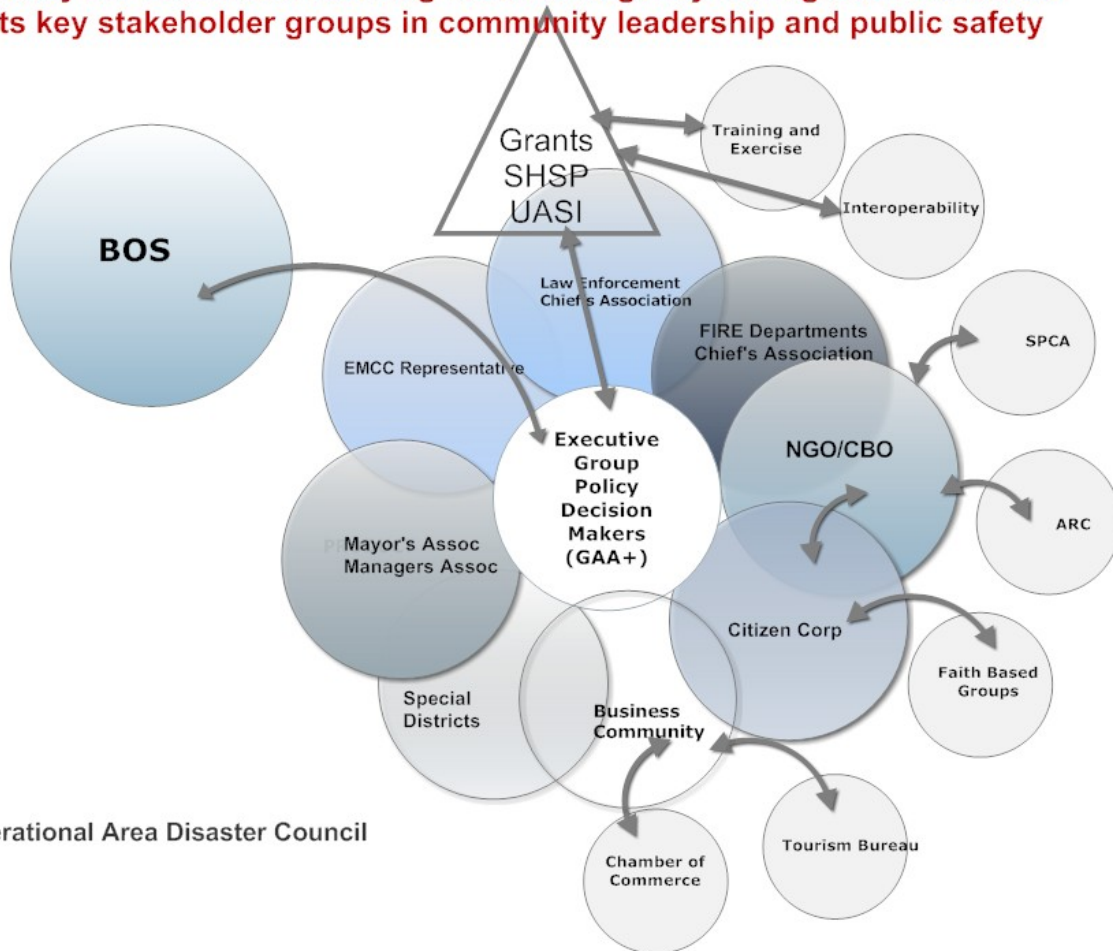
Operational Area Coordinating Council

Council represents key stakeholder groups in community leadership and public safety

