PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY BY THE MONTEREY COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Extend the Board of Supervisors Proclamation of a)	
Local Emergency within Monterey County)	
Dated October 18, 2016 (4/5 th vote required)	

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, Section 2.68.060 of the Monterey County Code and Section 8630 of the Government Code empower the County Administrative Officer or his designee, or the Board of Supervisors if the Board of Supervisors is in session, to proclaim the existence of a Government Code Section 8558(c) local emergency when the County is affected by or likely to be affected by a public calamity; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors does hereby find as follows:

- 1. The wildfire known as the Soberanes Fire began July 22, 2016, has threatened numerous residences and hundreds of acres of valuable forest and watersheds resulting in evacuations and displacement of residents; road closures; areas of isolation; damage to property and utility systems; and damage to critical infrastructure and endangered species; and
- 2. The wildfire is still burning out of control, with no known containment date. The wildfire has charred in excess of 129,000 acres, destroyed 64 homes and numerous other structures, and continues to threaten at least 410 additional sturctures resulting in the displacement and evacuations of residents; road closures, damage to power, phone and other critical infrastructure in the fire area; and there remains an imminent threat to values at risk for additional damage and/or destruction; and
- **3.** Efforts to bring the Soberanes Fire under control, assist the affected population with care and shelter; to restore the burned area and/or recover from the effects of this devastating wildfire, involve assets from Monterey County government, other local governments in Monterey County, and other local governments within California, as well as California State and federal fire, law enforcement, and recovery assets, the American Red Cross and other volunteer organizations; and
- **4.** Immediate action is still necessary to address these safety issues; and
- **5.** That the foregoing conditions are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the County of Monterey and require the combined forces of other political subdivisions, including but not limited to state and federal assistance to combat:
- **6.** On July 23, 2016, pursuant to County Code, the County Administrative Officer signed an emergency proclamation to initiate the protective/responsive process; and

- 7. Conditions of extreme peril warranted and necessitated the proclamation of an local emergency by the Board of Supervisors on July 26, 2016; which was extended for thirty days on September 20th; and
- **8.** On July 26th the Governor of the State of California issued a state of emergency for Monterey County; and
- **9.** Emergency conditions continue to exist, necessitating extension of this Proclamation of a Local Emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors in and for the County of Monterey as follows:

- 1. The above recitals are true and correct.
- 2. A local emergency as defined in Government Section 8630(b) and Public Contract Code Section 1102 is continuing and that this emergency proclamation is extended thirty days is proclaimed to exist throughout the County of Monterey.
- 3. During the existence of said local emergency the powers, functions, and duties of the County Administrative Officer and the Emergency Organization of this County shall be those prescribed by State law and the ordinances, resolutions, and approved plans of the County of Monterey in order to mitigate the effects of said local emergency, including but not limited to utilizing state and/or federal assistance as appropriate.
- 4. During the existence of said local emergency, the powers, functions, and duties of the County Administrative Officer and the Resource Management Agency/Public Works Director shall be those prescribed in State and local law in order to mitigate the effects of the local emergency.
- 5. The governing body shall review the need for continuing the local emergency at least once every thirty days until the governing body terminates the local emergency.
- 6. Pursuant to Public Contract Code Sections 20134, 20395, and 22050, the Public Works Director or his designee is hereby authorized to engage independent contractors and engineering services to complete all necessary work to mitigate the effects of said local emergency. Contracts for this work may be executed without prior Board approval of the plans, specifications, and working details, without giving notice for bids to let contracts.
