Recognizing the 50th Anniversary of the Natividad Family Medicine Residency

WHEREAS, the Natividad Family Medicine Residency addresses the critical shortage of primary care physicians, a challenge felt acutely in California and Monterey County, where access to high-quality, culturally competent medical care is essential for the health and well-being of all residents; and

WHEREAS, the **Natividad Family Medicine Residency** was established in 1975 at Monterey County's public safety-net hospital to address this urgent need, training physicians committed to serving diverse, often underserved, communities; and

WHEREAS, 2025 marks the 50th Anniversary of the Natividad Family Medicine Residency, which has graduated three hundred fifty eight physicians over its history, providing a vital pipeline of dedicated medical professionals; and

WHEREAS, one in three graduates of the Natividad Family Medicine Residency choose to remain in Monterey County to practice, strengthening the local health care workforce and expanding access to care for our community; and

WHEREAS, more than fifty percent of graduates of the Natividad Family Medicine Residency over the past five years are providing primary care in safety-net clinics, serving patients in underserved areas who might otherwise go without timely or consistent medical attention; and

WHEREAS, one in five graduates of the Natividad Family Medicine Residency are providing inpatient medical care in hospitals serving underserved communities, ensuring that even the most vulnerable patients have access to high-quality, compassionate care; and

WHEREAS, the Natividad Family Medicine Residency continues to embody the highest values of service, excellence, and equity, preparing physicians who care for the whole person and who remain deeply committed to the communities they serve;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Monterey County Board of Supervisors does hereby recognize and honor the **Natividad Family Medicine Residency** on the occasion of its 50th Anniversary, and commend its graduates, faculty, and staff for their extraordinary contributions to the health and well-being of Monterey County and beyond.
