AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between COUNTY OF MONTEREY, a political subdivision of the State of California, hereinafter called "COUNTY," and AUSONIO INCORPORATED, hereinafter called "CONTRACTOR." For reference purposes, the date of this Agreement is the last date opposite the respective signatures below.

COUNTY and CONTRACTOR hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1. SCOPE OF WORK

This Job Order Contract (JOC) is an indefinite quantity contract pursuant to which CONTRACTOR will perform a variety of Job Orders, consisting of specific construction tasks. The scope of this JOC is for general construction, repair, remodel and other repetitive related Work. COUNTY has published a Construction Task Catalog® (CTC) containing a series of construction tasks with preset Unit Prices. The CTC was developed using experienced labor and high quality materials. All Unit Prices are based on local labor, material and equipment prices including the current prevailing wages. CONTRACTOR will bid Adjustment Factors to be applied to the Unit Prices. The price of an individual Job Order will be determined by multiplying the preset Unit Prices and the appropriate quantities by the appropriate Adjustment Factor.

The scope of work for this Contract will be determined by the Detailed Scopes of Work issued in connection with individual Job Orders. The Scope of Work (SOW), for each Job Order will be explained to CONTRACTOR at a Joint Scope Meeting. COUNTY will provide a Request for Job Order Proposal and Detailed SOW to CONTRACTOR. CONTRACTOR will be required to review the Detailed SOW and develop a Price Proposal using appropriate tasks, quantities and the applicable Adjustment Factor. COUNTY will review CONTRACTOR's Proposal in detail and if found to be reasonable and acceptable, a Job Order may be issued. The agreed-upon price will be fixed price for the performance of the Detailed SOW.

CONTRACTOR shall, within the time stipulated, perform the contract checked below as herein defined and shall furnish all Work, labor, equipment, transportation, material, and services to construct and complete in a good, expeditious, workmanlike, and substantial manner, the project:

ARTICLE 2. TIME FOR START AND COMPLETION

Contract Time commences upon the written execution of the Contract by COUNTY and shall end either one year from the date signed by COUNTY or upon the payment by COUNTY to CONTRACTOR of the maximum amount payable under this Agreement, whichever occurs earlier. COUNTY will not issue any new Job Orders after the expiration of this Agreement. Any Job Order authorized prior to the expiration of the Agreement must be completed within the

time specified in the Job Order. In the event the scheduled completion for any Job Order extends beyond the term of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR and COUNTY agree that the terms of this Agreement shall continue in effect and be applicable for such Job Orders. A separate Job Order Notice to Proceed (NTP) will be issued for each Job Order. Each Job Order will specify a time limit for completion as stated on the Job Order NTP.

ARTICLE 3. ADJUSTMENT FACTORS

CONTRACTOR shall perform all Work required, necessary, proper for, or incidental to completing the Detailed SOW called for in each individual Job Order issued pursuant to this Contract for the Unit Prices set forth in the CTC. COUNTY shall pay CONTRATOR the Job Order Price for completion of Work in accordance with Contract Documents and the Detailed SOW described in each Job Order multiplied by the following Adjustment Factors:

ADJUSTMENT FACTORS

The Minimum Contract Value is \$25,000. CONTRACTOR will receive Job Orders totaling at least \$25,000 during the Contract term. The Maximum Contract Value is \$4,766,357 for the JOC FACILITIES

2017-01 or

2017-02 or

2017-03. COUNTY does not guarantee CONTRACTOR will receive this volume of Work. COUNTY may award contracts or issue Job Orders to other contractors for the same or similar Work during the term of this Agreement. In no event will CONTRACTOR be issued Job Orders which, in total, exceed the Maximum Contract Value. At no time may the sum of the outstanding Job Orders exceed the amount of the Payment Bond and Performance Bond. A Job Order is outstanding until COUNTY has accepted the Work described in the Job Order by recordation of a Notice of Completion. CONTRACTOR will not be issued Job Orders which in total exceed the Maximum Contract Value.

ARTICLE 4. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

COUNTY and CONTRACTOR recognize that time is of the essence of this Agreement and that County will suffer financial loss, if all or any part of the Work is not completed within the time specified in the Job Order, plus any extensions thereof. Accordingly, COUNTY and CONTRACTOR agree that liquidated damages for delay will be established by COUNTY for each Job Order. CONTRACTOR shall pay COUNTY the dollar amount stipulated in the Job Order for each day that expires after the time specified therein for CONTRACTOR to achieve

Completion.

These measures of liquidated damages shall apply cumulatively and except as provided below, shall be presumed to be the damages suffered by COUNTY resulting from delay in completion of the Work.

Liquidated damages for delay shall only cover project administrative (such as Project management and consultant expenses) and cost damages suffered by COUNTY as a result of delay. Liquidated damages shall not cover the cost of completion of the Work, damages resulting from Defective Work, lost revenues or costs of substitute facilities, or damages suffered by others who then seek to recover their damages from COUNTY (for example, delay claims of other contractors, subcontractors, tenants, or other third-parties), and defense costs thereof.

ARTICLE 5. NOTIFICATION OF THIRD-PARTY CLAIMS

COUNTY shall notify CONTRACTOR of the receipt of any third-party claim relating to the contract and is entitled to recover its reasonable costs incurred in providing the notification as provided in Public Contract Code Section 9201.

Only those "autos" that are land vehicles and that would qualify under the definition of "mobile equipment" under this policy if they were not subject to a compulsory or financial responsibility law or other motor vehicle insurance law where they are licensed or principally garaged.

B. Owned Autos You Acquire After The Policy Bealins

- If Symbols 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 or 19 are entered next to a coverage in item Two of the Declarations, then you have coverage for "autos" that you acquire of the type described for the remainder of the policy period.
- But, if Symbol 7 is entered next to a coverage in item Two of the Declarations, an "auto" you acquire will be a covered "auto" for that coverage only it:
 - a. We already cover all "autos" that you own for that coverage or it replaces an "auto" you previously owned that had that coverage; and
 - b. You tell us within 30 days after you acquire it that you want us to cover it for that coverage.

