

Single Use Plastic Ordinance - AB 1276

- a. Find the adoption of this ordinance is categorically exempt per Section 15307 of the CEQA Guidelines because the action consists of creating regulations for the protection of the environment; and
- a. Introduce, waive first reading, set October 10, 2023 at 10:30 a.m. as the date and time to consider adoption of an ordinance to add Chapter 10.44 of the Monterey County Code to set restrictions on food providers' use of single-use plastics food accessories in unincorporated Monterey County.

Single Use Plastic Ordinance - AB 1276

AB 1276 addresses single-use food ware accessories and standard condiments

- Adopted by the State in 2021
- Prohibits a food facility from providing any single-use food ware accessory or standard condiment to a consumer unless requested by the consumer
- Prohibits those items from being bundled or packaged
- Requires all cities, counties, or city and county, on or before June 1, 2022, to authorize an
 enforcement agency to enforce these requirements

- Coordination with Food Safety Advisory Council and Monterey County Hospitality Association

- Emergency exemptions
- Facility exemptions
 - 1. Correctional institutions
 - 2. Health care facilities
 - 3. Residential care facilities
 - 4. Schools

IMPACT

- Supports goal of waste reduction
- Potential savings for food providers
- Similar to County's Polystyrene Foam Food Packaging restrictions
- Businesses will be able to use up current stock
- Price difference If choosing to switch to reusable or compostable (not required)
- Noncompliance
