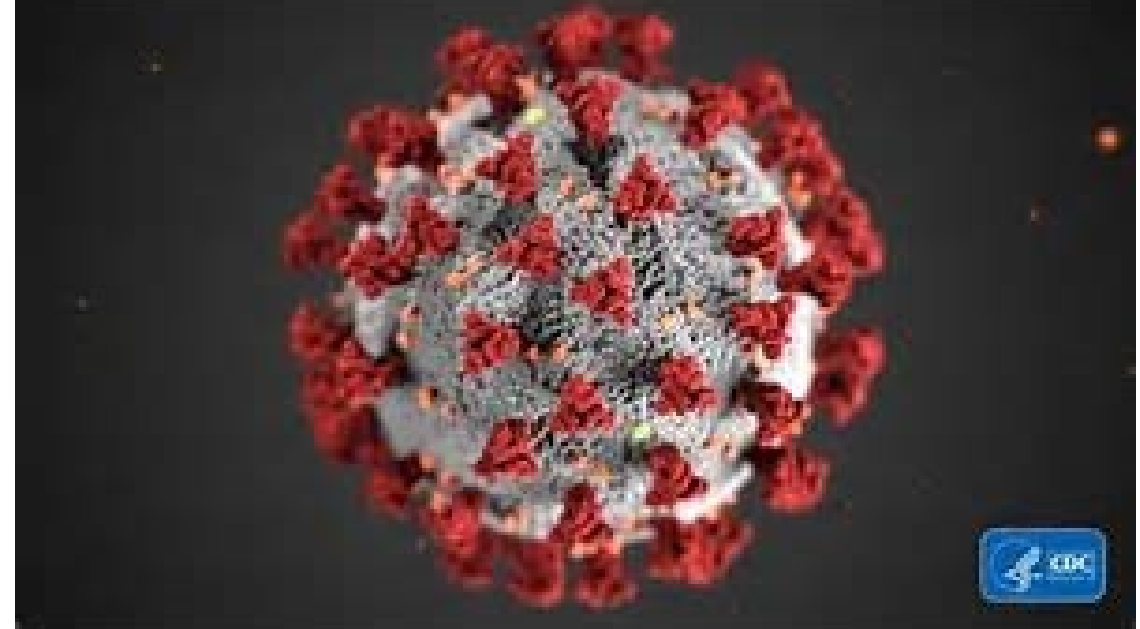


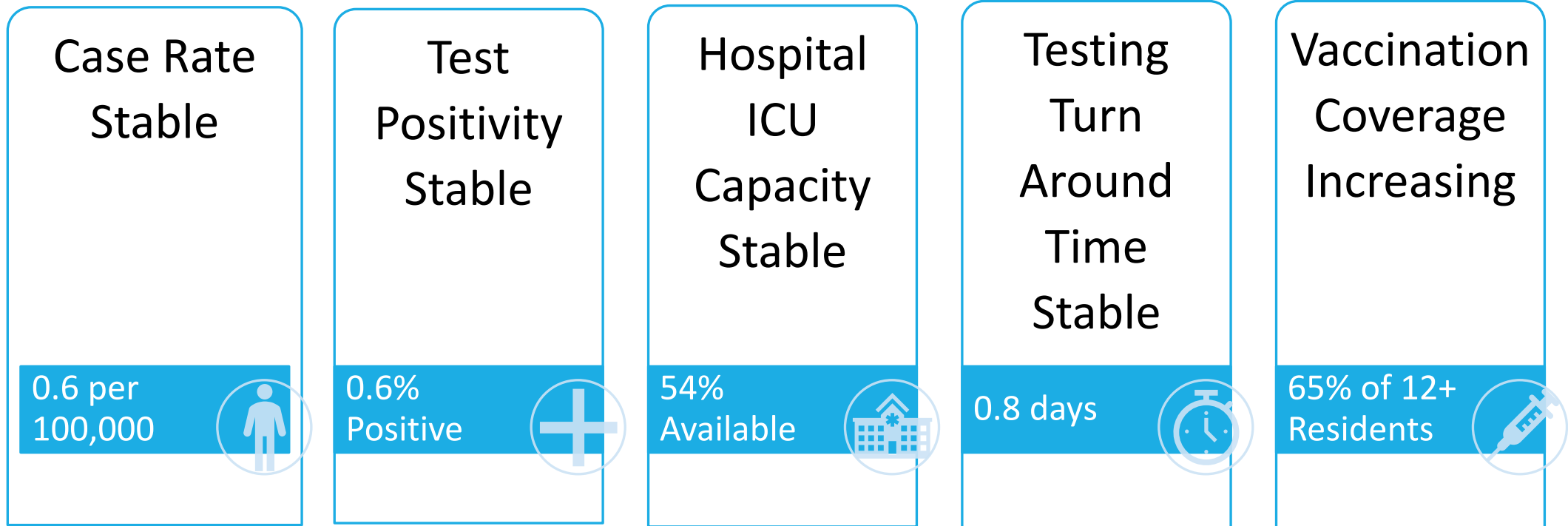

Monterey County Blueprint Metrics for Week of May 30 – June 5	Tier 1 (Widespread)	Tier 2 (Substantial)	Tier 3 (Moderate)	Tier 4 (Minimal)
Adjusted Case Rate: 0.6	>10	6 to 10	2 to 5.9	<2
Test Positivity Rate: 0.6%	>8%	5% to 8%	2% to 4.9%	<2%
HPI Lowest Quartile Test Positivity Rate: 0.8%	>8.0%	≤8.0%	<5%	<2%

Indoor and Outdoor Requirements

Vaccine Verification / Negative Testing	Required for Indoor mega events Recommended for Outdoor mega events
Capacity Limitations	No restrictions
Physical Distancing	No restrictions for attendees, customers and guests
Masking	Follow current CDPH Guidance for Face Coverings
Travelers	Follow CDC recommendations and CDPH Travel Advisory



CDPH Face Coverings Guidance

- Face coverings are not required for fully vaccinated individuals, except for in the following settings:
 - Public transit and transportation hubs
 - Indoors in K-12, childcare and other youth settings
 - Health care settings and long-term care facilities
 - State and local correctional facilities and detention centers
 - Homeless shelters



CDPH Face Coverings Guidance

- Face covering are required for unvaccinated individuals in indoor public settings and businesses (grocery stores, restaurants, etc.)
- Three options for employers and organizers regarding masks indoors.
 1. Ask individuals to self attest as to vaccine status; if vaccinated no mask required, if unvaccinated a mask is required, or
 2. Confirm vaccine status before allowing individual to remove the mask, or
 3. Mask everyone indoors.