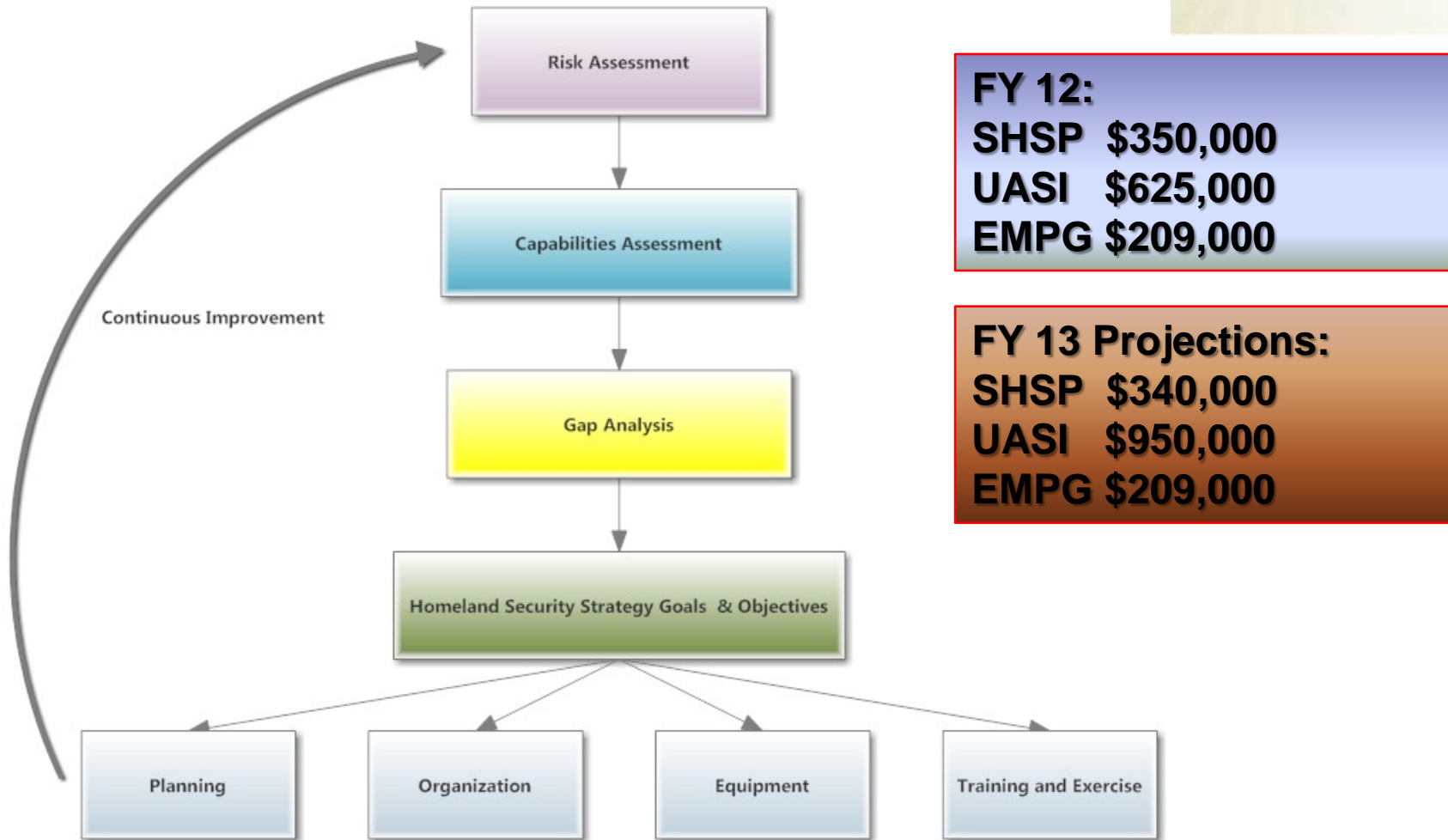


Draft Concept

