RE:	Federal Accomplishments

Over the past four years, I have had the pleasure of assisting Monterey County in accomplishing many the goals set forth by the Board of Supervisors in the County's Federal Legislative Program. I have effectively advocated the County's positions on key issues both to congressional and executive branch officials. I have arranged meetings for County officials with members of the California congressional delegation and key policy makers in the Obama Administration. I have provided strategic advice to the Legislative Committee on the County's advocacy efforts for its federal priorities.

Significant matters with which I have been actively involved include the following:

- Youth Gang Violence assisted County is securing \$2 million for local gang intervention efforts; facilitated meetings for County officials with Department of Justice officials to discuss County's participation in the White House Forum on Youth Violence Prevention; facilitated and participated in meetings with County officials and the Office of the Vice President to discuss anti-gang initiatives in the County.
- **Carmel Lagoon Restoration** assisted County in securing \$500,000 from EPA for floodplain restoration; facilitated meetings between County staff and Rep. Farr's office to discuss EPA role in project; provided numerous federal and state grant opportunities to County staff to assist with project finance.
- Natividad Medical Center advised County on Medicaid funding issues related to potential change in governance structure for NMC; facilitated meetings for County staff with CMS officials to discuss Medicaid funding issues.

Highlights of more recent accomplishments include the following matters:

- Immigration Reform advised County of status of Senate and House immigration reform legislation; summarized and analyzed major provisions of Senate-passed comprehensive immigration bill (S. 744); summarized House immigration reform legislation; advised County on content of BOS resolution supporting comprehensive immigration reform; briefed County staff and local hospitality industry representatives on temporary worker provisions of S. 744; drafted letter for County to send to House Majority Whip Kevin McCarthy in support of lesser-skilled worker programs in S. 744.
- **Oil and Gas Fracking** advised County of substance and impacts of BLM's proposed rule to regulate hydraulic fracturing on federal lands; arranged meeting for County officials with Acting BLM Director to discuss impact of fracking activity in Monterey County; advised County of BLM oil

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and gas lease sales in the Monterey Shale, including Center for Biological Diversity litigation and settlement resulting in Central California EIS and statewide science review.

- **Tax Reform** advised County of legislative efforts to limit or repeal state and local taxation authority; monitored comprehensive tax reform efforts in the House and Senate; monitored legislative proposals limit or repeal tax-exempt status of municipal bonds, internet sales tax legislation, and preemption of local authority to tax wireless services; advocated County's position on municipal bond interest with congressional delegation.
- Voting Rights Act analyzed Supreme Court decision in *Shelby County v. Holder* striking down coverage formula of Voting Rights Act; advised Legislative Committee of impact on Monterey County voting procedures; assisted County with development of BOS resolution in support of Voting Rights Act; advised County of Department of Justice enforcement actions post-*Shelby*.
- State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP) advocated to congressional delegation the County's concern with the Department of Justice's proposed policy change to SCAAP to deny reimbursements for incarcerated aliens of unknown status; successfully sought inclusion of language in Senate-passed immigration bill (S. 744) to reverse DOJ policy; arranged meetings for County officials with congressional delegation to discuss concerns with DOJ proposal.
- **Tidball Store** advised County on efforts to acquire the Tidball Store property from the Army for economic development purposes; worked closely with Rep. Farr's office on legislative and administrative conveyance proposals; advocated on behalf of the County in meetings with Army officials and congressional staff; contacted GSA officials to confirm procedures for County acquisition of property at no cost.
- **Grant Opportunities** monitor all federal grant opportunities; advised County of federal grant opportunities in the areas of gang violence, youth employment, transportation, coastal habitat restoration, and community policing.
