Salinas Valley Memorial Healthcare System (SVMHS) is a public healthcare district on the Central Coast of California with more than \$650M in annual net revenue and consistently strong financial performance. At the core of the system is Salinas Valley Memorial Hospital (SVMH), a 263-bed acute care hospital supported by an integrated delivery system with 1,800 employees, 10,000 annual inpatient discharges, 55,000 annual emergency room visits and a 275-member medical staff. SVMHS includes a network of 11 urgent care centers, a 150 provider multispecialty clinic (Salinas Valley Medical Clinic), partnerships with UC San Francisco (Pediatric Endocrinology), a joint venture with Lucile Packard Children's Hospital/Stanford Children's (Level III NICU) and a number of joint venture partnerships with other local healthcare providers including a locally owned Medicare Advantage health plan.
