Resolution proclaiming September 19, 2012 as

“It Can Wait–No Texting While Driving Pledge Day” in Monterey County

WHEREAS, Monterey County holds the health and safety of its citizens as a vital concern; and

WHEREAS, wireless phone use has become ubiquitous through our community, California, and the nation as a whole; and

WHEREAS, text messaging is the main mode of communication for most American teenagers with half of all teens sending between 21 and 70 texts per day; and

WHEREAS, any time a driver attempts to send a text message while driving, his or her attention is diverted from the road for an average of five seconds; and

WHEREAS, in an AT&T survey, 43% of American teen drivers admitted to texting while driving even though 97% know it is dangerous; and

WHEREAS, a recent Nationwide Insurance study showed that 80% of respondents support some type of ban on sending text messages or emails while driving; and

WHEREAS, a Virginia Tech Transportation Institute study showed those who send text messages while driving are 23 times more likely to be involved in an accident; and

WHEREAS, a study conducted by the Transport Research Laboratory in the United Kingdom showed that sending text messages while driving is riskier than driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs; and

WHEREAS, a driver who sends a text message while driving not only jeopardizes his or her safety, but also the safety of passengers, pedestrians, and other drivers.

WHEREAS, it is illegal to send electronic text messages while driving in the State of California.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Monterey County Board of Supervisors, on behalf of the County and all citizens thereof, does hereby proclaim September 19, 2012 as **“It Can Wait – No Texting While Driving Pledge Day”** in Monterey County.