C. Cartain Trailers, Mobile Equipment And Temporary Substitute Autos

If Liability Coverage is provided by this coverage form, the following types of vehicles are also covered "autos" for Liability Coverage:

- "Trailers" with a load capacity of 2,000 pounds or less designed primarily for travel on public roads.
- "Mobile equipment" white being carried or towed by a covered "auto."
- Any "auto" you do not own while used with the permission of its owner as a temporary substitute for a covered "auto" you own that is out of service because of its:
 - a. Breakdown:
 - b. Repair;
 - e. Berviolng;
 - d. "Loss": or
 - Destruction.

SECTION II -- LIABILITY COVERAGE

A. Coverage

We will pay ail aums an "insured" legally must pay as damages because of "bodily injury" or "property damage" to which this insurance applies, caused by an "accident" and resulting from the ownership, maintenance or use of a covered "auto."

We will also pay all sums an "insured" legally must pay as a "covered poliution cost or expense" to which this insurance applies, caused by an "accident" and resulting from the ownership, maintenance or use of covered "autos." However, we will only pay for the "covered pollution cost or expense" if there is either "bodily higury" or "properly damage" to which this insurance applies that is caused by the same "accident."

We have the right and duty to defend any "insured" against a "suit" asking for such damages or a "covered pollution cost or expense." However, we have no duty to defend any "insured" against a "suit" seeking damages for "bodily injury" or "property damage" or a "covered pollution cost or expense" to which this insurance does not apply. We may investigate and settle any claim or "suit" as we consider appropriate. Our duty to defend or settle ends when the Liability Coverage Limit of insurance has been exhausted by payment of judgments or settlements.

1. Who is An Insured

The following are "insureds":

- a. You for any covered "auto."
- Anyone else while using with your permission a covered "auto" you own, hire or borrow except:
 - (1) The owner or anyone else from whom you hire or borrow a covered "auto."

This exception does not apply if the covared "auto" is a "trailer" connected to a covered "auto" you own.

- (2) Your "amployee" if the covered "auto" is owned by that "amployee" or a member of his or her household.
- (3) Someone using a covered "auto" while he or she is working in a business of selling, servicing, repairing, parking or storing "autos" unless that business is yours.
- (4) Anyone other than your "employees," partners (if you are a partnership), members (if you are a limited fiability company) or a lessee or borrower or any of their "employees," while moving property to or from a covered "auto."
- (5) A partner (if you are a partnership) or a member (if you are a limited liability company) for a covered "auto" owned by him or her or a member of his or her household.
- Anyone liable for the conduct of an "insured" described above but only to the extent of that liability.

2. Coverage Extensions

a. Supplementary Payments

We will pay for the "insured":

- (1) All expenses we incur.
- (2) Up to \$2,000 for cost of ball bonds (including bonds for related traffic law violations) required because of an "accident" we cover, We do not have to furnish these bonds.
- (3) The cost of bonds to release attachments in any "suit" against the "insured" we defend, but only for bond amounts within our Limit of insurance.
- (4) All reasonable expanses incurred by the "insured" at our request, including actual lose of earnings up to \$250 a day because of time off from work.
- (5) All court costs taxed against the "insured" we in any "cuit" against the "insured" we defend. However, these payments do not include attorneys' fees or afterneys' expenses taxed egainst the "insured."
- (6) All interest on the full amount of any judgment that accrues after entry of the judgment in any "cuit" against the "insured" we defend, but our duty to pay interest ends when we have paid, offered to pay or deposited in court the part of the judgment that is within our Limit of Insurance.

These payments will not reduce the Limit of Insurance.

b. Out-of-state Coverage Extensions

While a covered "auto" is away from the state where it is licensed we will:

- (1) increase the Limit of incurance for Liability Coverage to meet the limits specified by a compulsory or tinancial responsibility law of the jurisdiction where the covered "auto" is being used. This extension does not apply to the limit or limits specified by any law governing motor carriers of passengers or property.
- (2) Provide the minimum amounts and types of other coverages, such as no-fault, required of out-of-state vehicles by the jurisdiction where the covered "auto" is being used.

We will not pay anyone more than once for the same elements of loss because of these extensions.

B. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to any of the following:

1. Expected Or Intended Injury

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" expected or intended from the standpoint of the "insured."

2. Contractual

Liability assumed under any contract or acroement.

But this exclusion does not apply to liability for damages:

- Assumed in a contract or agreement that is en "insured contract" provided the "bodily injury" or "property damage" occurs subsequent to the execution of the contract or agreement; or
- b. That the "insured" would have in the absence of the contract or agreement.

3. Workers' Compensation

Any obligation for which the "insured" or the "insured"s' insured may be held liable under any workers' compensation, disability benefits or unemployment compensation law or any similar law.

4. Employee Indemnification And Employer's Liability

"Bodily injury" to:

- An "employee" of the "insured" arising out of and in the course of:
 - (1) Employment by the "insured"; or
 - (2) Performing the duties related to the conduct of the "insured"s" business; or
- b. The spouse, child, parent, brother or sister of that "employee" as a consequence of Paragraph a. above.

This exclusion applies:

- (1) Whether the "insured" may be liable as an employer or in any other capacity; and
- (2) To any obligation to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages because of the injury.

But this exclusion does not apply to "bodily injury" to domestic "employees" not entitled to workers' compansation benefits or to liability assumed by the "insured" under an "insured contract." For the purposes of the coverage form, a domestic "employee" is a person engaged in household or domestic work performed principally in connection with a residence premises.

5. Fellow Employee

"Bodily injury" to:

- a. Any fellow "employee" of the "insured" arising out of and in the course of the fellow "employee's" employment or while performing duties related to the conduct of your business; or
- b. The spouse, child, parent, brother or sister of that fellow "employee" as a consequence of Paragraph a. above.

6. Care, Custody Or Control

"Property damage" to or "covered pollution cost or expense" involving property owned or transported by the "insured" or in the "insured"s' care, custody or control. But this exclusion does not apply to liability assumed under a sidetrack agreement.

