- (3) One Director from a list of two nominees provided by the mayor's select committee, who has a background in city government within the territory of the agency.
- (4) One Director from a list of two nominees provided by the Monterey County Agricultural Advisory Committee. The Monterey Agricultural Advisory Committee shall consider possible nominations from all areas of agriculture not represented by the organizations described in paragraphs (1) to (3), inclusive, such as flower growers' associations, cattlemen's' associations, wine grape growers' associations, and independent growers.
- (c) No person shall be appointed pursuant to this section that, because of his or her employment or other financial interest, is likely to be disqualified from a substantial number of decisions to be made by the Board of the Agency on the basis of conflict-of-interest requirements.

## Sec. 50. Terms; reappointment.

- (a) The term of office for each Director shall be four years, except as provided in subdivision (b). Directors shall serve until their successors are appointed and take office. Directors may be reappointed at the end of their terms.
- (b) The terms of office of the Directors shall be staggered. Directors who are appointed initially shall serve as follows:
  - (1) Three Directors shall have two-year terms.
  - (2) Three Directors shall have three-year terms.
  - (3) Three Directors shall have four-year terms.
- (4) The initial Directors shall draw lots to determine the length of each Director's initial term.

## Sec. 51. Vacancies; manner of filling; term.

- (a) A vacancy occurs among the Directors when a Director resigns or dies, or if the office is declared vacant by the Supervisors, on the recommendation of a majority of the Directors due to the incumbent Director's incapacity or failure to attend meetings.
- (b) A vacancy shall be filled by appointment in the same manner as the appointment of the previous holder of the office. The person appointed to replace a Director shall serve for the remainder of the original term, and may thereafter be re-appointed or not, as the appointing authority may decide.

Membership: The Community Restorative Justice Commission consists 19 members:

- The Chief Probation Officer or his/her designee;
- The District Attorney or his/her designee;
- The Public Defender or his/her designee;
- One member of the Board of Supervisors, who has been a victim of a crime.

A member who is an elected official, the Chief Probation Officer or the Public Defender may designate a representative to participate and vote at meetings if he/she is unable to attend Additionally, 15 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors,

- Five residents who have been victims of a crime, appointed by each Supervisor;
- Nine appointees, to establish a broad-based community representation on the Commission, including:
  - o One Local correctional professional
  - o One State member of the Monterey County Chief Law Enforcement Officers' Association
  - o One mayor of a city in Monterey County
  - o One student attending a college, university or a Monterey County High School
  - o One person who has personal experience with the criminal justice system
  - o One member of the faith community
  - o One business person
  - o One educator
  - o One official of a non-profit organization concerned with law enforcement and victim's rights.

Terms: The initial appointments were for two-year terms. Appointments now will be for three-year terms. The Chief Probation Officer, the Chief Assistant District Attorney and the Public Defender all serve as long as he/she holds office. The Board member serves a three-year term.

Qualifications & Functions: The Commission oversees community education on restorative justice issues and reviews and evaluates restorative justice needs, services, facilities and special concerns. In addition, the Commission oversees the partnership between probation, law enforcement, the judiciary, and the Community Justice Commission on the Central Coast, the community based non-profit corporation established to implement restorative justice in

Monterey County.

The Commission makes recommendations to the Probation Department and Law Enforcement, the District Attorney's Office, the Public Defender's Office, and the Coordinated Trial Courts for the successful implementation of restorative justice principles.