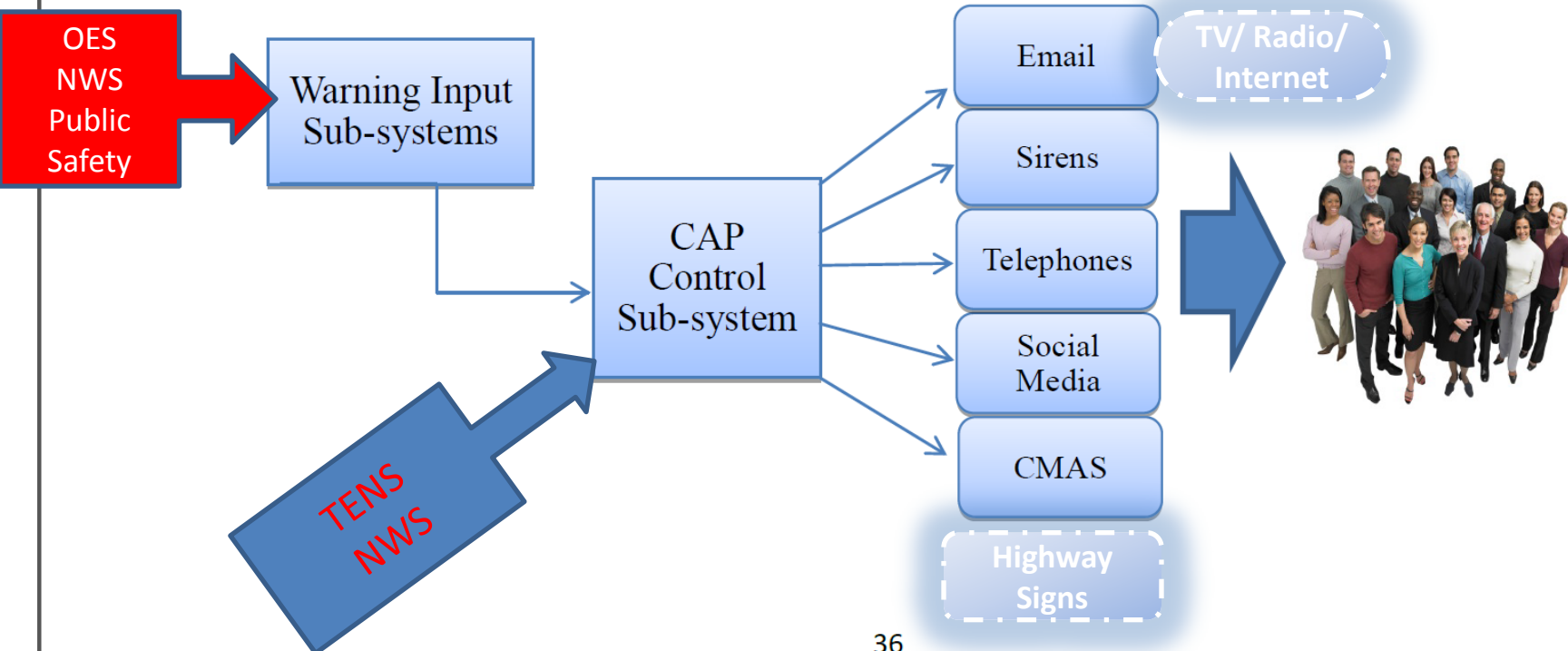
The Alphabet Soup of Emergency Notification

