






Vaccination Progression: Proportion of Population 16+ Receiving ≥1 Dose




Vaccination Progression: Proportion of Population 16+ Receiving ≥1 Dose






Vaccination Progress: Proportion of Population in **Each Region** Age 16 and Older Receiving ≥1 Dose

Vaccination Progression: Proportion of Population 16+ Receiving ≥1 Dose: North County






Vaccination Progression: Proportion of Population 16+ Receiving ≥1 Dose: Peninsula




Vaccination Progression: Proportion of Population 16+ Receiving ≥1 Dose: Salinas

Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine

May 10, 2021, FDA extended the Emergency Use Authorization for Pfizer vaccine to ages 12 and older.

May 12, 2021, Advisory Committee on Immunization Practice will meet to vote on recommendation for use of Pfizer vaccine and submit to CDC.

Use of Pfizer vaccine in 12-15 age group may begin as soon as CDC recommends extending eligible population and providers make appointments available to county residents.

- An estimated 23,810 adolescents in this age group, comprising 5% of the county population
- Strategies to vaccinate this group include;
 - ongoing vaccine clinics at school locations, and
 - encouraging pediatric providers to enroll in myCAvax to receive and offer vaccine to this age group.



Strategies to Further Reduce Transmission of COVID-19
