**EMPOWER:** Support existing community resilience projects and develop initiatives and strategies for boosting resilience.

- **56 Collaboration Meetings**, including 7 Working Group Meetings, with local partners and stakeholders throughout all sectors of the Monterey County Community (168 organizations provided input)

<p>Every person and organization should work to prepare their home and self for disasters by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>✓ Making an emergency plan and kit</li><li>✓ Signing up for local alerts and buying a NOAA weather radio</li><li>✓ Insuring and preparing their properties</li><li>✓ Developing or joining a local CERT and/or HAM radio group.</li></ul>
<p>Community members should work together to make emergency communication easier &amp; allow community members to better help one another before, during, &amp; after disasters by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>✓ Creating preparedness fairs</li><li>✓ Developing community emergency response plans</li><li>✓ Making a neighborhood contact tree.</li><li>✓ Organize carpool or bike caravans to work, school, or other locations, including walking school bus programs to reduce vehicle reliance and better familiarize residents with their neighborhoods</li><li>✓ <i>In rural regions</i>, community members can develop programs like the <a href="#">General Mobile Radio Service</a>, a licensed radio service that uses specific radio stations to communicate during disasters when cell coverage is limited.</li></ul>
