Adopt Resolution Celebrating the Civil Rights Movement)
and the 50th Anniversary of the **Civil Rights Act of 1964**.....)

WHEREAS, this year we celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the **Civil Rights Act of 1964**, the most sweeping civil rights legislation since Reconstruction; and

WHEREAS, on July 2, 1964, President Lyndon B. Johnson signed Public Law 88-352, the **Civil Rights Act of 1964**, prohibiting discrimination against race, color, religion, gender, or national origin; and

WHEREAS, on March 5, 1964, 10,000 people from southern states, led by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., marched on Frankfort and, on the steps of the Capitol, demanded legislation that would end segregation by making discrimination illegal; and

WHEREAS, on August 28, 1963 about 200,000 people joined the March on Washington D.C., participants listen as Martin Luther King delivers his famous "I Have a Dream" speech; and

WHEREAS, the Monterey County Board of Supervisors support equal opportunity, equal treatment, and justice for all employees and residents of Monterey County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Monterey County Board of Supervisors, on behalf of the County and all of the citizens thereof, stands united in celebration of the civil rights movement and the 50th Anniversary of the enactment of the **Civil Rights Act of 1964**.
