





Long Range Pedestrian Connection

As changes to the Government Center area progress, Church Street between Gabilan Street and Howard Street is recommended to be closed to vehicular traffic and converted into a pedestrian promenade. Depicted below, the Church Street pedestrian promenade will act as an extension to the existing pedestrian space at the western end of Howard Street and further strengthen pedestrian connectivity through Sovernment Center and the other planned midblock connections to the east through the downtown area.
