**Resolution No. 22-166**

Adopt a Resolution to:

- a. Approve the grant applicants designated in Exhibit A to receive a Fiscal Year 2021-22 Fish and Game Propagation Program grant award as recommended by Staff; and )
- b. Approve and authorize the Director of Public Works, Facilities, & Parks or designee to execute required grant agreements with the designated applicants receiving a Fiscal Year 2021-22 Fish and Game Propagation Program grant fund award and to disburse the funding awards. )

**WHEREAS**, the Monterey County Fish and Game Advisory Commission (Commission) Propagation Grant Fund Program provides grant funds to qualified projects and programs, which help benefit the residents, agencies, organizations, and groups of Monterey County;

**WHEREAS**, the Commission was formed by Board Order by the Board of Supervisors (Board) on June 20, 1947, and re-established on April 28, 1981, (BOS Resolution 81-239) to make recommendations to the Board relative to the preservation and propagation of fish and wildlife resources, as well as education and youth program or activities related to fish and game through the use of the Monterey County Fish and Game Program (Program) Propagation Fund;

**WHEREAS**, in Fiscal Year 2021-22, two solicitations announcing the availability of Program grant fund applications were made, and both were duly noticed in general-circulation newspapers;

**WHEREAS**, the Commission received a total of fourteen (14) applications: six (6) in response to the August 2021 solicitation; seven (7) in response to the November 2021 solicitation; and one (1) in March 2022 responding to a contact from a Commission member;

**WHEREAS**, the Commission carefully reviewed every proposal requesting grant funds received;

**WHEREAS**, on December 14, 2021, and on February 8, 2022, the Commission received presentations on the proposed projects and voted to recommend twelve (12) projects to the Board to receive a grant award;

**WHEREAS**, on April 12, 2022, the Commission reconsidered two applications received, (a third applicant withdrew his application prior to the meeting), and also reviewed a new application received in March 2022;

**WHEREAS**, the Commission voted to add the three projects, with a combined funding request of \$8,800, to their recommendation to the BOS, bringing the total recommended FY 2021-22 Propagation Program Grant Fund award for 13 projects to \$42,035;

**WHEREAS**, if the Commission's recommended awards were to be approved by the Board, the FY 2021-22 Propagation Program Grant Fund allocation would be over expended by \$2,035;

**WHEREAS**, Staff does not concur with the Commission's funding recommendation for one applicant, Gaines and Associates, and recommends that the Board approve only the twelve (12) applications listed in Exhibit A, attached hereto; and

**WHEREAS**, sufficient FY 2021-22 Propagation Program funds are available to fund the twelve grant awards recommended by Staff totaling \$39, 535 as listed in Exhibit A.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Board of Supervisors of the County of Monterey hereby adopts a resolution to:

- a. Approve the grant applicants designated in Exhibit A to receive a Fiscal Year 2021-22 Fish and Game Propagation Program grant award as recommended by Staff; and
- b. Approve and authorize the Director of Public Works, Facilities, & Parks or designee to execute required grant agreements with the designated applicants receiving a Fiscal Year 2021-22 Fish and Game Propagation Program grant fund award and to disburse the funding awards.


