RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors:
Consider and approve the recommendation of the Child Care Planning Council to transfer the administration of the Local Planning Council to the Monterey County Office of Education.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

The Monterey County Child Care Planning Council (CCPC) was first established by the Board of Supervisors in June 1991 in accordance with state laws mandating a county level child care planning council. The Board of Supervisors and the County Superintendent of Schools both have responsibilities to appoint members to the CCPC and to participate in mandated activities as needed. The CCPC provides a forum for child care issues and has been administered by the Department of Social & Employment Services since Fiscal Year 2000-01.

The CCPC has up to 30 volunteers and represents consumers of child care, community representatives, child care providers, public agencies and others that are interested in child care in Monterey County. The CCPC is responsible for assessing the needs of child care and reviewing the programs funded by the State Departments of Education and Social Services.


Approximately 85% of county level child care planning councils throughout California are administered by County Offices of Education and, as a result, there is a network of support. The Monterey County Office of Education (MCOE) currently operates many county-wide, early education efforts and is experienced in meeting contractual requirements of the California Department of Education.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The CCPC and the Monterey County Superintendent of Schools have collaborated in the planning process and support the transfer of administration of the CCPC to Monterey County Office of Education.


FINANCING:

The FY 2011-12 Adopted Budget includes the intention to transfer the administration of CCPC to MCOE. There is no impact to the County General Fund.