7. Handling Of Property

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" resulting from the handling of property:

 Before it is moved from the place where it is accepted by the "insured" for movement into or onto the covered "auto"; or b. After it is moved from the covered 'auto' to the place where it is finally delivered by the "insured."

8. Movement Of Property By Mechanical Device

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" resulting from the movement of property by a mechanical device (other than a hand truck) unless the device is attached to the covered "auto."

9. Operations

Bodily injury or "property damage" arising out of the operation of:

- a. Any equipment listed in Paragraphs 6.b. and 6.c. of the definition of "mobile equipment"; or
- b. Machinery or equipment that is on, attached to or part of a tand vehicle that would qualify under the definition of "mobile equipment" if it were not subject to a compulsory or financial responsibility law or other motor vehicle insurance law where it is licensed or principally garaged.

10. Completed Operations

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of your work after that work has been completed or abandoned.

in this exclusion, your work means:

- Work or operations performed by you or on your behalf; and
- Materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations.

Your work includes warranties or representations made at any time with respect to the fitness, quality, durability or performance of any of the items included in Paragraph a. or b. above.

Your work will be deemed completed at the aarliest of the following times:

- (1) When all of the work called for in your contract has been completed.
- (2) When all of the work to be done at the site has been completed if your contract calls for work at more than one site.
- (3) When that part of the work done at a job site has been put to its intended use by any person or organization other than another contractor or subcontractor working on the same project.

Work that may need service, maintenance, correction, repair or replacement, but which is atterwise complete, will be treated as completed.

11. Poliution

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of the actual, alleged or threatened discharge, dispersel, seepage, migration, release or secupe of "pollutants";

- That are, or that are contained in any property that is:
 - (1) Being transported or towed by, handled or handled for movement into, onto or from the covered "auto";
 - (2) Otherwise in the course of transit by or on behalf of the "insured"; or
 - (3) Being stored, disposed of, treated or processed in or upon the covered "auto";
- b. Before the "pollutants" or any property in which the "pollutants" are contained are moved from the place where they are accepted by the "insured" for movement into or onto the covered "auto"; or
- c. After the "pollutants" or any property in which the "pollutants" are contained are moved from the covered "auto" to the place where they are finally delivered, disposed of or abandoned by the "insured."

Paragraph a. shove does not apply to fuels, lubricants, fluids, exhaust gases or other similar "pollutants" that are needed for or result from the normal electrical, hydraulic or machanical functioning of the covered "auto" or its parts, it:

- (1) The "pollutants" escape, seep, migrate or are discharged, dispersed or released directly from an "auto" part designed by its manufacturer to hold, store, receive or dispose of such "pollutants"; and
- (2) The "bodily injury," "property damage" or "covered pollution cost or expense" does not arise out of the operation of any equipment listed in Paragraphs 6.b. and 6.c. of the definition of "mobile equipment."

Paragraphs b. and c. above of this exclusion do not apply to "accidents" that occur away from premises owned by or rented to an "insured" with respect to "pollutants" not in or upon a covered "auto" if:

- (a) The "pollutants" or any property in which the "pollutants" are contained are upset, overturned or damaged as a result of the maintenance or use of a covered "auto"; and
- (b) The discharge, dispersal, seepage, migration, release or escape of the "pollutants" is caused directly by such upeat, overturn or damage.

12. Was

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising directly or indirectly out of:

- a. War, including undeclared or civil war;
- b. Warlike action by a military force, including action in hindering or defending against an actual or expected attack, by any government, sowereign or other authority using military personnel or other agents; or
- Insurrection, rebellion, revolution, usurped power or action taken by governmental authority in hindering or defending against any of these.

18. Recine

Covered "autos" while used in any professional or organized racing or demolition contest or stunting activity, or while practicing for such contest or activity. This insurance also does not apply while that covered "auto" is being prepared for such a contest or activity.

C. Limit Of Insurance

Regardless of the number of covered "autos," "insureds," premiums paid, claims made or vahides involved in the "accident," the most we will pay for the total of all damages and "covered pollution cost or expones" combined resulting from any one "accident" is the Limit of Insurance for Liability Coverage shown in the Declarations.

All "bodily injury," "property damage" and "covered poliution cost or expense" resulting from continuous or repealed exposure to substantially the same conditions will be considered as resulting from one "accident."

No one will be entitled to receive duplicate payments for the same elements of "loss" under this coverage form and any Medical Payments Coverage endorsement, Uninsured Motorists Coverage endorsement or Underinsured Motorists Coverage endorsement stacked to this Coverage Part.

SECTION III -- PHYSICAL DAMAGE COVERAGE

A. Coverage

 We will pay for "loss" to a covered "auto" or its equipment under;

a. Comprehensive Coverage

From any cause except:

- The covered "auto's" collision with another object; or
- (2) The covered "auto's" overturn.

b. Specified Causes Of Loss Coverage

Caused by:

- (1) Fire, lightning or explosion;
- (2) Theft:
- (3) Windstorm, hall or earthquake;
- (4) Flood:
- (5) Mischief or vandalism; or
- (6) The sinking, burning, collision or derailment of any conveyance transporting the covered "auto."

c. Collision Coverage

Caused by:

- The covered "auto's" collision with another object; or
- (2) The covered "auto's" overturn.

2. Towing

We will pay up to the limit shown in the Declarations for towing and labor coels incurred each time a covered "auto" of the private passenger type is disabled. However, the labor must be performed at the place of disablement.

Glass Breakage -- Hitting A Bird Or Animal --Falling Objects Or Missiles

If you carry Comprehensive Coverage for the damaged covered "auto," we will pay for the following under Comprehensive Coverage:

- a. Glass breakage:
- b. "Loss" caused by hitting a bird or animal; and
- e. "Loss" caused by falling objects or missiles.

However, you have the option of having glass breakage caused by a covered "auto's" collision or overturn considered a "less" under Collision Coverage.

4. Coverage Extensions

a. Transportation Expanses

We will pay up to \$20 per day to a maximum of \$600 for temporary transportation expense incurred by you because of the total theft of a covered "auto" of the private passenger type. We will pay only for those covered "autos" for which you carry either Comprehensive or Specified Causes Of Loss Coverage. We will pay for temporary transportation expenses incurred during the period beginning 48 hours after the theft and ending, regardless of the policy's expiration, when the covered "auto" is returned to use or we pay for its "loss."

