AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF MONTEREY, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 766 REGARDING COUNTY HOLIDAYS

County Counsel Summary

This ordinance repeals Ordinance No. 766, which was adopted in 1951 and which designated County holidays by reference to state law. Ordinance No 766 has become outdated due to the passage of time. County holidays are currently set by the Board of Supervisors by resolution.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Monterey ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.

- 1. Ordinance No. 766 was adopted in 1951 designating County holidays.
- 2. The ordinance adopted by reference the holidays set forth at the time in the Political Code, which was the predecessor of the current Government Code, and has become outdated as new holidays have been established at the state level, not all of which have been adopted by the County.
- 3. In addition, current County holidays are set forth in Personnel Practices and Policies Resolution No. 98-394, as adopted and amended periodically by the Board of Supervisors.
 - 4. It is therefore appropriate to repeal Ordinance No. 766.

SECTION 2. REPEAL OF ORDINANCE NO. 766.

Ordinance No. 766 is repealed.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall take effect on the thirty-first day following its adoption.
