


APPLICATION FOR ADMINISTRATIVE TREE REMOVAL

This application is for the removal of three or less trees not combined with any development permit that requires discretionary approval. Removal of over three trees requires a discretionary permit. If it is believed that the tree(s) is/are a hazard, an ISA Tree Hazard Evaluation Form shall be required with the submittal of the completed application.

Based on the site plan, photos, report prepared by a County-approved tree consultant, and other information submitted by the applicant, the Monterey County RMA-Planning Department shall make a determination pertaining to the removal of trees.

All tree removal permits approved by the County are subject to conditions of approval. The approved permit(s) shall not be complete until all conditions are met. A copy of the approved tree removal permit(s) must be posted on each tree proposed to be removed for 10 days prior to removal. A copy of the approved tree removal permit(s) must be retained on-site during removal operations.



Excessive tree pruning resulting in the removal of over one-turo of green foliage requires a free named permit.

This letter is to present my findings on a removed cypress tree at 1170 Signal Hill Road, Pebble Beach, CA. I inspected the site on July 10, 2009 and made the following observations.

Observations

The removed Monterey cypress (*Cupressus macrocarpa*) was growing at the southwest corner of a one story single family residence with an attached garage. This tree will be referred to as tree 1 in this report. The stump has been cut to grade and measures 41 inches in diameter. The stump has recently been cut as evidenced by the color of the wood. Please refer to image 1 to view the stump. The stump is approximately 12 feet from the structure. The garage on this home is on the southern side. Please refer to attachment 1 to view a sketch of the site.

On the eastern side of the courtyard fence there are several other Monterey cypress trees that have dying limbs (trees 3 and 4). These limbs appear to be infected with Coryneum canker (Seiridium cardinale). Please refer to image 2 to view tree 3.

A Monterey pine (*Pinus radiata*) was also removed from the courtyard (approximately 12 inches in diameter at grade).

This site is on the edge of the native habitat zone of Monterey cypress. The site is mid-slope on a southwest facing hill. There is a golf course adjacent to the home and ground vegetation is comprised mainly of tall grass and ice plant. Per the property owner, there was a wildland fire on this slope in 2008. This fire was stopped just downhill from the structure.



A Notice of Defensible Space Inspection (see attachment 2) was received from Cal Fire in May 2008. Several fire hazard violations were noted on this inspection report. Please note these hazards violated PRC 4291 which addresses the required defensible space around structures. These hazards were all related to dead limbs and trees within 30 feet of the home. Included in the inspection was a requirement to remove the dead cypress tree at the corner of the garage and the dead Monterey pine in the courtyard (see red arrows on attachment 2).




Image 1 Fresh cut cypress stump







Image 2 Tree 3 Note the dying and dead wood on this tree





Analysis and Testing

All observations were made from the ground. No root inspection was made and no invasive testing was done. No soil sampling or testing was conducted.

Discussion

As documented by the Cal Fire report the cypress in question and the Monterey pine were dead on May 13, 2008. Both trees (1 and 2) were large enough to be considered protected trees. Normally waivers for dead tree removal that are hazardous would be granted by both the Pebble Beach Company and the County of Monterey's Planning Department.

The other retained cypress trees (3 and 4) have been pruned to remove dead wood in the past. Both these trees will require more dead wood pruning in the future as limbs continue to die back. No long term cure for Coryneum canker is currently known. The standard practice is to remove infected and dead wood as it occurs.

Conclusions

Removal of trees 1 and 2 were required by state law. While the permitting process was not followed to the letter of the law, it is easy to see how a homeowner could become confused when dealing with three separate entities on this matter (Cal Fire, the Pebble Beach Company and the County of Monterey). At this point the best outcome will be to replace the removed trees with seed sourced stock. This stock would be from seed gathered from native trees in the area. This should help to protect the genetic makeup of the replacement trees and native forest. The replacement trees should be planted in the same general area as the removed cypress tree but as far away from the home as possible (to prevent the same problem in the future). Please refer to attachment 1 to view the planting sites (replacement sites are marked with green triangles). Due to the sandy nature of the soil at this site the replacement species should be Monterey cypress. Monterey pine would struggle to become established at this site and may become burned by the sun if planted at this site.

Recommendations

- 1) Plant two replacement Monterey cypress trees at sites indicated on the planting map (see attachment 1). These trees should come from the Pebble Beach Company's stock of native replacement trees. The replacement trees should be the largest available up to 15 gallon trees. Larger trees will have a harder time becoming established on this site and the 15 gallon trees will catch up in size in a few years. - 2) Water the trees whenever the soil dries out (once a week or so, more in summer and less in winter). Over watering and under watering are the two most frequent causes of death for planted trees.

3) Have a certified arborist or forester inspect these trees for a period of three years. Inspections should occur on an annual basis. After each inspection, a report including photos should be submitted to the Pebble Beach Company.

4) In the event that a replacement tree dies, it will need to be replaced with another cypress and monitored for three years after replacing.