Loss Of Use Expenses

For Hirad Auto Physical Damage, we will pay expanses for which an "insured" becomes tegally responsible to pay for lose of use of a vehicle rented or hirad without a driver under a written rental contract or agreement. We will pay for lose of use expenses if caused by:

- (1) Other than colleton only if the Declarations indicate that Comprehensive Coverage is provided for any covered "auto":
- (2) Specified Causes Of Loss only if the Declarations indicate that Specified Causes Of Loss Coverage is provided for any covered "auto"; or
- (3) Collision only if the Declarations Indicate that Collision Coverage is provided for any covered "auto."

However, the most we will pay for any expenses for loss of use is \$20 per day, to a maximum of \$600.

B. Exclusions

 We will not pay for "loss" caused by or resulting from any of the following. Such "loss" is excluded regardless of any other cause or event that contributes concurrently or in any sequence to the "loss."

a. Nuclear Hazard

- The explosion of any weapon employing atomic fission or fusion; or
- (2) Nuclear reaction or radiation, or radioactive contamination, however caused.

b. War Or Military Action

- (1) War, including undeclared or civil war:
- (2) Warlike action by a military force, including action in hindering or defending against an actual or expected attack, by any government, acverage or other authority using military personnel or other agents;
- (3) Insurrection, rebellion, revolution, usurped power or action taken by governmental authority in hindering or detending against any of these.
- 2. We will not pay for "loss" to any covered "auto" while used in any professional or organized racing or demolition contest or stunting activity, or while practicing for such contest or activity. We will also not pay for "loss" to any covered "auto" while that covered "auto" is being prepared for such a contest or activity.
- 3. We will not pay for "loss" due and confined to:
 - Wear and tear, freezing, mechanical or electrical breakdown.
 - Blowouts, punctures or other road damage to time.

This sectusion does not apply to such "loss" resulting from the total theft of a covered "auto,"

- 4. We will not pay for "lose" to any of the following:
 - a. Tapes, records, discs or other similar sudio, visual or data electronic devices designed for use with audio, visual or data electronic equipment.
 - b. Any device designed or used to detect speedmeasuring equipment such as radar or laser detectors and any jamming apparatus intended to elude or disrupt speedmeasurement equipment.
 - e. Any electronic equipment, without regard to whether this equipment is permanently installed, that reproduces, receives or transmits audio, visual or data signals.
 - d. Any accessories used with the electronic equipment described in Paragraph c. above.
- 5. Exclusions 4.c. and 4.d. do not apply to equipment designed to be operated solely by use of the power from the "auto's" electrical system that, at the time of "lose," is:
 - Permanently installed in or upon the covered "auto":

- Flamovable from a housing unit which is permanently installed in or upon the covered "auto";
- An integral part of the same unit housing any electronic equipment described in Paragraphs
 and b. above; or
- d. Necessary for the normal operation of the covered "auto" or the monitoring of the covered "auto's" operating system.
- We will not pay for "loss" to a covered "auto" due to "diminution in vakue."

C. Limit Of Innurance

- The most we will pay for "lose" in any one "accident" is the lesser of:
 - The actual cash value of the damaged or stolen property as of the time of the "loss"; or
 - The cost of repairing or replacing the damaged or stolen property with other property of like kind and quality.
- \$1,000 is the most we will pay for "loss" in any one "eccident" to all electronic equipment that reproduces, receives or transmits audio, visual or data algrais which, at the time of "loss," is:
 - Permanently installed in or upon the covered "auto" in a housing, opening or other location that is not normally used by the "auto" manufacturer for the installation of such equipment;
 - Removable from a permanently installed housing unit as described in Paragraph 2.e. above or is an integral part of that equipment; or
 - c. An integral part of such equipment,
- 8. An adjustment for depreciation and physical condition will be made in determining actual cash value in the event of a total "loss."
- If a repair or replacement results in belter than like kind or quality, we will not pay for the amount of the betterment.

D. Deductible

For each covered "auto," our ubligation to pay for, repair, return or replace damaged or stolen properly will be reduced by the applicable deductible shown in the Declarations. Any Comprehensive Coverage deductible shown in the Declarations does not apply to "loss" caused by fire or lightning.

BECTION IV -- BUSINESS AUTO CONDITIONS

The following conditions apply in addition to the Common Policy Conditions:

A. Loss Conditions

1. Appreient For Physical Damage Loss

if you and we disagree on the amount of "loss," either may demand an appraisal of the "loss," in this event, each party will select a competent appraiser. The two appreisers will select a competent and impartial umpire. The appraisers will state separately the actual cash value and amount of "loss," If they fail to agree, they will aubmit their differences to the umpire. A decision agreed to by any two will be binding. Each party will:

- e. Pay its chosen appraiser; and
- Bear the other expenses of the appraisel and umbire equally.

If we submit to an appraisal, we will still retain our right to deny the claim.

2. Duties in The Event Of Accident, Claim, Suit Or Loss

We have no duty to provide coverage under this policy unless there has been full compliance with the following duties:

- in the event of "accident," claim, "suit" or "loss," you must give us or our authorized representative prompt notice of the "accident" or "loss." include:
 - (1) How, when and where the "accident" or "loss" occurred;
 - (2) The "insured's" name and address; and
 - (3) To the extent possible, the names and addresses of any injured persons and witnesses.
- Additionally, you and any other involved "insured" must:
 - (1) Assume no obligation, make no payment or incur no expense without our consent, except at the "insured's" own cost.
 - (2) Immediately send us copies of any request, demand, order, notice, summons or legal paper received concerning the claim or "suit."
 - (3) Cooperate with us in the investigation or settlement of the claim or detense against the 'suit."
 - (4) Authorize us to obtain medical records or other pertinent information.

