**RE:** Strategic Grant Services Program: Grants Update

#### **Background:**

This memo provides an update on the activities of the Strategic Grant Services Program, and provides summaries of grants recently awarded, grant applications recently submitted, grant applications currently in progress, and upcoming grant opportunities which will be strategically evaluated.

The Strategic Grants Services Program focuses on identifying funding for the County's priority funding needs. Priorities are defined by the Board's Strategic Initiatives, the Board's Legislative Priorities, availability of grant funding, ability to meet grant requirements, and a strategic analysis of the County's ability to submit a competitive grant application. The program is managed by the County Administrative Office, Intergovernmental and Legislative Affairs Division, with assistance from Nossaman LLP.

# SB 831 (Committee on Budget and Fiscal Review) Monterey County Water Resources Agency: Lake Nacimiento and Lake San Antonio

Over the last nine months, Nossaman has been working with Assemblyman Alejo to secure funding for the Interlake Tunnel project. Early efforts focused on AB 1585 and an earmark in the State Budget. Nossaman participated in multiple meetings with Assemblyman Alejo and his staff and provided Assemblyman Alejo with multiple versions of informative documents to support his efforts in securing an earmark. Although we were not successful in June in securing an earmark through the state budget, late in the legislative session, Assemblyman Alejo was able to secure another legislative vehicle, SB 831. Nossaman met with Assemblyman Alejo's office multiple times in support of this legislative effort. On the very last day of session, the bill was heard in the Senate Budget Committee. Assemblyman Alejo presented the bill alongside Senator Monning and Senator Cannella and Nossaman testified in support on behalf of the County and the Water Resources Agency. Also in support, were the State Building and Construction Trades of California, Salinas Valley Sustainable Water Group and Western Growers – no one spoke in opposition of the bill. The bill received a unanimous vote in support. by all present Senators. The bill was then heard in on the Senate floor and Senator Monning presented the bill with support from Senator Cannella and Senator Nielsen. The bill passed off the floor with most Senators voting in support (36-2).

On September 13, 2016, Governor Brown signed SB 831 which will provide \$10 million to the Water Resources Agency for the Interlake Tunnel project. Nossaman met with Martha Guzman Aceves in the Governor's office the morning the bill was signed and she gave no indication that the Governor was going to sign the bill and only "we are giving it full consideration." Nossaman facilitated her request for follow up information, which the Governor's office may have needed to respond to media inquiries.

The funding authorized under SB 831 will be provided via a grant agreement between the Department of Water Resources (DWR) and WRA. Nossaman is currently in contact with leadership at the Department of Water Resources to better understand the steps necessary to draw down the funds. Nossaman has provided preliminary information to WRA regarding what are likely to be acceptable items to be included in the funding agreement. The Water Resources Agency had an initial meeting on October 6. 2016 with staff members from the Financial Assistance Branch of the DWR.

### • Cap and Trade Funding Increase (AB 1613)

  - \$10 million for the Active Transportation Program to fund bicycle and pedestrian programs that make walking or biking to school and work safer and easier
  - \$25 million for the Healthy Forest program, which preserves existing forests by reducing the threat of wildfires by reducing fuels, removing dead trees, and providing long-term protection to forest land
  - \$80 million for the Urban Greening program to create green spaces and parks in communities in California that lack green space
  - \$15 million to continue the successful Urban Forestry program which helps urban disadvantaged communities plant trees in their neighborhood
