Monument Public lands. I am an officer of FORT Friends and MORCA, but am speaking for myself in this e-mail, though I am confident my colleagues share the concerns below.

I am not able to attend the June 18 meeting, so I ask you via this e-mail to please carefully consider the safety of hundreds of hikers, bikers, runners, dog-walkers, families with young children, and equestrians who use the Jerry Smith Access Corridor each day in your decision-making about opening Intergarrison Road.

Your staff report erroneously described "up to 20 cars per day" (or at a time). There is so much more use than that, especially on weekends. Also there are folks walking or riding from nearby CSUMB housing areas.

There needs to be safe parking and/or street crossing for the hundreds of local folks and visitors who daily use one of the few access points to the Fort Ord National Monument from the Marina area.

To not provide safe access dishonors former Supervisor Jerry Smith, for whom the access corridor is named, and endangers the public. It also increases risk of lawsuits against the County if there is an accident due to excessive speeds allowed and inadequate safety measures.

There are a variety of safer alternatives and I am very confident that dozens of local trail users would be happy to volunteer time and potentially equipment if money for labor is an issue for the County. We are very invested in a safe trail system.

Thank you for coordinating with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) regarding the possible opening of Inter-garrison Road from Schoonover Road to Reservation Road. As you know, the eastern third of this road has been closed to public vehicle use for quite some time. There are currently gates at both ends of this road to prevent vehicle trespass, and a popular parking area has formed near the gate by Schoonover Road in front of the Jerry Smith Access Corridor.

I have attached a map to help illustrate where this road is located in relation to the Fort Ord National Monument, and other parcels of interest. The Inter-garrison Road segment in question is about ½ mile north of the National Monument and is separated by lands designated within the Installation-Wide Multispecies Habitat Management Plan (HMP) as Habitat Reserve, Habitat Corridor, and Open Space Park (i.e. former Travel Camp). Although the Fort Ord Reuse Authority (FORA) still manages the lands designated as Habitat Corridor and Habitat Reserve in this region, Monterey County now oversees the former Travel Camp south of the road segment.

The BLM is aware that the Fort Ord Reuse Plan calls for the development of Eastside Parkway that would connect Inter-garrison Road to Eucalyptus Road north of the National Monument. Our understanding is that the Eastside Parkway transportation corridor is meant to mitigate for regional transportation impacts created by implementation of the reuse plan, and to alleviate current transportation gridlock in and around the former Fort Ord. It is further our understanding that Eastside Parkway is on the CIP for implementation in 2014-2016. Until that transportation corridor is developed, there could be a considerable level of vehicle use on Inter-garrison Road accommodating motorists between the Salinas area and the Monterey Peninsula.

The BLM urges the County and FORA to continue use of the current parking area near the Jerry Smith Access Corridor until such time that a more permanent access point can be developed. This current parking area may need to be supported by a three-way stop sign at the Schoonover/Inter-garrison Road intersection should the road opening generate a sizable traffic load. This makeshift parking area is not the ideal situation; however, it accommodates quite a few visitors to the National Monument. This is especially true during the few weekends when races occur from the other makeshift parking area near the intersection of 8th Avenue and Gigling Road.

The BLM also urges the County to take measures to prevent illegal road use and dumping along the segment you propose to open. There are a few trails/roads that tie into the Inter-garrison Road segment that might be inviting to dumpers if there is no management presence. This occurred quite frequently on the future CSU Monterey Bay property south of Inter-garrison Road and has been nearly eliminated since FORA posted these routes as "closed/no trespassing" and asserted a management presence. While there are still "closed/no trespassing" signs south of the road segment in question, there are none north of the road.

Furthermore, the BLM urges the County to restrict public parking along the edges of the road between the Jerry Smith Access Corridor and Reservation Road to reduce the chance of accidental fire starts. There are several trail intersections along the road that have flammable grasses that could ignite should people try to park along the road. We would recommend that no further parking be allowed between the Jerry Smith Access Corridor and Reservation Road unless a formalized parking area is constructed.