- (5) Submit to examination, at our expense, by physicians of our choice, as often as we reasonably require.
- if there is "loss" to a covered "auto" or its equipment you must also do the following;
 - (1) Promptly notify the police if the covered "auto" or any of its equipment is stolen.
 - (2) Take all reasonable steps to protect the covered "auto" from further damage. Also keep a record of your expenses for consideration in the settlement of the claim.
 - (8) Permit us to inspect the covered "auto" and records proving the "less" before its repair or disposition.
 - (4) Agree to examinations under oath at our request and give us a signed statement of your answers.

3. Legal Action Against Us

No one may bring a legal action against us under this coverage form until:

- a. There has been full compliance with all the terms of this coverage form; and
- b. Under Liability Coverage, we agree in writing that the "insured" has an obligation to pay or until the amount of that obligation has finally been determined by judgment after trial. No one has the right under this policy to bring us into an action to determine the "insured's" liability.

4. Loss Payment - Physical Damage Coverages

At our option we may:

- Pay for, repair or replace damaged or stolen property;
- b. Return the stolen property, at our expense. We will pay for any damage that results to the "auto" from the theft; or
- Take all or any part of the damaged or stolen properly at an agreed or appraised value.

If we pay for the "loss," our payment will include the applicable sales tax for the damaged or stolen property.

5. Transfer Of Rights Of Recovery Against Others To Us

if any person or organization to or for whom we make payment under this coverage form has rights to recover demages from another, those rights are transferred to us. That person or organization must do everything necessary to secure our rights and must do nothing after "accident" or "loss" to impair them.

1. Benkruptcy

Bankruptcy or insolvency of the "insured" or the "insured's" estate will not relieve us of any obligations under this coverage form.

2. Composiment, Misrepresentation Or Fraud

This coverage form is void in any case of freud by you at any time as it relates to this coverage form. It is also void if you or any other "insured," at any time, intentionally conceal or misrepresent a material fact concerning:

- a. This coverage form;
- b. The covered "auto";
- c. Your interest in the covered "auto"; or
- d. A claim under this coverage form.

3. Uberalization

If we revise this coverage form to provide more coverage without additional premium charge, your policy will automatically provide the additional coverage as of the day the revision is effective in your state.

4. No Benefit To Bailes - Physical Damage Coverages

We will not recognize any assignment or grant any coverage for the benefit of any person or organization holding, storing or transporting property for a fee regardless of any other provision of this coverage form.

5. Other insurance

- a. Fer any covered "auto" you own, this severage form provides primary insurance, For any covered "auto" you don't own, the insurance provided by this coverage form is excess over any other collectible insurance. However, while a covered "auto" which is a "trailer" is connected to another vehicle, the Lieblity Coverage this coverage form exceptions for the "trailer" is:
 - (1) Excess while it is connected to a motor vehicle you do not own.
 - [2] Primary while it is connected to a covered "auto" you own.
- b. Fer Hirad Auto Physical Damage Coverage, any covered "auto" you lease, hira, rent or herrow is deemed to be a covered "auto" you gwn. However, any "auto" that is leased, hirad, rented or borrowed with a driver is not a severed "auto."
- Regardless of the provisions of Paragraph a. above, this covarage form's Liability Coverage is primary for any liability assumed under an "insured contract."

d. When this coverage form and any other coverage form or policy covers on the same basis, either excess or primary, we will pay only our share. Our share is the proportion that the Limit of insurance of our coverage form bears to the total of the limits of all the coverage forms and policies covering on the same basis.

6. Prembun Audit

- a. The estimated premium for this coverage form is based on the exposures you told us you would have when this policy began. We will compute the final premium due when we determine your actual exposures. The estimated total premium will be credited against the final premium due and the first Named insured will be billed for the balance, if any. The due date for the final premium or retrospective premium is the date shown as the due date on the bill. If the estimated total premium exceeds the final premium due, the first Named Insured will get a refund.
- b. If this policy is issued for more than one year, the premium for this coverage form will be computed annually based on our rates or premiums in effect at the beginning of each year of the policy.

7. Policy Pariod, Coverage Territory

Under this coverage form, we cover "accidents" and "tosses" occurring:

- During the policy period shown in the Declarations: and
- b. Within the coverage territory.

The coverage territory is:

- (1) The United States of America;
- (2) The territories and possessions of the United States of America;
- (3) Puerto Rico;
- (4) Canada; and
- (5) Anywhere in the world if:
 - (a) A covered "auto" of the private passenger type is leased, hired, rented or borrowed without a driver for a period of 30 days or less; and
 - (b) The "insured's" responsibility to pay damages is determined in a "suit" on the merits, in the United States of America, the territories and possessions of the United States of America, Puerto Rico or Canada or in a settlement we agree to.

Primary

Wording

We also cover "loss" to, or "accidents" involving, a covered "auto" while being transported between any of these places.

Two Or More Coverage Forms Or Policies leaved By Us

if this coverage form and any other coverage form or policy issued to you by us or any company affiliated with us applies to the same "accident," the aggregate maximum Limit of insurance under all the coverage forms or policies shall not exceed the highest applicable Limit of inaurance under any one coverage form or policy. This condition does not apply to any coverage form or policy issued by us or an affiliated company specifically to apply as excess insurance over this coverage form.

SECTION V - DEFINITIONS

- A. "Accident" includes continuous or repeated exposure to the same conditions resulting in "bodily injury" or "property damage."
- B. 'Auto' means:
 - A tand motor vehicle, "traiter" or semitrailer designed for travel on public roads; or
 - Any other land vehicle that is subject to a compulsory or financial responsibility law or other motor vehicle insurance law where it is licensed or principally garaged.

However, "auto" does not include "mobile equipment."

- C. "Bodity injury" means bodity injury, sickness or disease sustained by a person including death resulting from any of these.
- D. "Covered pollution cost or expense" means any cost or expense arising out of:
 - Any request, demand, order or statutory or regulatory requirement that any "insured" or others test for, monitor, clean up, remove, contain, treat, detodly or neutralize, or in any way respond to, or assess the effects of, "pollutants"; or
 - Any claim or "suit" by or on behalf of a
 governmental authority for damages because of
 testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing,
 containing, treating, detorthying or neutralizing, or
 in any way responding to, or assessing the
 effects of, "pollutants."

