



### Monterey County 7-day Average Case Rate per 100,000 Residents by Age






### Proportion of Population 5+ Receiving at Least One Dose by Age




Proportion of Population Vaccinated (%)



### Proportion of Population 5+ Receiving at Least One Dose by Race and Ethnicity








Proportion of Population Age 5+ Receiving at Least one Dose by Region