Figure 6: Single Input, Multiple Outputs

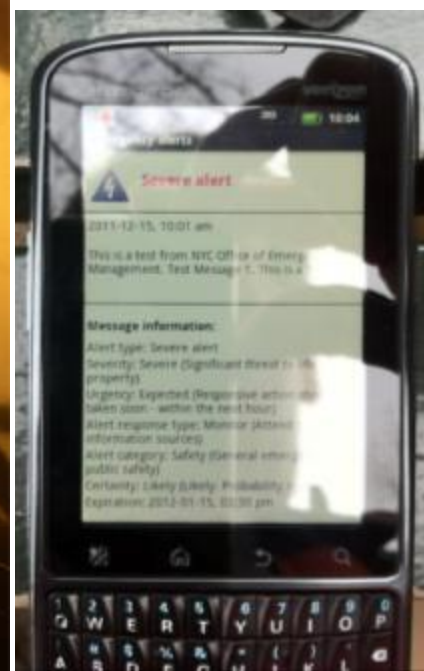
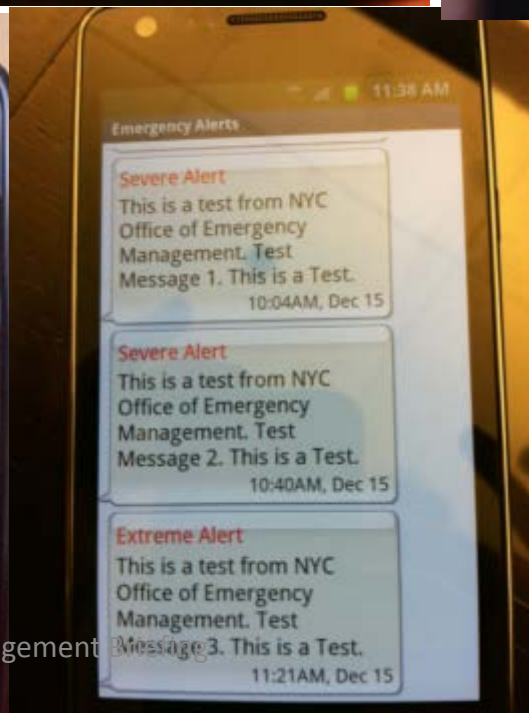
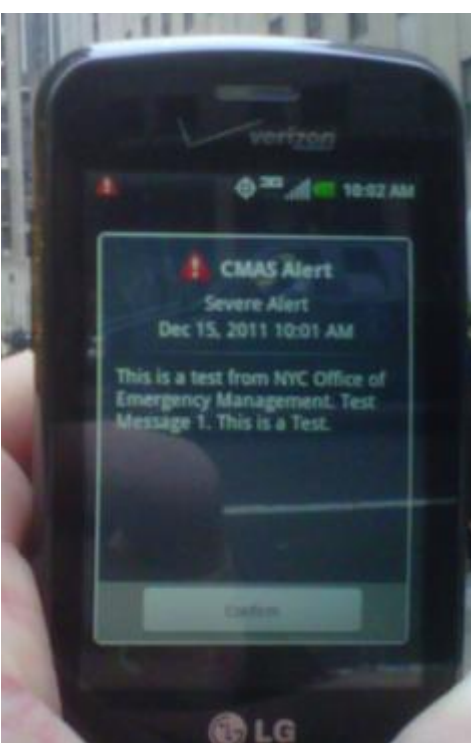
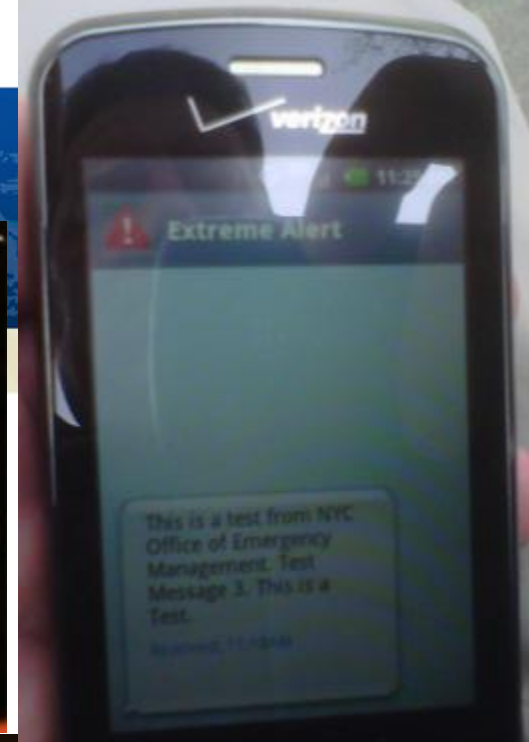

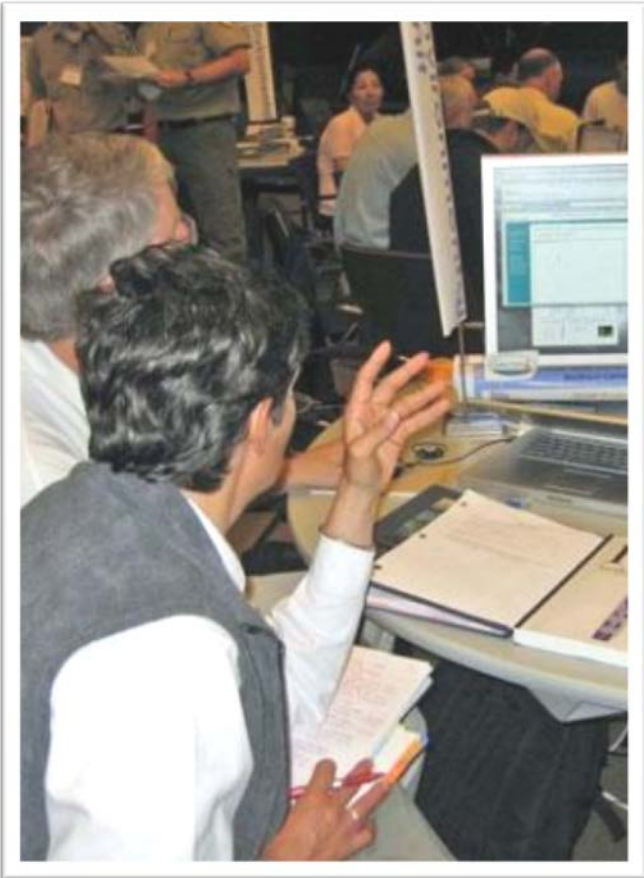
Training, Credentialing, and Exercising

We will be working on enhancing the County COOP plan this next fiscal year. This effort will involve all departments and BOS staff.

