RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors:

- a. Approve and authorize the Purchasing Manager to sign a Professional Services Agreement with California Youth Outreach to provide mentoring, outreach and intervention programs to support the Silver Star Gang Prevention and Intervention grant in the amount of \$221,225 for the period October 1, 2010 through February 29, 2012.
- b. Authorize the Purchasing Manager to sign up to three (3) future amendments to this Agreement where the amendments do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the original contract amount and do not significantly change the scope of work.

SUMMARY/ DISCUSSION:

The US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) – Administration for Children and Families (ACF) has approved a grant award for the Probation Department in the amount of \$1,500,000. The grant provides funding for the Silver Star Gang Prevention and Intervention (SSGPI) Program during the length of the grant, October 1, 2010 through February 29, 2012.

As the lead agency, the Probation Department is disbursing funds and coordinating services between all County agencies and community organizations participating in the programs associated with the SSGPI grant.

Funding in the amount of \$221,225 has been allocated to California Youth Outreach for a youth mentoring program and outreach and intervention services. California Youth Outreach is a non-profit agency providing services in collaboration with the grant-funded programs. The agency will provide structured programs designed for youth from ages 10-18 that exhibit potential risk factors for gang involvement and other social underachievement. These programs are designed to provide the minor with the skills and confidence to become productive members of the community.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The PSA has been approved by County Counsel as to legal form, by the Auditor-Controller's as to fiscal terms, and by Risk Management as to insurance provisions.

FINANCING:

Funding in the amount of \$221,225 is provided by the SSGPI federal allocation and has been included in Department 2550, Unit 8162 for fiscal years 2010-11 and 2011-2012. There is no additional cost to the County General Fund associated with this recommendation.
