Homelessness and Shelters

- The County of Monterey is ranked **58th** in **cost of housing**.*
- 32% of the unhoused population in the Monterey County are women.*
- There are currently **1,495 shelter** beds in Monterey County, which include emergency shelter, transitional housing, and rental assistance.
- 54% of women who completed the 2024 County of Monterey CSW Survey County stated Housing and Homelessness were the most pressing issue effecting women in their community.

Domestic Violence

- The County of Monterey is ranked 23 in the number of **Domestic Violence** calls for assistance.*
- The County of Monterey is ranked **39** by the percentage of women who **feel safe** in their neighborhood all or most of the time.*
- In California, **1 in 5** adult women have experienced physical or sexual violence from an intimate partner since the age 18.**

Pay Equity

- The County of Monterey ranked 26 in median earnings for women employed full time, with an average income is **\$49,000.***
- Women in the County of Monterey make **\$0.87 to a man's dollar.***
- Majority of people earn \$60K, while it costs about \$120K to live in the County of Monterey.**
- 25% of women who completed the 2024 County of Monterey CSW Survey don't have enough to cover their Monthly Bills.
 - 61% for the women who completed the 2024 Spanish CSW Survey.


2024 CSW Survey Results

- 45% of participants identifying as a Senior selected Healthcare as their top need. Long Term Care, Aging in Place, and Social Activities were also top needs.
- 42% of participants identified Equal Pay & Living Wage as the most pressing issue affecting women in their community.
- 38% of participants who are mothers said Housing in safe neighborhoods is a challenge they face.
