**RE:** Strategic Grant Services Program: Grants Update

#### **Background:**

This memo provides an update on the activities of the Strategic Grant Services Program, and provides summaries of grants recently awarded, grant applications recently submitted, grant applications currently in progress, and upcoming grant opportunities which will be strategically evaluated.

The Strategic Grants Services Program focuses on identifying funding for the County's priority funding needs. Priorities are defined by the Board's Strategic Initiatives, the Board's Legislative Priorities, availability of grant funding, ability to meet grant requirements, and a strategic analysis of the County's ability to submit a competitive grant application. The program is managed by the County Administrative Office, Intergovernmental and Legislative Affairs Division, with assistance from Nossaman LLP.

  Technical Assistance program for well-head treatment and planning for disadvantaged
  communities, Proposition 1 Stream Flow Enhancement Program, Proposition 1
  Restoration Grant Program Proposition 1 Urban Rivers Grant Program, and Proposition
  1 Integrated Regional Management Planning and Disadvantaged Community Programs.

#### • Departmental and Supervisor Grant Meetings

 Met with all County departments and Supervisors since March, 2016 to review their grant funding priorities.

#### • Funding Opportunity Alerts

- Sent 60 funding opportunity alerts to County departments and nonprofit partners on topics such as homelessness, children's services, services for victims of crimes, and redevelopment since January 1, 2016.
- **Twelve Month Work Plan:** The Grants Program is developing a twelve month work plan to outline what grant opportunities are in the pipeline. The work plan will be shared with the Legislative Committee at the September meeting and as it is developed and updated.

#### **Upcoming Grants:**

- Cap and Trade Funding: The Legislature has introduced a bill that provides a framework for the Cap and Trade expenditures, including opportunities which may be potential funding sources for the County. These include:
  - o \$50 million for energy efficiency and renewable energy in public buildings.
  - \$100 million for Urban Greening Programs.
  - o \$180 million for Transformative Climate Communities with an emphasis on disadvantaged communities.
  - o \$100 million for the Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program.
  - \$5 million for the Active Transportation Program.
  - o \$30 million for wetland and watershed restoration programs.
  - \$100 million for the Clean Vehicle Rebate Project.
  - o \$150 million for the Enhanced Fleet Modernization Program and Plus-up Pilot Project.
  - \$150 million for heavy duty vehicles and off-road equipment investments.
  - o \$100 million for energy efficiency upgrades and weatherization projects.
  - o \$15 million for the State Water Efficiency and Enhancement Program.
  - o \$20 million for the Healthy Soils Initiative.
