Proclaim the Month of August 2016 as “Breastfeeding)
Awareness Month” in Monterey County.....)

WHEREAS, the advantages of breastfeeding for infants and mothers and the use of human milk for infant feeding are supported by overwhelming scientific evidence. Advantages include health, nutritional, immunologic, developmental, psychological, social, economic, and environmental benefits;

WHEREAS, breastfeeding decreases the incidence and/or severity of childhood health conditions including respiratory and ear infections, diabetes, overweight and obesity, sudden infant death syndrome, leukemia, and asthma. Breastfeeding also promotes optimal brain development, providing children with an ideal foundation for learning readiness;

WHEREAS, breastfeeding is an important part of preventive healthcare for mothers, as it can decrease postpartum depression, facilitate weight loss, help delay a new pregnancy, and reduce the risk of diabetes and certain types of cancer;

WHEREAS, United States and international health organizations encourage exclusive breastfeeding of infants for six months before the introduction of complementary foods, and continued breastfeeding until the infant is at least one to two years old;

WHEREAS, Ninety-seven (97%) of Monterey County mothers of newborns initiate breastfeeding, but only sixty-eight percent (68%) are exclusively breastfeeding at hospital discharge;

WHEREAS, the theme for this year’s World Breastfeeding Week, *Breastfeeding: A Key to Sustainable Development*, is about how breastfeeding is a key element in getting us to think about how to value our wellbeing from the start of life, how to respect each other, and care for the world we share;

WHEREAS, the County of Monterey is working on strategies to support mothers and increase the number of women who meet recommended breastfeeding goals, and to improve infant, maternal, and family health through the promotion, support and protection of breastfeeding in Monterey County.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors, County of Monterey, that the month of August 2016, be designated “**Breastfeeding Awareness Month**” to support breastfeeding as one of the best public health prevention measures related to infant and maternal well-being.