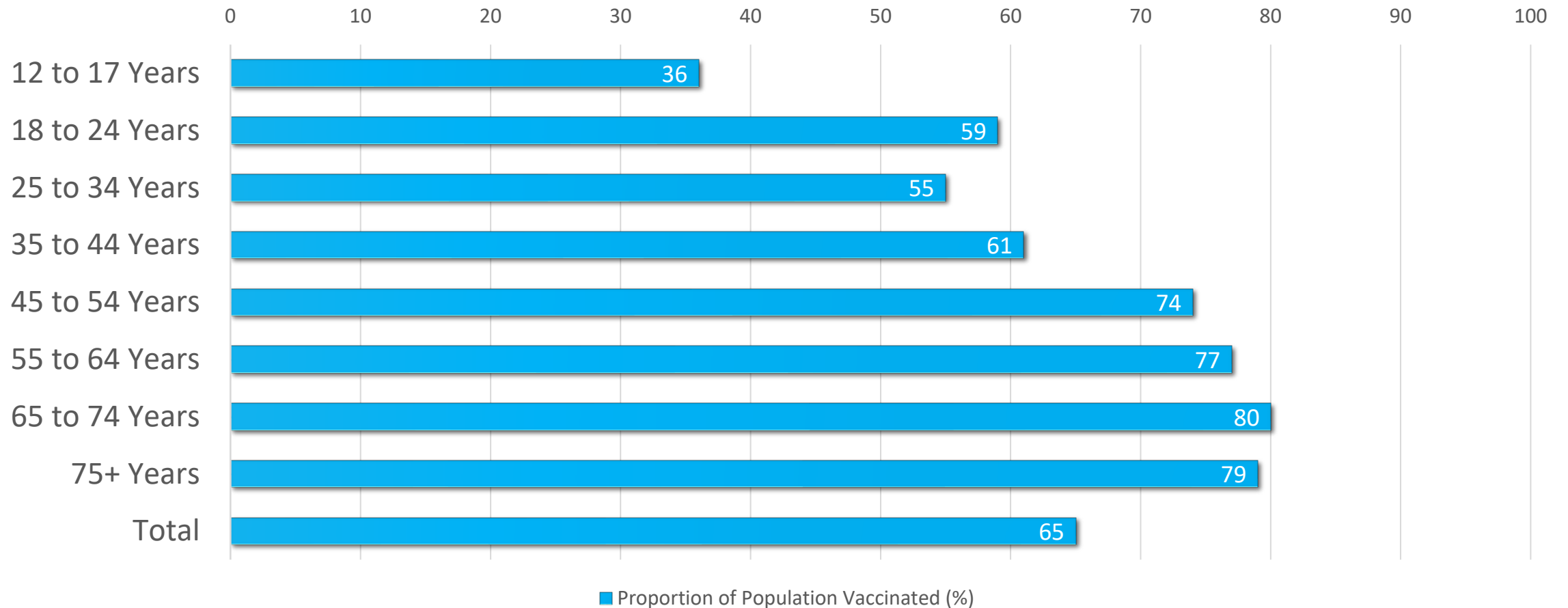

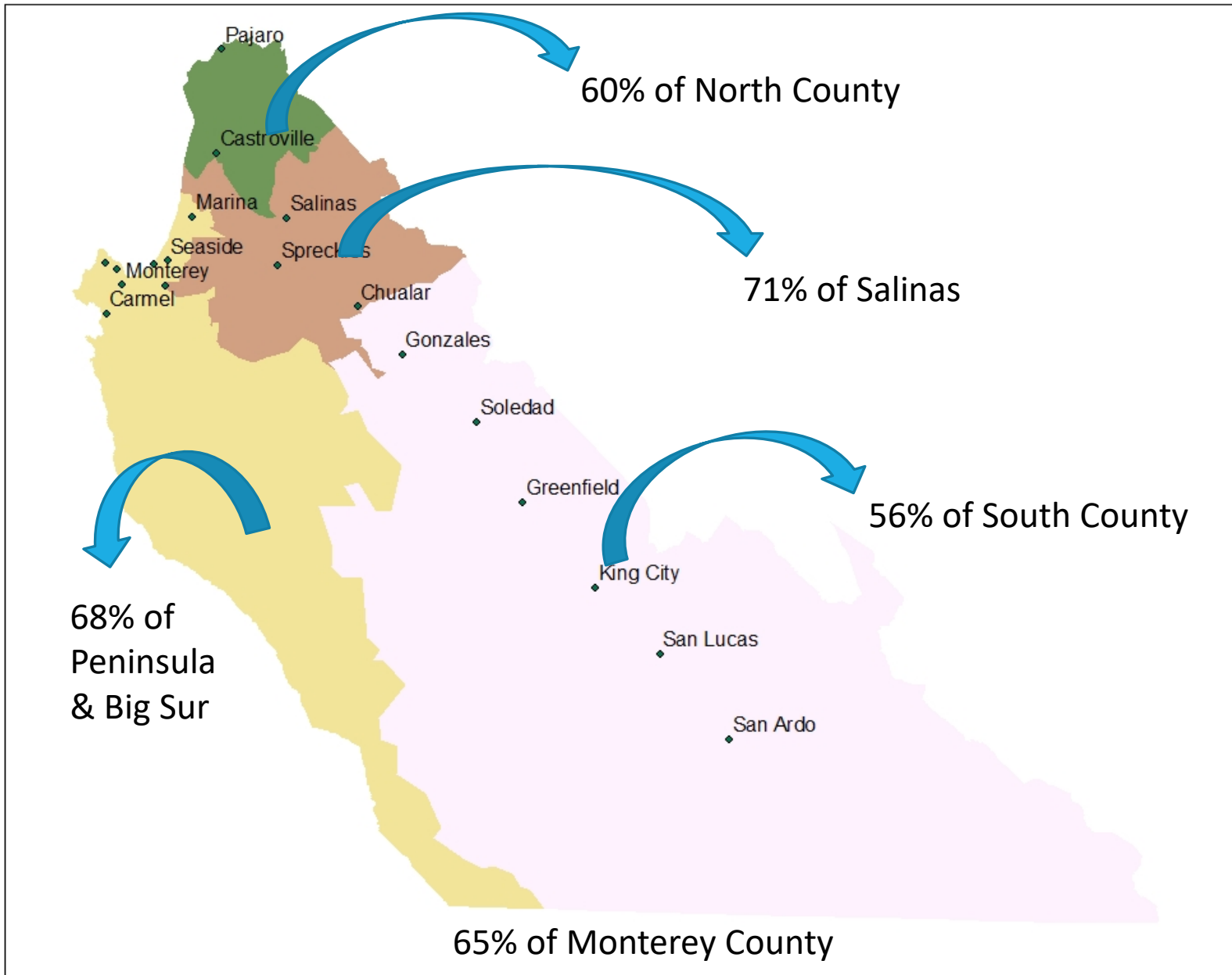

Vaccination Progression: Proportion of Population 12+ Receiving ≥ 1 Dose