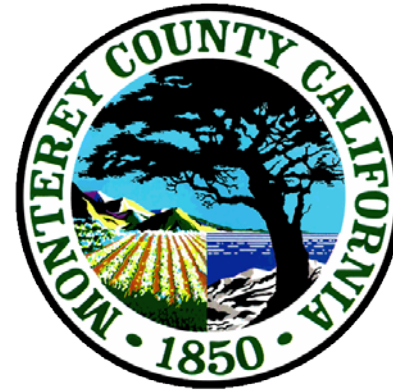

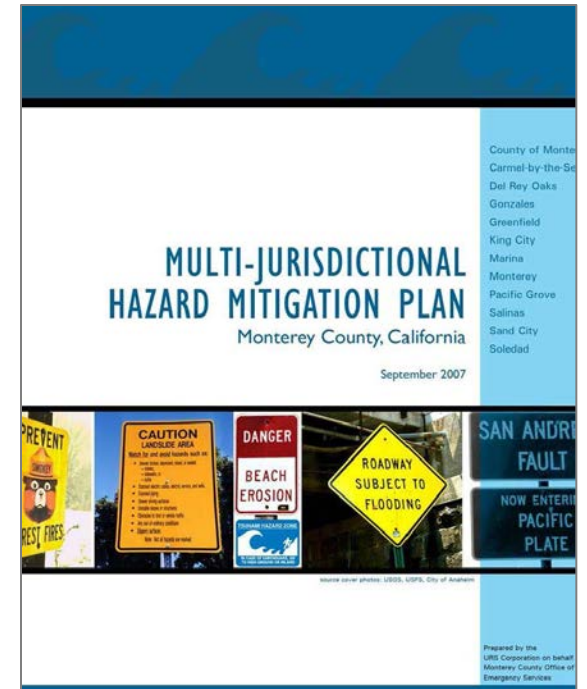

Project Objectives

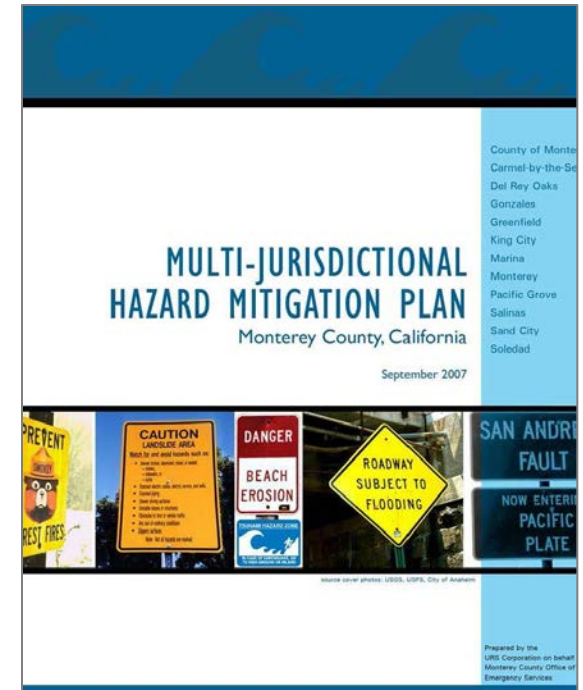
- Build capacity of Monterey County to increase community resiliency

Project Objectives

- Qualify all Monterey County jurisdictions for maximum CDAA and Stafford Act funds *
- Leverage the Digital Coast Partnership and other organizations for expertise and outreach (new hazards)
- Integrate Hazard Mitigation into land use decision making process for all jurisdictions and at all levels.





Hazard Mitigation/Sea Level Rise

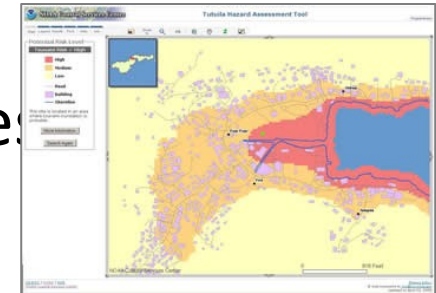
- Pressure nationally to commit to action in response to climate change

Current Project Status

- Contract Pending
- Anticipated project kickoff meeting – mid-June
- Plan update process scheduled over 14 months
 - 7 Planning Team meetings
 - Series of individual jurisdiction meetings
 - Widespread public outreach and stakeholder involvement
 - Focus on integration of climate-related hazards and specific, achievable mitigation/adaptation actions
