BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County of Monterey agrees to provide all matching funds required for said project, and abide by the statutes and regulations governing the JBAG Program as well as the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by the CSA.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.


