Resolution proclaiming the month of August 2015) as **Breastfeeding Awareness Month** in Monterey County.....)

WHEREAS, the advantages of breastfeeding for infants and mothers and the use of human milk for infant feeding are supported by overwhelming scientific evidence, and advantages include health, nutritional, immunologic, developmental, psychological, social, economic, and environmental benefits; and

WHEREAS, breastfeeding decreases the incidence and/or severity of childhood health conditions including respiratory and ear infections, diabetes, overweight and obesity, sudden infant death syndrome, leukemia, asthma, and breastfeeding promotes optimal brain development, providing children with an ideal foundation for learning readiness; and

WHEREAS, breastfeeding is an important part of preventive healthcare for mothers, as it can decrease postpartum depression, facilitate weight loss, help delay a new pregnancy, and reduce the risk of diabetes and certain types of cancer; and

WHEREAS, the United States and international health organizations, encourage exclusive breastfeeding of infants for six months before the introduction of complementary foods, and continued breastfeeding until the infant is at least one to two years old; and

WHEREAS, ninety-six percent of Monterey County mothers of newborns initiate breastfeeding, but only seventy-one percent are exclusively breastfeeding at hospital discharge; and

WHEREAS, the theme for this year's World Breastfeeding Week is *Breastfeeding and Work:* Let's Make it Work! emphasizing the empowerment of all women, by providing access to adequate time, space, and support to successfully combine work with breastfeeding; and

WHEREAS, the County of Monterey is working on strategies to support mothers, and increase the number of women who meet recommended breastfeeding goals, and to improve infant, maternal, and family health through the promotion, support and protection of breastfeeding in Monterey County.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Monterey County Board of Supervisors, on behalf of the County and all its citizens thereof, hereby proclaims the month of August as **Breastfeeding Awareness Month**, to support breastfeeding as one of the best public health prevention measures related to infant and maternal well-being.