"Covered poliution cost or expense" does not include any cost or expense arising out of the actual, alieged or threatened discharge, dispersal, seepage, migration, release or escape of "poliutants";

- a. That are, or that are contained in any property that is:
 - (1) Being transported or towed by, handled or handled for movement into, onto or from the covered "auto";
 - (2) Otherwise in the course of transit by or on behalf of the "insured"; or
 - (8) Being stored, disposed of, treated or processed in or upon the covered "auto";
- b. Before the "pollutants" or any property in which the "pollutants" are contained are moved from the place where they are accepted by the "insured" for movement into or onto the covered "auto"; or

- (2) The "bodily injury," "property damage" or "coverad poliution cost or expense" does not arise out of the operation of any equipment listed in Paragraph 6.b. or 6.c. of the definition of "mobile equipment."

Paragraphs is. and o. above do not apply to "accidents" that occur away from premises owned by or rented to an "insured" with respect to "poliularits" not in or upon a covered "auto" if:

- (a) The "pollutents" or any property in which the "pollutents" are contained are upout, overturned or damaged as a result of the maintenance or use of a covered "auto"; and
- (b) The discharge, dispersal, seepage, migration, release or escape of the "pollutants" is caused directly by such upset, overturn or damage.
- E. "Diminition in value" means the actual or perceived loss in market value or resale value which results from a direct and accidental "loss."
- F. "Employee" includes a "leased worker." "Employee" does not include a "temporary worker."
- G. "Insured" means any person or organization qualifying as an insured in the Who is An insured provision of the applicable coverage. Except with respect to the Limit of insurance, the coverage afforded applies separately to each insured who is seaking coverage or against whom a claim or "sulf" is brought.
- H. "Insured contract" means:
 - 1. A lease of premises;
 - 2. A sidetrack agreement;
 - Any casement or license agreement, except in connection with construction or demolition operations on or within 50 feet of a railroad;
 - An obligation, as required by ordinance, to indemnify a municipality, except in connection with work for a municipality;
 - 5. That part of any other contract or agreement pertaining to your business (including an indemnification of a municipality in connection with work performed for a municipality) under which you assume the tort liability of another to pay for "bodily injury" or "property damage" to a third party or organization. Tort liability means a sability that would be imposed by law in the absence of any contract or agreement;
 - 6. That part of any contract or agreement entered into, as part of your business, partsiring to the rental or lease, by you or any of your "employees," of any "auto." However, such contract or agreement shall not be considered an "insurad contract" to the extent that it obligates you or any of your "employees" to pay for "property damage" to any "auto" rented or leased by you or any of your "employees."

An "insured contract" does not include that part of any contract or agreement:

- a. That indemnifiee a ratiroad for "bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of construction or demolition operations, within 50 feet of any ratiroad property and affecting any ratiroad bridge or treatle, tracks, roadbeds, tunnel, underpass or crossing;
- is. That pertains to the loan, lease or rental of an "auto" to you or any of your "employees," if the "auto" is loaned, teased or rented with a driver; or
- c. That holds a person or organization engaged in the business of transporting property by "auto" for hire harmless for your use of a covered "auto" over a route or territory that person or organization is authorized to serve by public authority.
- I. "Leased worker" means a person leased to you by a labor leasing firm under an agreement between you and the labor leasing firm to perform dulies related to the conduct of your business. "Leased worker" does not include a "temporary worker."
- "Loss" means direct and accidental loss or damage.
- K. "Mobile equipment" means any of the following types of land vehicles, including any attached machinery or aculoment:
 - Buildozers, farm muchinery, forklifts and other vehicles designed for use principally off public roads:
 - Vehicles maintained for use solely on or next to premises you own or rent;
 - Vehicles that travel on crewier treads:
 - Vehicles, whether self-propelled or not, maintained primarily to provide mobility to permanently mounted:
 - Power cranes, shovels, loaders, diggers or drills; or
 - Road construction or resurfacing equipment such as graders, scrapers or rollers;
 - Vehicles not described in Paragraph 1., 2., 3. or 4. above that are not self-propelled and are maintained primarily to provide mobility to permanently attached equipment of the following types;
 - a. Air compressors, pumps and generators, including spraying, welding, building cleaning, geophysical exploration, lighting and wellservicing equipment; or
 - Cherry pickers and siraliar devices used to raise or lower workers; or

- 6. Vehicles not described in Paragraph 1., 2., 3. or 4. above maintained primarily for purposes other than the transportation of persons or cargo. However, self-propelled vehicles with the following types of permanently attached equipment are not "mobile equipment" but will be considered "autos":
 - a. Equipment designed primarily for:
 - (1) Snow removal:
 - (2) Road maintenance, but not construction or resurfacing; or
 - (3) Street cleaning:
 - b. Cherry pickers and similar devices mounted on automobile or truck chasels and used to raise or lower workers; and
 - Air compressors, pumps and generators, including spraying, welding, building cleaning, geophysical exploration, lighting or wellservicing equipment.

However, "mobile equipment" does not include land vehicles that are subject to a compulsory or financial responsibility law or other motor vehicle insurance law where it is ilcensed or principally garaged. i... "Pollutanto" means any solid, liquid, gaseous or thermal irritant or contaminant, including emoke, vapor, soot, furnes, acids, alkalis, chemicals and waste. Waste includes materials to be recycled, reconditioned or reciaimed.

- M. "Property damage" means damage to or loss of use of tangible property.
- M. "Suit" means a civil proceeding in which:
 - Damages because of "bodily Injury" or "property damage"; or
 - 2. A "covered poliution cost or expense";

to which this insurance applies, are alteged.

'Suit' Includes:

- An arbitration proceeding in which auch damages or "covered pollution costs or expenses" are claimed and to which the "insured" must submit or does submit with our consent; or
- b. Any other alternative dispute resolution proceeding in which such damages or "covered potation costs or expenses" are claimed and to which the insured submits with our consent.
- O. "Temporary worker" means a person who is furnished to you to substitute for a parmenent "employee" on leave or to meet seasonal or shorttern workload conditions.
- P. "Trailer" includes comitralier.