It is the BLM"s desire to have professionally developed, managed and appearing trailheads serving the National Monument/County Habitat Areas and this is especially important along the northern margins where only makeshift parking areas exist. The BLM is interested in coordinating with the County on the provisions of these trailheads. We believe that there are opportunities to develop high quality trailheads in the following Monterey County areas at some future time: 1) south of Watkins Gate Road across from the former Travel Camp entrance; 2) near the ASP off Barloy Canyon Road, and 3) southeast of Eastside Parkway near the Jerry Smith Access Corridor.



As mentioned in a letter dated 10/1/12, CSUMB understands that the opening of Inter-Garrison Road east of Schoonover Drive will provide secondary access to the housing development currently under construction southeast of the Inter-Garrison Road/Reservation Road intersection. However, since Inter-Garrison Road has not been open to through traffic or analyzed under current interim roadway conditions that include Eighth Street being closed and Eastside Parkway not yet built it is premature to assume that the proposed improvements will create a safe roadway condition.

The campus asks that current interim regional traffic patterns be sufficiently analyzed and any immediate decision to open Inter-Garrison Road be regarded as temporary and contingent on additional analyses. Interim improvements should ensure the safety of all users as they cross the road or travel its length.

County staff recommends that on 6/18/13 the Board of Supervisors (BOS) approve "Option B," which would open Inter-Garrison Road east of Schoonover Drive after approved stops are in place. The chosen option should address all safety aspects of Inter-Garrison Road, some of which are described below, not just the Schoonover Drive intersection. Thus, CSUMB requests that the BOS and the County staff only consider the opening of Inter-Garrison Road to through-traffic during interim conditions as a temporary measure pending adequate analysis of Inter-Garrison Road. If warranted, the analysis will determine the appropriate safety measures necessary to protect the CSUMB campus and community now and during future conditions.

Current Interim Road Conditions

The opening of Inter-Garrison Road under current conditions may result in safety and traffic impacts on the CSUMB campus. Despite the draft 2013-14 FORA CIP project dates, it is unclear when the following roadway conditions will be addressed to help alleviate safety and traffic impacts on campus caused by increased traffic volumes.

- The impacted nature of Imjin Parkway, Highway One and Highway 68
- The incomplete Eighth Street connection between Inter-Garrison Road and Second Avenue
- The absence of Eastside Parkway
- Inter-Garrison Road is currently too narrow for bike lanes east of Schoonover Drive
- Inter-Garrison Road has a posted speed limit of up to 50 mph in certain areas
- Both Abrams Drive and Schoonover Drive have one-way stops leading to unprotected left hand turns across Inter-Garrison Road.

Without improvement to these interim road conditions, it is uncertain if Inter-Garrison Road can safely accept increased vehicle traffic from regionally impacted roads (see Attachment A information below). This puts the CSUMB campus community at risk for vehicle – vehicle, pedestrian or bicycle collisions from an increased volume of uncontrolled high-speed traffic.

Engineering Concepts Report – Attachment A

The Engineering Concepts Report included in the Board of Supervisors 6/18/13 packet:

- Estimates the Schoonover Road/Inter-Garrison Road intersection currently has 1,700-2,100 average daily trips (ADT) (pg 6)
- States that the FORA/TAMC 2005 traffic study projects 7,100 ADTs on Inter-Garrison Road before Eastside Parkway is built (pg 6)
- Proposed Option A "No Change for Now" states:
 - "Do not open Inter-Garrison Road to through traffic until completion of the Eastside Parkway/Inter-Garrison four-lane project and an associated permanent parking lot in accordance with the draft Trails Master Plan".
 - The negative impact associated with not opening the road is "Existing traffic congestion on roads in the surrounding area, particularly Imjin Parkway, Reservation Road, Highway 68 will temporarily continue to worsen as more traffic is generated by the occupation of new homes in East Garrison, Marina Heights and the Dunes, together with increasing enrollment at CSUMB, pending the construction of the Eastside Parkway/Inter-Garrison Road four-lane project."

