FEMA Reimbursement	Related to 2024 Winter Storms	In 2025, I will continue to coordinate outreach to the federal delegation regarding appropriate communication with USACE and FEMA and to facilitate reimbursement of expenses.
FEMA Reimbursement	Related to COVID-19 Pandemic	4/3/25 – FEMA announced Federal grants for the State of California. This funding included 3,060,968.00 in federal

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		<p>funding to Monterey County for emergency protective measures as a result of FEMA-DR-4482-CA (COVID-19 Pandemic). This funding is being provided under authority of Section 403 of the Robert T. Stafford Act.</p> <p>The announcement noted that in response to the pandemic, the County utilized contract services to participate in the Great Plates Delivered Program. The program was designed to support adults 65 years of age or older or adults 60-64 years of age who are at high risk from COVID-19, to receive healthy and nutritious meals by delivery. All work and costs in this project fell between 11/23/2020 and 7/9/2021. Total project costs are \$3,060,968.00 funded at a 100% federal cost share.</p>
OMB Memo re Federal Funding	BoS letter to federal offices voicing concern regarding the effect of the recent memorandum from OMB that “Federal agencies must temporarily pause all activities related to obligation or disbursement of all Federal financial assistance.”	2/14/25 – Letter sent to Congressional delegation
FY24 Community Project Funding Award for CRFREE	In February 2025 it was brought to my attention that PWFP has not been contacted by FHWA or the State Dept of Transportation with any guidance about how to access funding for the CRFREE project that had been awarded in FY24 community project (earmark) funding.	<p>2/27/25 – I met with Rep. Panetta’s staff on to address concerns relating to the FY24 earmark awarding for CRFREE, and to obtain additional information about the reimbursement requirements. I will continue to work with the Departments to resolve any issues so that they can draw down any federal funding as expeditiously as possible.</p> <p>3/13/25 - Caltrans reached out to County staff and requested that the County complete and submit a specific form so that Caltrans can distribute the funds to County for the CRFREE Project.</p>
FY25 Community Project Funding Requests	The county submitted 9 requests for consideration of FY25 earmark funding, however only the Pajaro County Sanitation District (PCSD) Sewer System Improvements project advanced.	March 2025 – Congress enacted a Continuing Resolution for the remainder of FY25 and did not include earmarks. Consequently, no earmarks, including the PCSD project were funded. PWFP has advised that the county can cover the approximately \$1 million dollars that was hoped for via earmark funding with other sources.
