Approve and authorize the Director of Health or designee to execute the Agreement for Advanced Life Support and Basic Life Support Ambulance Services, Interfacility and Critical Care Transport, Standby, and Communication Services for the Exclusive Operating Area for the County of Monterey

Overview of the RFP Process



The EMS Agency is responsible for establishing an Exclusive Operating Area* (EOA) **through a competitive process**



The competitive process is a strict process overseen by:

- County Counsel
- Contracts & Purchasing Division
- California EMS Authority (EMSA)




EMSA reviews and approves the RFP process and the RFP itself to ensure a fair process that is consistent with statutes & regulations

*Excludes certain federal property and jurisdictions that claim 201 status (the City of Carmel-by-the-Sea and portions of the Monterey County Regional Fire District)

Local System Challenges

- Balancing the sometimescompeting needs of stakeholders
- Fostering innovation in a tightly regulated process
- Large geographic area
 - Extensive sparsely populated regions
 - Pockets of density (e.g. Big Sur)
 - Challenging access to some areas
- Payor Mix
- Other added costs of providing services

Proposal Evaluation and Scoring Process Evaluation Area

- Proposal Review Panel:
 - Members with expertise in various EMS disciplines
 - Members may not have a conflict of interest
- Goal = To select a provider based on clinical, operational, and dispatch quality of services while also constraining costs to the public and other payors
- Structured quantitative scoring methods

The New Agreement

Transition Period

 Contract execution through January 31, 2026

Initial Operational Period

February 1, 2026 through January 31, 2032

Opportunities to extend through January 31, 2037

 Required to earn extensions by meeting Performance Standards

AB716 - "Ground Medical Transportation" Bill

- Effective January 1, 2024
- Limits the amount patients owe for out-of-network ambulances services to their in-network cost sharing amount
- Insurance plans must pay non-contracting ambulance providers the difference between the in-network cost-sharing amount and a local established/approved rate
- Caps the amount uninsured or self-pay patients can be charged to the greater of the Medi-Cal or Medicare rate

- Management team with extensive local experience
- Covers emergency, interfacility, and CCT transports
- Standby & Special Event Coverage scheduled and incident/disaster-related
- Dispatch services including EMD for first responders and other ambulance service providers
- Dedicated ambulance in Big Sur
- Response time standards
- Training for first responders
- Equipment/supply restock and purchasing programs
- Financial Hardship & Compassionate Care Programs
