Background

The Department of Public Works, Facilities, & Parks' (PWFP) Fiscal Year 2021/22 Budget allocation for propagation grant awards is \$40,000.

These funds come from court-assigned fines from Fish and Wildlife Code violations occurring within Monterey County.

Annually, the Monterey County Fish and Game Advisory Commission (MCFGAC) reviews applications and makes a recommendation to the Board for propagation grant funding awards.

California Fish & Game Code 13103

Expenditures from the fish and wildlife propagation fund of any county may be made only for the following purposes:

- Public Education
- Temporary Treatment of Injured or Orphaned Wildlife
- Breeding Fish or Wildlife for Release
- Habitat Improvement
- Construction/Maintenance/Operation Public Hatcheries
- Predator Control Actions for Benefit of Fish and Wildlife
- Fish and Wildlife Research
- Other Specific Administrative Costs

Summary

- 14 applications for FY 2021/22 propagation grant funding were reviewed by MCFGAC.
 - 1 applicant withdrew.
 - 1 application is recommended for funding with a stipulation that funding be deferred until July 2022.
- MCFGAC's recommendation to the Board exceeds the FY 2021/22 funding allocation, \$40,000, by **\$2035**.

Staff Recommendation for FY 2021/22 Propagation Grant Funding Award

Staff removed one application, the Gaines Project, from MCFGAC's recommendation as it does not meet the *Public Education* criteria of the State Fish & Game Code.

Staff's award recommendation for 12 Applicants, totaling \$39,535, is within the allocated propagation program funding for FY 2021/22 and conforms to State funding criteria.

Staff recommends the Board:

- Adopt a resolution designating grant applicants approved by BOS to receive a funding award and in the award amount as recommended by staff.
- Approve and authorize PWFP Director or designee to execute required grant agreements with applicants approved by the Board to receive grant funds and to distribute the funding awards.