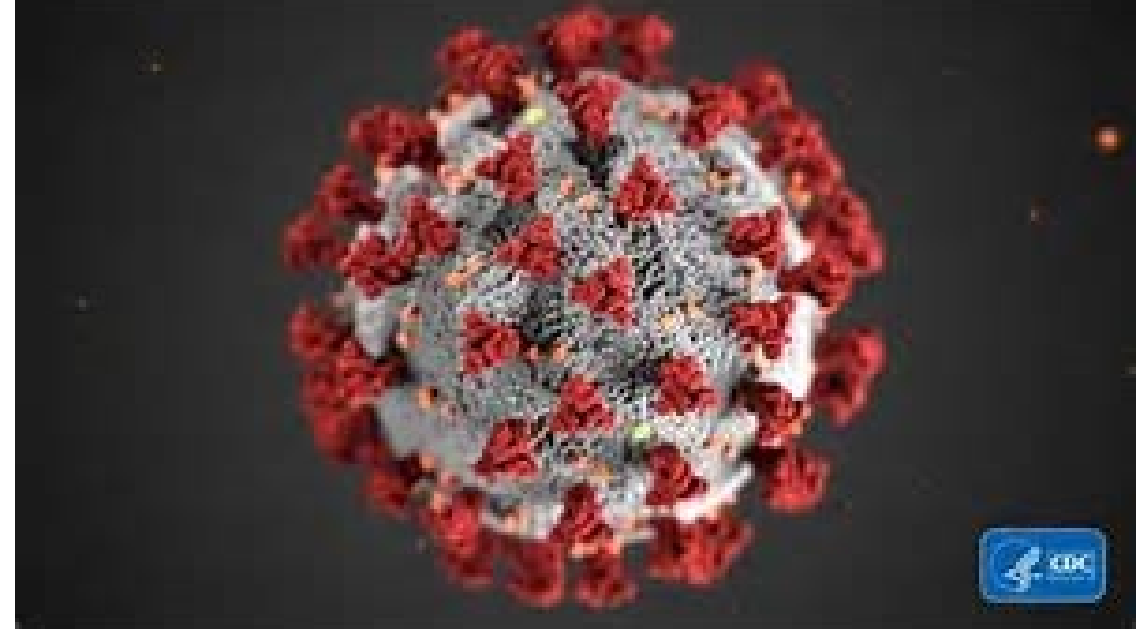




Vaccination Progress: Proportion of Population in Each Region Age 12 and Older Receiving ≥ 1 Dose