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY COVERAGE PART

It is understood and agreed as follows:

- The WHO IS AN INSURED section is amended to add as an Insured any person or organization whom the Named Insured is required by written contract to add as an additional insured on this coverage part, including any such person or organization, if any, specifically set forth on the Schedule attachment to this endorsement. However, such person or organization is an Insured only with respect to such person or organization's liability for:
 - A. unless paragraph B. below applies,
 - bodily injury, property damage, or personal and advertising injury caused in whole or in part by the
 acts or omissions by or on behalf of the Named Insured and in the performance of such Named
 Insured's ongoing operations as specified in such written contract; or
 - 2. bodily injury or property damage caused in whole or in part by your work and included in the products-completed operations hazard, and only if
 - a. the written contract requires the Named Insured to provide the additional insured such coverage;
 and
 - b, this coverage part provides such coverage.
 - B. bodily injury, property damage, or personal and advertising injury arising out of your work described in such written contract, but only if:
 - 1. this coverage part provides coverage for bodily injury or property damage included within the products completed operations hazard; and
 - 2. the written contract specifically requires the Named Insured to provide additional insured coverage under the 11-85 or 10-01 edition of CG2010 or the 10-01 edition of CG2037.
- II. Subject always to the terms and conditions of this policy, including the limits of insurance, the Insurer will not provide such additional insured with:
 - A. coverage broader than required by the written contract; or
 - B. a higher limit of insurance than required by the written contract.
- III. The insurance granted by this endorsement to the additional insured does not apply to **bodily Injury**, **property** damage, or personal and advertising injury arising out of:
 - A. the rendering of, or the failure to render, any professional architectural, engineering, or surveying services, including:
 - 1. the preparing, approving, or failing to prepare or approve maps, shop drawings, opinions, reports, surveys, field orders, change orders or drawings and specifications; and
 - 2. supervisory, inspection, architectural or engineering activities; or
 - B. any premises or work for which the additional insured is specifically listed as an additional insured on another endorsement attached to this coverage part.
- IV. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the section entitled COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY CONDITIONS, the Condition entitled Other Insurance, this insurance is excess of all other insurance available to the additional insured whether on a primary, excess, contingent or any other basis. However, if this insurance

is required by written contract to be primary and non-contributory, this insurance will be primary and noncontributory relative solely to insurance on which the additional insured is a named insured.

V. Solely with respect to the insurance granted by this endorsement, the section entitled COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY CONDITIONS is amended as follows:

The Condition entitled Dutles In The Event of Occurrence, Offense, Claim or Suit is amended with the addition of the following:

Any additional insured pursuant to this endorsement will as soon as practicable:

- give the Insurer written notice of any claim, or any occurrence or offense which may result in a claim;
- 2. except as provided in Paragraph IV. of this endorsement, agree to make available any other insurance the additional insured has for any loss covered under this coverage part;
- 3. send the Insurer copies of all legal papers received, and otherwise cooperate with the Insurer in the investigation, defense, or settlement of the claim; and
- 4. tender the defense and indemnity of any claim to any other insurer or self insurer whose policy or program applies to a loss that the Insurer covers under this coverage part. However, if the written contract requires this insurance to be primary and non-contributory, this paragraph (4) does not apply to Insurance on which the additional insured is a named insured.

The Insurer has no duty to defend or indemnify an additional insured under this endorsement until the Insurer receives written notice of a claim from the additional insured.

VI. Solely with respect to the insurance granted by this endorsement, the section entitled DEFINITIONS is amended to add the following definition:

Written contract means a written contract or written agreement that requires the Named Insured to make a person or organization an additional insured on this coverage part, provided the contract or agreement;

- A. is currently in effect or becomes effective during the term of this policy; and
- B. was executed prior to:
 - 1. the bodily injury or property damage; or
 - 2. the offense that caused the personal and advertising injury

for which the additional insured seeks coverage.

Any coverage granted by this endorsement shall apply solely to the extent permissible by law.

All other terms and conditions of the Policy remain unchanged.

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

L LIABILITY COVERAGE

A. Who is An insured

The following is added to Section II, Paragraph A.1., Who is An insured:

- a. Any incorporated entity of which the Named Insured owns a majority of the voting stock on the date of Inception of this Coverage Form; provided that,
 - b. The insurance afforded by this provision A.1. does not apply to any such entity that is an "insured" under any other liability "policy" providing "auto" coverage.
- Any organization you newly acquire or form, other than a limited liability company, partnership or joint venture, and over which you maintain majority ownership interest.

The insurance afforded by this provision A.2.:

- a. Is effective on the acquisition or formation date, and is afforded only until the end of the policy period of this Coverage Form, or the next anniversary of its inception date, whichever is earlier.
- b. Does not apply to:
 - (1) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" caused by an "accident" that occurred before you acquired or formed the organization; or
 - (2) Any such organization that is an "insured" under any other liability "policy" providing "auto" coverage.
- 3. Any person or organization that you are required by a written contract to name as an additional insured is an "insured" but only with respect to their legal liability for acts or omissions of a person, who qualifies as an "insured" under Section !! Who is An Insured and for whom Liability Coverage is afforded under this policy. If required by written contract, this insurance will be primary and non-contributory to insurance on which the additional insured is a Named Insured.
- 4. An "employee" of yours is an "insured" while operating an "auto" hired or rented under a contract or agreement in that "employee's"

name, with your permission, while performing duties related to the conduct of your business.

"Policy," as used in this provision A. Who is An Insured, includes those policies that were in force on the inception date of this Coverage Form but:

- 1. Which are no longer in force; or
- Whose limits have been exhausted.

B. Bail Bonds and Loss of Earnings

Section II, Paragraphs A.2. (2) and A.2. (4) are revised as follows:

- In a.(2), the limit for the cost of ball bonds is changed from \$2,000 to \$5,000; and
- 2. In a.(4), the limit for the loss of earnings is changed from \$250 to \$500 a day.

C. Fellow Employee

Section II, Paragraph B.5 does not apply.

Such coverage as is afforded by this provision C, is excess over any other collectible insurance.