The Engineering Concept Report suggests that before Eastside Parkway is constructed, an open Inter-Garrison Road will help alleviate regional traffic by accepting 7,100 ADTs, approximately 5,000 ADTs or four times more ADTs than currently counted at the Schoonover Drive/Inter-Garrison Road intersection and just east of Sixth Avenue on the Main Campus (according to campus counts). CSUMB annual vehicle counts already indicate a large percentage of trips passing through the campus are unassociated with campus business and current campus roadways and intersections along Inter-Garrison Road are not prepared to safely handle this increase in regional traffic. The opening of Inter-Garrison Road should be considered temporary until the proper traffic and safety analyses are conducted. Any identified interim mitigations should be implemented to protect the campus and local community pending regionally programmed improvement completion.

CSUMB Traffic Calming Efforts

In anticipation of the opening of Inter-Garrison Road, CSUMB implemented traffic calming measures on the Main Campus along Inter-Garrison Road between Second and Sixth Avenues as well as along Seventh Avenue, A Street and Divarty Street. The campus expects these measures will help slow the increase in traffic on the Main Campus associated with opening of the road.

CSUMB's East Campus Housing (ECH) contains 1,212 units and approximately 3,636 students, staff, faculty and campus partners that regularly travel the two miles to the Main Campus along Inter-Garrison Road or the short distance to the open space just south of Inter-Garrison Road. The traffic calming measures installed between Second and Sixth Avenues do not protect those traveling outside of the Main Campus. At certain places along Inter-Garrison Road, outside of the Main Campus, the posted speed limit is 50 mph, with traffic traveling at even higher speeds along this straight and narrow road. The ability to reduce the speed along this road is of great concern.

As discussed with the County, CSUMB assumes responsibility for implementing traffic control at the Inter-Garrison Road/Abrams Drive. Pedestrian and bicycle traffic is prevalent and will be considered in the improvements.

Requested Safety Measures

In order to help protect the campus community from increased high-speed vehicle trips, CSUMB requests that the County fully analyze and consider implementing the appropriate safety measures identified by transportation professionals along Inter-Garrison Road at a minimum in the following locations:

1. Traffic control on Inter-Garrison Road at Schoonover Drive

Traffic control might include a traffic circle, stops sign, or traffic light. Pedestrian and bicycle traffic is prevalent and should be accommodated by the improvements

2. <u>Traffic control or safety-related diversion on Inter-Garrison Road at the Eighth Street Cut-Off/Seventh Avenue Intersection</u>

CSUMB encourages improvements that require westbound motorists to only use Eighth Street Cutoff instead of continuing west on Inter-Garrison Road through the main campus. Pedestrian and bicycle traffic is prevalent and should be accommodated by the improvements.

CSUMB seeks assistance from the County, City of Marina and FORA to prioritize funding in FORA's Capital Improvement Program for the completion of the Eighth Street connection between Inter-Garrison Road and Second Avenue. Eighth Street was always contemplated to be open through to Second Avenue as part of the interim regional roadway network. The impact of non-CSUMB traffic using the campus as a cut-through has been steadily increasing and the opening of Inter-Garrison Road will only exacerbate this situation.

3. <u>Traffic control, detour and routing signage on Inter-Garrison Road at Eight Avenue</u>

Through-traffic traveling westbound on Inter-Garrison Road, through the campus core, should instead use Eighth Avenue southbound as the preferred route through campus. Traffic control may be necessary to protect left hand turns. Detour and routing signage will ensure motorists have adequate notice to utilize the appropriate route.

Thank you for considering the safety concerns of the campus along Inter-Garrison Road. CSUMB supports the opening as long as it is contingent upon a full traffic analysis and the County committing to make the appropriate improvements as identified as a result of the analysis.

We believe that at a minimum, improvements at the three locations identified above will help reduce some of the safety implications caused by opening Inter-Garrison Road to through traffic en route to/from Reservation Road before surrounding programmed road improvements are in place. We look forward to working collaboratively with you on this issue.
