## UPDATING THE FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL TABLE ANNUALLY Used for Sliding Scale Fee Calculation, CHDP, Fam PACT and Presumptive Elig. Verification at the front desk.

Fed Poverty level tables come out usually in Feb of each year Go to google.com, type in Federal Poverty Level Tables, Year i.e. Federal Poverty Level Tables, 2012, and it wil bring up a website to look them up. Usually, Table is formatted such that it gives you the 100% of Federal Poverty Level. Load it in under Column 1. All other sections of the table are multipliers off this column, and formulas are prebuilt in, and also listed below.

Take the SSF table template, attached on next tab, and load the 100% figures into the far right hand column, so it reads 0-11,170 for Family Size one, and so on.

For Colum 120% poverty, the start of the range will be 11,171 to 13,404 (start of 120%). For next Colum, range will be 13,405 to 14,856 (start of 133%). For next Column, range will be 14,857 to 20,665 (start of the 185%) . Next Column will be 20,666 to 22,340 (start of the 200% column) Final Column will be 22,341 and over.

Change the Header to read 2012, and change note at bottom to read 2012 Fed. Poverty Level Guidelines, released 2-1-2012.

Would strongly suggest you have someone proof this after you finish, as much of this has to be hand entered into the schedule, and it needs to be accurate.
