funded by Senate Bill 1 (SB 1): The Road and )  
Accountability Act of 2017; and )
- b. Authorizing the Director of Public Works, Facilities )  
and Parks to submit the list to the California )  
Transportation Committee (CTC).

**WHEREAS**, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and Signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

**WHEREAS**, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of our County are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, the County must adopt by resolution a list of projects proposed to receive fiscal year funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

**WHEREAS**, the County, will receive an estimated \$10.3 million in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2022-23 from SB 1; and

**WHEREAS**, this is the sixth year in which the County is receiving SB 1 funding and will enable the County to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB 1; and

**WHEREAS**, the County has undergone a robust public process to ensure public input into our community's transportation priorities; and

**WHEREAS**, the County used a Pavement Management System along with input from the Board of Supervisors to develop the SB 1 project list to ensure revenues are being used on the most high-priority and cost-effective projects that also meet the communities priorities for transportation investment; and

**WHEREAS**, the funding from SB 1 will help the County, this year, rehabilitate approximately 7.3 centerline miles of roads, rehabilitate approximately 28 miles of pavement traffic stripes, repair damage guard rails, perform drainage maintenance and street sweeping in urbanized areas and perform pavement studies for approximately 9.9 miles of roads for future pavement rehabilitation projects; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2020 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment found that the County’s streets and roads are in an “at-risk/poor” condition and this revenue will help us increase the overall quality of our road system and over the next decade will bring our streets and roads into a “good” condition; and

**WHEREAS**, maintaining the road system in “good” condition will reduce drive times and traffic congestion, which leads to reduced vehicle emissions helping the State achieve its air quality and greenhouse gas emission reduction goals; and

**WHEREAS**, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets infrastructure, using environmental and sustainable processes, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant benefits to the County’s major commerce: agriculture and tourism, and will have significant positive co-benefits statewide.

**NOW, THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, ORDERED AND FOUND** by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Monterey, State of California, that said Board:

- a. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.
- b. Adopts the list of projects for Fiscal Year 2022-23 funded by Senate Bill 1 (SB 1): The Road and Accountability Act of 2017.
