

New FDA Emergency Use Authorizations

Moderna

Ages 6 to 17 years

100 µg dose for adolescents 12 to 17

50 µg dose for children 6 to 11

Two dose series (2nd dose 4 weeks after 1st dose)

Moderna

Ages 6 months to 5 years

25 µg dose

Two dose series (2nd dose 4 weeks after 1st dose)

Pfizer

Ages 6 months to 4 years

3 µg dose

Three dose series (2nd dose 3 weeks after 1st, 3rd dose 8 weeks after 2nd)

- Primary Care Provider Offices
- Pharmacies
- Community Vaccination Clinics



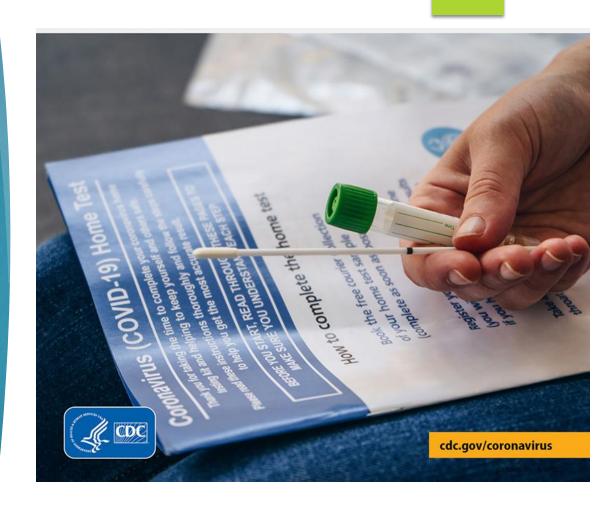








Testing and Treatment





When to Test

- ▶ If you are sick
- ▶ If you have been exposed to someone with COVID-19
- Before and after traveling
- Before and after attending large gatherings
- Before visiting a loved one in a congregate living facility (e.g., nursing home)
- As required by your employer, CalOHSA, or CDPH



Test to Treat

- There are treatments available for individuals at high risk of severe COVID-19 disease
- Treatment must be started within 5 days of symptom onset
- "Test-to-treat" expedites testing, medical provider evaluation and antiviral medication dispensing
- "Test to treat" may be offered in medical clinics, pharmacies, or testing sites
- If you are uninsured, you can get free test to treat services at the statesponsored LHI OptumServe testing sites



Risk Reduction





Strategies to Further Reduce Transmission of COVID-19

- Get vaccinated and boosted, if eligible
- Wear a face covering in indoor public settings
- Avoid large gatherings
- Wash hands frequently
- Stay home if sick
- Get tested




