RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors:

a. Receive a report on solid waste contract negotiations with USA Waste of California dba Carmel Marina Corp., a subsidiary of Waste Management, Inc. for unincorporated Monterey County. b. Approve and authorize the Director of Health, or Assistant Director of Health, to sign Amendment No. 10 to the Unified Franchise Agreement to extend the term 60 days, through August 31, 2020, to

continue contract negotiations.

SUMMARY:

The Environmental Health Bureau has been in negotiations with USA Waste of California dba Carmel Marina Corp., to extend the term of the agreement and to address a mechanism to recover outstanding debt owed to the Contactor.

DISCUSSION:

On February 2, 2010, the Board of Supervisors awarded the solid waste franchise contract to USA Waste of California, Inc., dba Carmel Marina Corporation (Contractor). The current Agreement is under consideration to negotiate an extension of five (5) years with the ability of the Contractor to recover bad debt. The Contractor has provided excellent customer service to the unincorporated Monterey County residents and has provided extra/expedited services during emergencies, such as the Soberanes Fire. Considering the Contactor's performance as noted above, a five (5) year extension would allow this service to continue for unincorporated Monterey County.

The County received communications from USA Waste of California, Inc. on April 6, 2020. USA Waste of California proposed a sixty (60) day extension of the current Agreement in order to continue negotiations as the Covid 19 virus has shifted priorities to emergency operations. It is anticipated that by April 20, 2020 the Contractor will have a proposal to submit to the County for evaluation.

This work supports the Monterey County Health Department 2018-2022 strategic plan initiatives: 1. Empower the community to improve health through programs, policies, and activities. It also supports one of the ten essential public health services, specifically: 6. Enforce laws and regulations that protect health and ensure safety.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Contractor concurs with this recommendation.

FINANCING:

There is no General Fund Contribution resulting from this Board action. Waste Management, Inc. will continue to remit franchise fees, calculated at ten percent (10%) of collected revenue, to the General Fund under the current terms of the Unified Franchise Agreement.