II. PHYSICAL DAMAGE COVERAGE

A. Glass Breakage — Hitting A Bird Or Animal — Falling Objects Or Missiles

The following is added to **Section III, Paragraph** A.3.

With respect to any covered "auto," any deductible shown in the Declarations will not apply to glass breakage if such glass is repaired, in a manner acceptable to us, rather than replaced.

B. Transportation Expenses

Section III, Paragraph A.4.a. is revised, with respect to transportation expense incurred by you, to provide:

- a. \$60 per day, in lieu of \$20; subject to
- b. \$1,800 maximum, in lieu of \$600.

C. Loss of Use Expenses

Section III, Paragraph A.4.b. is revised, with respect to loss of use expenses incurred by you, to provide:

a. \$1,000 maximum, in lieu of \$600.

D. Hired "Autos"

The following is added to Section III. Paragraph A.:

5. Hired "Autos"

If Physical Damage coverage is provided under this policy, and such coverage does not extend to Hired Autos, then Physical Damage coverage is extended to:

- a. Any covered "auto" you lease, hire, rent or borrow without a driver; and
- b. Any covered "auto" hired or rented by your "employee" without a driver, under a contract in that individual "employee's" name, with your permission, while performing duties related to the conduct of your business.
- c. The most we will pay for any one "accident" or "loss" is the actual cash value, cost of repair, cost of replacement or \$75,000, whichever is tess, minus a \$500 deductible for each covered auto. No deductible applies to "loss" caused by fire or lightning.
- d. The physical damage coverage as is provided by this provision is equal to the physical damage coverage(s) provided on your owned "autos."
- e. Such physical damage coverage for hired "autos" will:
 - (1) Include loss of use, provided it is the consequence of an "accident" for which the Named Insured is legally liable, and as a result of which a monetary loss is sustained by the leasing or rental concern.
 - (2) Such coverage as is provided by this provision will be subject to a limit of \$750 per "accident."

E. Airbag Coverage

The following is added to Section III, Paragraph B.3.:

The accidental discharge of an airbag shall not be considered mechanical breakdown.

F. Electronic Equipment

Section III, Paragraphs B.4.c and B.4.d. are deleted and replaced by the following:

c. Physical Damage Coverage on a covered "auto" also applies to "loss" to any permanently installed electronic equipment including its antennas and other accessories. d. A \$100 per occurrence deductible applies to the coverage provided by this provision.

G. Diminution in Value

The following is added to Section III, Paragraph B.6.:

Subject to the following, the "diminution in value" exclusion does not apply to:

- a. Any covered "auto" of the private passenger type you lease, hire, rent or borrow, without a driver for a period of 30 days or less, while performing duties related to the conduct of your business; and
- b. Any covered "auto" of the private passenger type hired or rented by your "employee" without a driver for a period of 30 days or less, under a contract in that individual "employee's" name, with your permission, while performing duties related to the conduct of your business.
- c. Such coverage as is provided by this provision is limited to a "diminution in value" loss arising directly out of accidental damage and not as a result of the failure to make repairs; faulty or incomplete maintenance or repairs; or the installation of substandard parts.
- d. The most we will pay for "loss" to a covered "auto" in any one accident is the lesser of:
 - (1) \$5,000; or
 - (2) 20% of the "auto's" actual cash value (ACV).

III. Drive Other Car Coverage - Executive Officers

The following is added to Sections II and III:

- Any "auto" you don't own, hire or berrow is a covered "auto" for Liability Coverage while being used by, and for Physical Damage Coverage while in the care, custody or control of, any of your "executive officers," except:
 - a. An "auto" owned by that "executive officer" or a member of that person's household; or
 - b. An "auto" used by that "executive officer" while working in a business of selling, servicing, repairing or parking "autos."

Such Liability and/or Physical Damage Coverage as is afforded by this provision.

(1) Equal to the greatest of those coverages afforded any covered "auto"; and

- (2) Excess over any other collectible insurance.
- 2. For purposes of this provision, "executive officer" means a person holding any of the officer positions created by your charter, constitution, bylaws or any other similar governing document, and, while a resident of the same household, includes that person's spouse.

Such "executive officers" are "insureds" while using a covered "auto" described in this provision.

IV. BUSINESS AUTO CONDITIONS

A. Duties In The Event Of Accident, Claim, Suit Or

The following is added to Section IV, Paragraph A.2.a.:

(4) Your "employees" may know of an "accident" or "loss." This will not mean that you have such knowledge, unless such "accident" or "loss" is known to you or if you are not an individual, to any of your executive officers or partners or your insurance manager.

The following is added to Section IV, Paragraph A.2.b.:

(6) Your "employees" may know documents received concerning a claim or "suit." This will not mean that you have such knowledge, unless receipt of such documents is known to you or if you are not an individual, to any of your executive officers or partners or your insurance manager.

B. Transfer Of Rights Of Recovery Against Others

The following is added to Section IV, Paragraph A.5. Transfer Of Rights Of Recovery Against Others To Us:

We waive any right of recovery we may have. because of payments we make for injury or damage, against any person or organization for whom or which you are required by written contract or agreement to obtain this waiver from

This injury or damage must arise out of your activities under a contract with that person or organization.

You must agree to that requirement prior to an "accident" or "loss."

C. Concealment, Misrepresentation or Fraud

The following is added to Section IV, Paragraph B.2.:

Your failure to disclose all hazards existing on the date of inception of this Coverage Form shall not prejudice you with respect to the coverage afforded provided such failure or omission is not intentional.

D. Other Insurance

The following is added to Section IV, Paragraph

Regardless of the provisions of Paragraphs 5.a. and 5.d. above, the coverage provided by this policy shall be on a primary non-contributory basis. This provision is applicable only when required by a written contract. That written contract must have been entered into prior to "Accident" or "Loss."

E. Policy Period, Coverage Territory

Section IV, Paragraph B. 7.(5).(a). is revised to provide:

a. 45 days of coverage in lieu of 30 days.

V. DEFINITIONS

Section V. Paragraph C. is deleted and replaced by the following:

"Bodily injury" means bodily injury, sickness or disease sustained by a person, including mental anguish, mental injury or death resulting from any of these.
